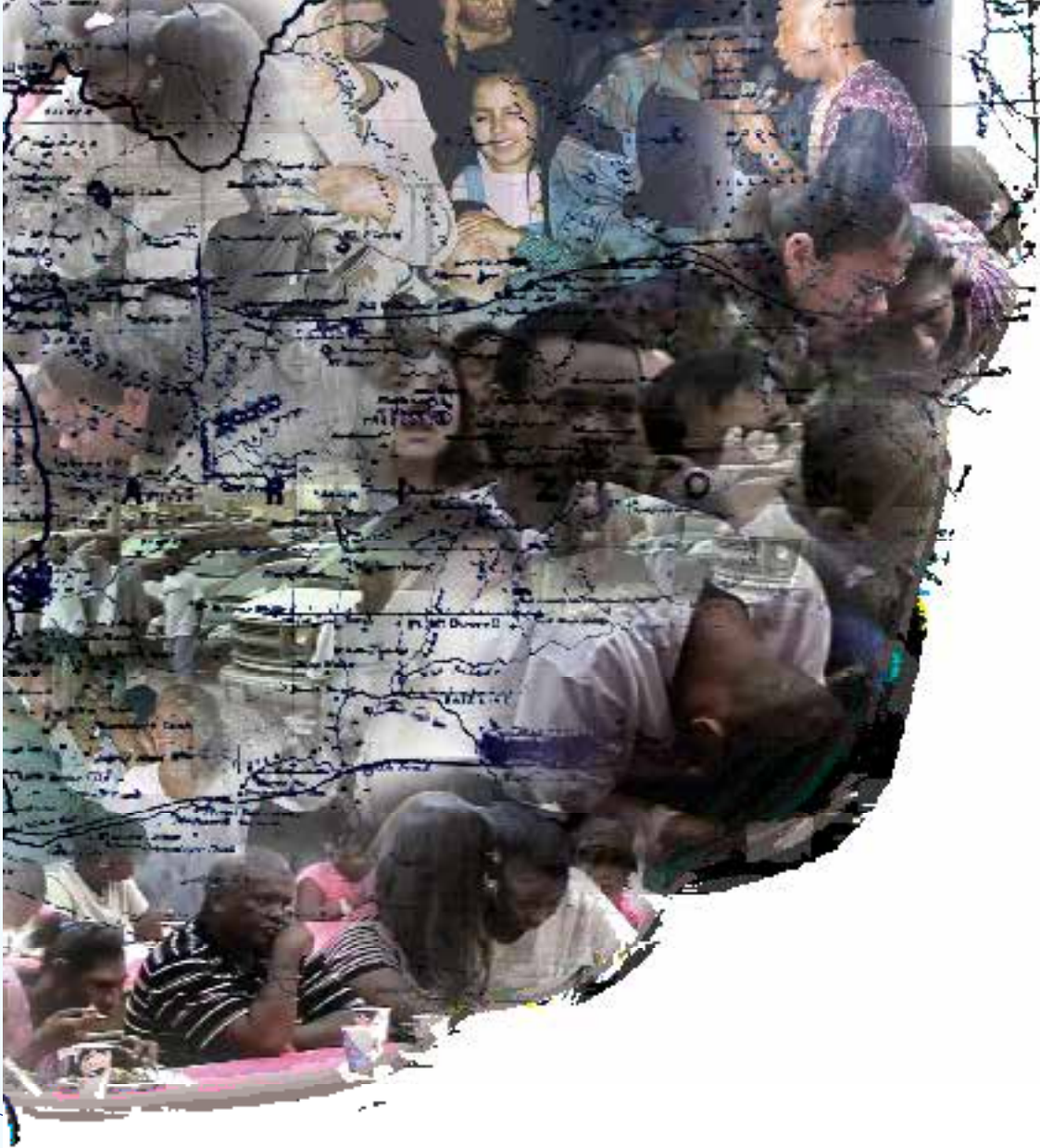

The last couple of months have been extremely busy for the Prescott congregation.

We have been pushing our evangelism to the max for the end of the summer season. We did our annual Independence Day production right in the middle of the downtown square, where there are thousands of people gathered for the parade. This has got to be one of our greatest opportunities all year long to reach hundreds of people with the gospel. We have patriotic music and testimonies along with a moving presentation of our nation's military and the cost of its freedom. This outreach never fails to stir hearts and every year there is a tangible presence of the Holy Spirit.

We also recently had an outreach we called "Extreme Impact." We had almost 300 teenagers come in from areas all over the state. Pastor Artie Aragon preached a sermon in the morning to inspire them and fill them with the Holy Spirit, and then we sent them all over the city to evangelize and share the gospel. We brought the day to a conclusion with a concert in one of our local theaters. The atmosphere was electric as nearly 400 people jammed into this theater. We had a total of 32 people saved throughout the day and evening.

Recently Pastor Greg Mitchell has been encouraging our congregation to believe God for more in our local outreaches and to take dominion in our city. He challenged us to take God at his word, that He would make us fruitful.

These last couple of months have been a season of fruitfulness that we have not seen in a long time. In just the month of August we had 164 people saved on regular outreaches. In our music scene we have been regularly seeing 10 to 15 people getting saved. God has literally been giving us "handfuls on purpose." We are already extending our new church building which is busting at the seams right now. The extension cannot keep up with the growth of our church.

We are now moving into the winter season and a different avenue of evangelism. We will begin our home cell groups at the end of this month and we have a couple of our "Off the Broadway" plays along with the Haunted House coming up soon. Our church is excited about the coming months and the opportunities that God is giving us for evangelism in our city.

Please keep us in your prayers as we contend together for revival in our communities and in our nation.

Phil Payson logs 32 years of 'helps' ministry at Prescott

Phil Payson says, "A pastor can hardly carry all of the numerous responsibilities that he is encumbered with. Those who would seek God's guidance for a "helps" ministry will find satisfaction and fulfilment beyond their expectations."

Phil has been the example of his own words in the Prescott church for more than 32 years. He and his first wife Pat, who passed away in 1991, started the tape ministry in 1972 and continued for 20 years, at which time they turned it over to Charlie and Marcia Foster.

Phil recorded and produced a church-sponsored radio program for 20 years which featured testimonies of Prescott church members. He also started the Men's Fellowship Breakfasts at Prescott, and conducted a book ministry for several years.

Perhaps Phil's most far-reaching ministry has been the Trumpet, which he has overseen since its beginning in 1972. Due to health reasons, Phil has resigned as editor of the Trumpet, although he will continue to be a valuable resource of information and experience for new editor Heidi Foster.

Following is a short testimony of Phil's salvation and his long involvement in the Prescott church.

"On December 28, 1970, I made the decision with my then-wife Pat to follow the lead of our 15-year-old

daughter Janet. Her changed life brought us to attend the Foursquare Church in Prescott (now the Potter's House).

We were longtime members of a traditional mainstream church. We decided to look into this Pentecostal church that had captured our daughter's attention. We could not deny she had become a new creature, but we attributed this to some slick church program.

On our first visit to the church, about 90 percent were in their early 20s, or teens. They packed the pews with an overflow, and many could only find seats on the floor. We saw an enthusiasm we were unaccustomed to in any church. After hearing the gospel repeatedly preached, we came to the altar on December 28, 1970, convinced that we needed to make a commitment with our lives if we were to call ourselves Christians. On that day our lives were changed.

Material concerns can dim God's call in our lives

There are wonderful blessings of grace upon our lives, and many of us are well taken care of where we are. Yet sometimes our material concerns can be so overwhelming as to squelch the thing that God wants to do.

Paul was able to function in both realms - doing well and not doing so well. He says in Phillipians Chapter 4:

"But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at last your care of me has flourished again; wherein you also were careful, but you lacked opportunity. Not that I speak in respect of want. For I have learned in whatsoever state I am in therewith to be content. For I know both how to be abased and I know how to abound. Everywhere in all things I am instructed to be full and to be hungry both to abound and to suffer need. I can do all things through Christ, which strengthens me. Notwithstanding you have well done, but you did communicate with my affliction. But now you Phillipians know also in the beginning of the gospel when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning getting and receiving but you only. For even in Thessalonica you sent aid once and again for my necessity. Not because I desire a gift: but I desire fruit that it may abound to your account. For I have all, and abound. I am full, having received from Epaphroditus the things, which were sent from you, an odor of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, well pleasing to God. But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus."

Future financial security is the reason that some men aren't here today. Some are so tormented about how they will survive in the future that they flush the whole present. They become consumed with owning a home, with IRA's, with retirement. These things are not evil. We wouldn't tell somebody not to take reasonable steps to care for the future. The problem is when this trumps the call of God.

We're looking at what might be the

end of our ministry, when we're not perhaps able to function as we always have. What's going to happen to me then?

The night Jesus was betrayed, he confronted the disciples and said,

"When I sent you out the first time and I told you don't bring anything with you, did you lack anything?" And they said, "No, we didn't." He was bringing to them the message that "I can take care of you." Jesus knew this was an issue that was going to be on workers' hearts.

Mark 10:28 says, *"Then Peter began to say unto them, though we have left all and followed thee. And Jesus answered and said verily I say unto you there's no man that hath left house or brethren or sisters or father or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my sake, and the gospel's, but he shall receive in hundredfold now in this time, houses, and brethren, and sisters, and mothers, and children, and lands, with persecutions; and in the world to come eternal life. But many that are first shall be last and the last first."*

There is a priority issue and there's a faith issue. The gospel must be a priority before houses, lands, families, and any other temporal concern.

Jesus promises us something, and the reason that he has to make this promise is because he knows that whether this is 33 A.D. or 2005 A.D., workers are going to wrestle right here.

You're going to have to trust God to take care of you in terms of your relationships and your security. The issue is not, "Will the fellowship take care of me," not,

"Will my church take care? Is Jesus good for it?"

Jesus is talking here, and this is for all time. If this is true for these guys, it's true for us. If miracles were true for them, this is true for us. This doesn't cancel out using your head and taking practical steps, but where does our confidence lie? Do we really have confidence that if we'll obey Jesus, He'll take care of us?

Jesus said, "You'll get a hundredfold back." I don't know how to interpret all of that. But this is language to let us know that God is going to take care of us.

When Jesus asked the disciples if they lacked anything, they said no. The problem is maybe if he were to ask us that question, we would answer "no." One of the things is our expectations about life.

This is the issue that is going to make some who are first, last, and some who are last, first. Now what does "first" mean? Does it mean maybe some of the first to go? Well, that includes you and I here in this place. We were some of the first to go out and pioneer. But that doesn't assure us that we couldn't be the last. Does first mean some of those in first place? Well, that would include us too, because in terms of the structure of our fellowship, we have been given stewardship or a trust in a platform of credibility. Would that be the first in financial resources? That includes a number of people right here, too. And it is possible that the very first to go, the very first in leadership, and some that are the very first in financial security therefore could end up the last.

Why would that be? In the context, it's because though we did the thing 25 years ago or 15 years ago, we won't do it now because security trumps the call of God for our lives. And it's a faith issue. "Is Jesus good for it?"

Paul addressed this in 1st Timothy 6, *"For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and clothing, with these we shall be content. Those desiring to be rich fall into temptation and snare and into*

many foolish and harmful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition."

"For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil which some have strayed from the faith in their greediness and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But you oh man of God flee these things."

It starts off like Paul is telling Timothy how to deal with the rich people in his church.

But Paul knows that the issue is the pastor as well. Now, man of God, not man of [mammon], not man of IRA, of 401K, but thou, man of God. A man whose calling is from God. A man whose source is from God. A man whose master is God. A man whose provider is God. Thou, oh man of God, flee, run, don't even let it get close.

We've brought nothing into this world and we shall take nothing out. That's talking about the end of life. Even as you view the end of your days, you cannot in your greediness be diverted from these things if brought into something that will drown you in destruction and perdition.

The fact that you can't imagine yourself committing a specific sin doesn't mean the capacity for similar sins isn't inside us. We often think these are the guys with gold bracelets with their name in diamonds across it - that's scripture for these guys. But it might also be for the guy who's afraid to end up at the county old age home. He doesn't want a diamond bracelet. He's not going to drive a Mercedes. He's pretty freaked out if he leaves his home, and goes overseas at this stage in his life and comes back and there's no decent church for him. I've seen it happen. "All I've got is this little church, no retirement, what's going to happen to me?"

We think of catching men in dishonesty in finances, and how often is it, not because they were trying to live a wealthy lifestyle, but they're undisciplined in their finances, and then just [scooped off] to survive. They're trying to keep ahead of the game because they signed a lease for too much money, all those things. That's the same motivation, right? I just want to survive. I've just got to take care of myself.

Paul says that pastors are not to be greedy, not covetous. In Titus "not given to filthy [lucre]." As Peter said "we should feed the flock of God" not for filthy lucre.

When the word of God is filled with so many warnings, it's very foolish for us to ignore those. Paul says, "I know how to be abased. I know how to suffer [inaudible], I know how to be in want."

Now can we say based on that then we ought to be guaranteed never to have any of those things? Never to be abased? It was okay when we were pioneering. It makes great stories to tell the disciples (how I used to pay the price), but Paul was quite a ways on in his ministry. He was still willing to put himself in situations where he suffered need.

But God helped him and gave him the wisdom that he needed.

Perhaps the language here is, "I've been initiated into the mystery of how to do this."

What a fascinating thought.

There's a surrender of life and of

putting yourself in the hands of God that only unlocks this. As long as you're going to play it safe, then this isn't unlocked. If we're going to look from the outside and do our calculations, it's not there.

There's also an issue of lifestyle that comes into play. This is to give access to God to do what he wants to do in your life and in the earth. In Luke, people came and said, "What should we do?" Every single one of those things was a material or financial decision. The main resistance to God's access in these people's lives was material things, their lifestyle. Paul said he knew how to abound. He also had the revelation of how to be blessed with discretion, how to be blessed with a comfortable standard of living in accordance with his labors and faithfulness. Yet he knew not to allow that to elevate his appetites so that he could not come back down, or so that he would become a stumbling block to the younger pastors who followed in his training.

There are young pastors who are struggling now, and they can watch people in larger churches, people in places of exemplarship and responsibility living a lifestyle of outward demonstration of remuneration. Some say, "I will never get there. I will never be that."

Here are people who need to be willing to make the sacrifices necessary. We talk about quitting their job, and even dropping down lower than they already are in order to be faithful to their ministry. And we can preach to them that that's exactly what they need to do, bless God, as we slip out into our homes.

Again, those aren't evil things, but there has to be a sense of responsibility that we do not show before people a level of life that becomes what they shoot for.

In Gideon's case, a decision that turned

from the responsibility of leadership to embrace remuneration meant a snare and destruction to the next generation.

There's obvious prosperity that is going to affect the giving of your people. They are happy to see us blessed. I turned 50 last year and

the folks wanted to do something for me. They like to see their pastor blessed. But there comes a level where something clicks off and says, "Why am I sacrificing when it doesn't seem like the pastor pays any kind of price at all. So we must be disciplined in our lifestyle.

There is a discretion about how I handle the resources that are placed in my hands.

Pastor Mitchell finished our last conference with this challenge: "Whatever it takes."

Our fellowship was not raised to be disciplining people all the time, that the only way we do anything is if somebody kicks our butt. Why we do so much of what we do is that it's reinforced all around us. Our brethren are praying, our brethren are outreaching. There's a "culture of discipline."

When we begin to lose that, then we're going to have to replace a cultured discipline with disciplinarians. Our folks aren't going to do what we say. They're going to do what we do. Our example brings balance to our preaching, right? We preach something and then folks want to know, how do you live that out? If our preaching and our example is the same, then that's powerful.

Pastor's Viewpoint

Bible is filled with stories of those who failed to finish well

When Pastor John Bisagno entered the ministry, he was warned by his father-in-law, *"Stay true to Jesus! Only 1 in 10 will still be in full time ministry at age 65."* He didn't believe it, so he wrote down 24 names of his peers in his Bible. By age 53 - only three men were still left on the list.

Paul wrote to Timothy in **2 Tim 4:7-8**: *I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.*

Beginnings are the easy part of any journey or undertaking in life, but Paul is able to tell Timothy at the end of his life that he was still on track! The Bible is filled with the truth of those who fail to finish well: The 10 spies, Solomon, Judas, and Demas are all examples.

Why do so many fail to continue? Here are a few reasons:

Many fail to understand nature of journey: Some begin with false expectations of salvation, or even life in general: They feel that life will always be easy and exciting, and become disillusioned when they discover it is actually long and difficult. Paul says "I have fought a good fight."

Many become sidetracked: The devil's favorite strategies is to get people focusing on non-essentials in life, and 2 common ones are money & problems. Paul says "I have finished my course" - I

stayed on track!

Many fail to discipline the flesh:

Some people don't realize their most dangerous enemy is within them - their own flesh. They either make decisions based on the flesh, or fail to discipline their flesh so it doesn't take over. It's interesting to see those who complain of the upholding of standards, or preaching against the flesh consistently go off track over time - they couldn't see the danger within.

Many are destroyed by relationships: We live for God in connection with other people. Some become obsessed with the failings or violations of others. Still others allow their spirit to be tainted by carnal, immoral or rebellious people and they are influenced away from their initial spirit.

The determining factors of longevity are **Foundations**: What's underneath or inside a person; **Obedience**: The decisions we make in line with what God has revealed; and **Vision**: The ability to make decisions based not on today, but on the future - where will my decisions take me/

my children/my church?

Our scripture gives us faith for the long haul - we can finish our course, just like Paul; **V8...** *and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.* There are 3 levels of faith for the long haul:

We can finish the journey: Though we may have seen many drop out of the race, we have the promise in **Jude 1:24** *Now unto him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy...*

We can finish with a right spirit: There are some who are technically still in the race, but have allowed their heart and spirit to be tainted by bitterness or cynicism. The 3 Hebrew children not only survived the fire, but the testimony was that *"There was no smell of fire on them!"*

We can finish still doing what we're supposed to be doing: It's not enough to simply still be around, we need to still be doing God's will, extending God's Kingdom - until the end.

People who make this commitment can look forward to the reward that Paul spoke of in **2 Tim 4:8**: *Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.*

Let's make the commitment to finish and receive the reward together!

There's something about the comfort of life. Prosperity is fine, but it has to be brought into a balance that communicates to those who are following us that the gospel is what we are living for.

Ralph Winter said, "Obedience to the great commission has been more consistently poisoned by affluence than anything else." We think of moral failure and it's devastating. But affluence is the subtle poison. The old puritan [Tom Mathers]

said, "Religion begot prosperity, and a daughter devoured the mother."

You and I haven't been raised in a ministry that has a poverty mentality, that we cannot enjoy the blessings that come from our ministry. On the other hand, though, the very thing we begin to put our affections on are the things that can destroy us.

Does the promise of Jesus mean that nobody will ever have to go through need

or suffering, or does it mean that the need or suffering is not the last chapter?

God will help us. We can't let our lifestyle and security concerns trump our own destiny, or destroy our offspring because they follow an example of prosperity and lifestyle rather than an example of sacrifice, an example of "Whatever it takes."

Whatever it takes. That's what we'll do.

Many saved, healed in Chile, Holland crusades

In August, Pastor Wayman Mitchell conducted a miracle healing crusade in Valparaiso, Chile for Pastor Eduardo Baretto.

God prepared the way ahead of Pastor Mitchell. The Lord gave favor through one councilman and the mayor to erect a gospel tent in the heart of the city. The venue was highly visible with crusade banners and posters where thousands of people in buses, autos, and shoppers on foot passed by.

The main newspaper picked up the story and ran a headline on the front page, "Doctors question miracle healing." Inside, the paper dedicated an entire page to the crusade, along with a photo of Pastor Mitchell and a color reproduction of the crusade brochure. As a result, news reporters, photographers and TV news cameras were present at the crusade.

Articles came out in several newspapers with photos, and television stations also gave coverage. On the second night, a medical doctor with a camera who came to discredit the miracles

saw among those seeking healing three people – a woman with a deformed hip, a woman with severe tendon damage in her knee, and a man facing an operation for disc damage in his back. He was overwhelmed as these three were miraculously healed, along with others who received healing from blind eyes, deaf ears and other maladies.

Those who came forward to repent of their sins and seek healing filled out some 500 cards.

Applause and cheering for God for healings

For an unexpected passer-by it sounded in the big tent in Sportspark Nylan in Leeuwarden as if the public went out of their roof for an artist. But the loud applause and cheering was for God, who again performed a miraculous healing.

No, the pain in her hips is still the same. The young woman with the crutch had prayed after the American Evangelist Mitchell: "I take authority in Jesus' name over this pain. Let go!" And the people present clapped their hands loudly. But nothing had changed.

"Who do you have to forgive?" The lady hesitates. Letting go of bitterness is necessary, explains Mitchell. Do you

want to forgive? Yes. And again there is prayer. Does she still feel pain? No. "With the hate your pain has left." Applause. With the crutch demonstrative on her shoulder she walks away.

About 400 people came yesterday to the beginning of the tent crusade of Gospel Church The Door in Leeuwarden. Amongst them a lot of people from the 40 sister churches from all over Holland.

...This first night the American minister first calls people with specific illnesses to the stage. One man is already for years deaf in one ear. After prayer he can hear again. Applause. One lady on stage and one in the auditorium have after a Caesarean section no feeling anymore in the abdominal area. And? asks Mitchell after the prayer. Both ladies have to prod in their bellies. They say to have regained the feeling. Applause.

Regularly healing holds off, and invariably the evangelist asks then the per-

son that is being prayed for, if they retain anger or bitterness. Against patients of rheumatism: "Resentment and hate are often the cause of rheumatism." After a prayer where others receive forgiveness, a lot of people say not to feel the pain anymore.

...The 65-year old Antonio Mapeus Jorge from Leeuwarden is standing in his wheelchair before the stage. For already 11 years he's almost complete paralysed in his legs. Mitchell prays, helps him to stand and lets him walk around. Applause. It is "a little better" than normally says Jorge. The evangelist prays again, and lets the auditorium help in prayer. Jorge walks a small distance alone. Afterwards he testifies to feel "a little better." But later on there can be improvement. That happens more often, is said to him.

Then suddenly it is over. Who else wants to get prayed for must come to one of the next meetings.

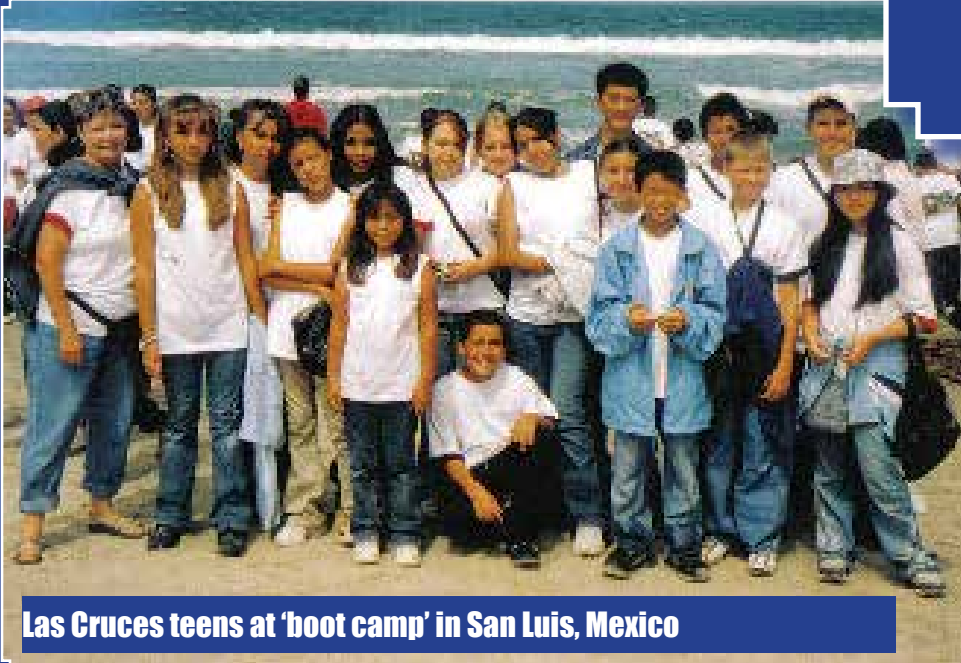

We are blessed that our church is in such a prominent location where thousands of people drive by daily and notice our sign. San Antonio church reaches out to hurricane Katrina victims

All of us followed the terrible news of Hurricane Katrina's destruction of the Gulf coast. The flooding of New Orleans and the many people who were stranded there particularly moved the nation. Like many churches we prayed for those effected by the disaster, never realizing how directly God would answer our prayers. By the end of the week 11,000 evacuees ended up here in San Antonio, most of them in shelters within five miles of our church.

On Friday night a van load of people in our church bearing emergency supplies showed up as volunteers to gain access to the largest shelter (approximately 4,000 people) and began ministering the gospel to people who had spent the previous night in the Louisiana Superdome. The shelter consisted of four large open rooms each with more than 1,000 cots. Most of the people were concerned about family members that had become

separated from them and the fear that they may not have survived.

reports, everyone we spoke with bore no ill will towards the government, in fact, they were grateful for the help they had received. One young man told me he thought that it took something this enormous to break the inner city cycle of destruction many of these people had become trapped in.

That Sunday we had 60 people in our morning service from New Orleans with about 45 giving their life to Jesus. Afterwards, we had a dinner for them. Some of the evacuees

Trusting in the Character of God***

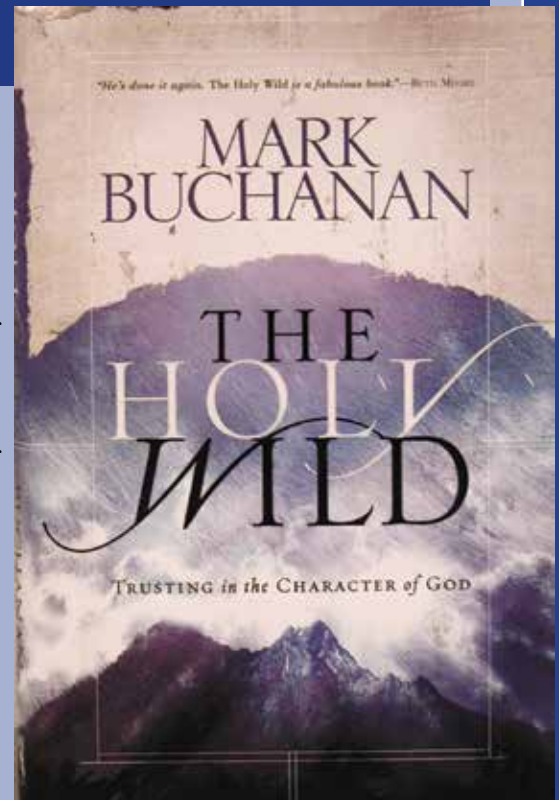
In the world of Christian books – endless versions of Christian Lite dominate: "3 easy steps to...Build Heroic Faith, Fix Your Marriage, Raise Children, Grow Churches, Become a Spiritual Giant, Fix the World, Get Fit, etc."

The Holy Wild, by Mark Buchanan, is refreshing in that it makes us think by tackling difficult passages of life and tragedies, and turns our attention to God. God doesn't provide easy answers or simple relief, but rather wants us to understand His character and learn to trust in His presence and character. In the opening chapter Buchanan asks the rhetorical questions which form the aim of the book: Can

God be trusted? Is the character of God such that we can both rest in Him and risk for Him?

With this as the stated aim, he looks at various aspects of God's character: His Goodness/Faithfulness/Love, etc. and develops each theme with scripture, personal stories and illustrations. At times he reminds me of A.W. Tozer. There are some challenging thoughts, good illustrations, and classic quotes: "Most of us are confessional giants, but ethical midgets." Section II deals with God's saving Nature as the basis of our salvation: God's wrath/mercy/victory, etc. Section III deals with God's nature made

manifest: God's Wisdom/Glory/Rest, etc. Overall worth reading.

250,000 people. We arrived in December 2004 in a time of peril among a desperate country whose people pay high taxes and \$5 per gallon for gas. There is 58%

unemployment. The illegitimacy rate is very high from generation to generation, but God is moving powerfully and doing a rapid work here.

We found an excellent building right on the main boulevard with thousands passing by daily. We had our first service Sunday March 6 with six in

each service. The following Wednesday a group of students blocked a bridge right down from the church. This so called peaceful demonstration turned into a riot and the bridge was set on fire as people were

running for cover. Six of those people ran into our service and got saved and four are still with us today.

We've seen a number of miracles.

One woman who was scheduled to have surgery to remove three large gallstones went back to the doctor after prayer, and after an exam he said the surgery was no longer necessary because stones had shrunk to a pea size. Another teenage girl wanted prayer because was partially blind in both eyes and after prayer she began to weep and shout, "I can see... I can see!" She was healed by the power of God.

We just finished a powerful revival with Pastor Willis Gordon from Houston, Texas in July and God was faithful as we saw 15 saved and six filled with the Holy Ghost. A woman who had a lump on her throat was healed after Pastor Gordon laid hands on the lump. We closed the revival with a total 40 saints in service.

While we've been here we've seen demon possessed people come into our services. One particular 22-year-old man was delivered from a convulsing demon and was totally healed and changed in a moment's time.

We are excited, about all that God is doing in this nation and His rapid multiplication to His church. We have cut our church support 25% and look forward to all that God will do in the entire Caribbean.

I want to thank my Pastor Richard Rubi and his wife Yolanda for their entrustment with this ministry and the San Antonio congregation and all the other churches which support the Nation of Belize.

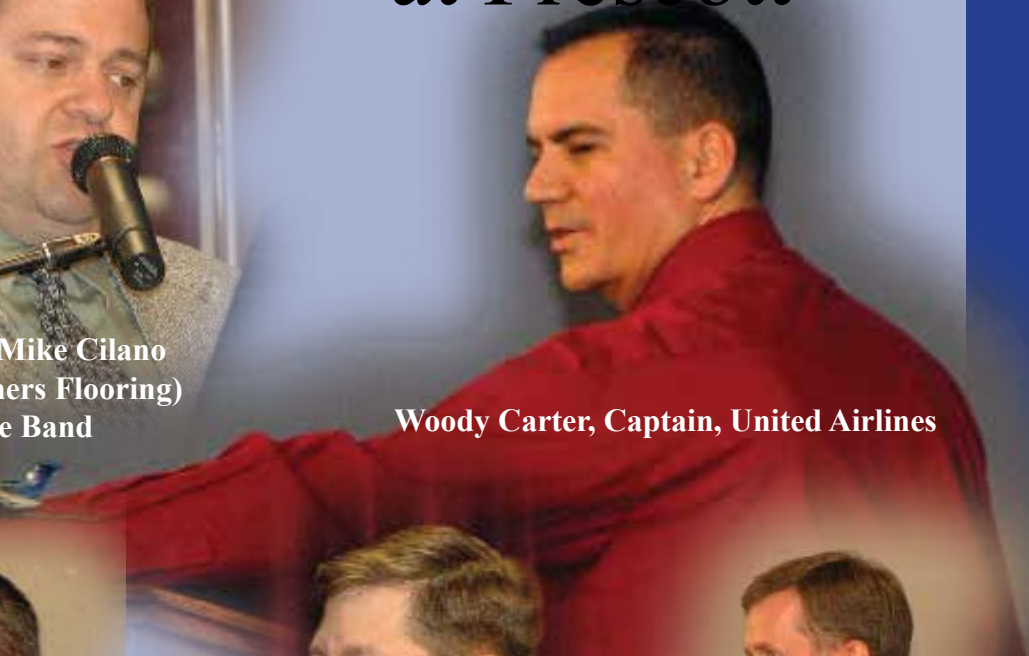
