Prescott Arizona.

Once again we bring a good report of what God is doing in the city of Prescott. The last couple of months have been extremely fruitful for our church. The

favor of God seems to be pouring out upon us more and more each month. This last conference brought good and bad news. The bad news is that we had to say goodbye to Pastor Fred Rubi. He decided to begin evangelizing out of Tucson. Pastor Rubi was well loved in our congregation and will be greatly missed. The good news is that this was the largest winter conference ever, it rivaled even our largest summer conference. For the first time in awhile this conference paid for itself completely! What a way to start out the new year!

We continued the momentum in February by having a play from Tempe called "Snow Blind." This was a tremendous play on the realities of drugs and the lifestyle it leads to. On the second night of the play we nearly 400 people come out, with a large number of folks from the rehab houses. There were 25 saved that night. Because of the great response we recently had another play in from Glendale. This was a realistic "in your face" drama and showed with clarity the despair and bondage that drugs like "crystal meth" can bring in your life. It was perfect for the crowd we were trying to reach. We had been outreaching the halfway houses and rehab centers for weeks and there were many visitors out. There were 12 saved in one night and we saw five of those people in church the next day. We are praising

God for 'Fruit that remains' and contending for even more converts and fresh souls in our church. We are still seeing many saved on our regular outreaches. In the month of February alone there were 131 new decisions for Christ. We are thanking God for that. Another sign of revival and growth in our church is that in the past six months we have had nine marriages. We have had more marriage sermons in six months than most churches get in years!

We are really looking forward to the coming months. It's going to be a busy summer. We already have Extreme Youth Impact Team, Family Fun Fairs and the San Luis Impact Team in the works and plan to have neighborhood Miracle Healing Crusades and dramas, aside from our regular outreaches! We are looking forward to the fruit that God promises for our labor!

We're keeping the momentum going here in Prescott and we hope that this reaches you in a time of blessing and fruitfulness. Keep us in your prayers as we contend together for revival in our cities and nation!

Supporting workers a 'sacred partnership'

The inspiration for this session came out of dealing with the attitudes of different workers in relation to support.

Word came back to me that one pastor was complaining quite a bit - a lot of sour grape statements like "The fellowship has not done a lot for me. I've given all these years to the fellowship and look what I am going through."

Every time this man asked me for help I responded. I bailed him out on a number of occasions, sometimes even involving personal debt to help a transition. His mother church has reached out and responded as well.

In contrast is another man who is paying a price, preaching the gospel overseas, and is not seeing gang-buster revival. But he wrote to me and said, "This church, meaning the Tucson congregation, doesn't owe me anything."

I began to ponder the attitude of these two men and my conclusion was that a man's attitude toward support will show you a whole lot of what his future is going to be.

So I want to read Phillipians 4, I call this the sacredness of support.

"Now you Philippians know also that in the beginning of the gospel when I departed from Macedonia no church shared with me concerning giving and receiving but you only. For even Thessalonica you sent aid once and again for my necessities not that I seek the gift but I seek the fruit that abounds to your account indeed I have all and abound having received from Apaphroditis the things sent from you a sweet smelling aroma an acceptable sacrifice well pleasing to God and my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in Christ Jesus now to our God and Father be glory forever and ever amen."

Paul acknowledges in this scripture the "uncommon relationship." When he departed from Macedonia, no church shared or communicated with him concerning giving and receiving, but them only. He uses the word "koinonia." He's

not just talking about paying bills but about the partnership in the gospel.

Investing in others is an uncommon practice. That is why there is an undeniable uniqueness to what we do in the support of and the investment in workers. There exists a divine partnership between people in our congregations and workers on the field. God's people are linked personally to workers because they are not just simply investing in a program, they are investing in people. As a result they are willing to sacrifice and invest monetarily to fulfill God's will in the earth.

There is also a sense of dignity and respect that comes to the worker who has more than just a missions board or a missions statement. There should be an awareness of the immense privilege that "people are actually investing in my life."

As a result we don't have transient missionaries who have to come home every two years in order to raise their support.

Paul acknowledges that this is an uncommon practice. If you think there are just dozens of fellowships out there that are just looking for people to invest in, you can think again. By the Word of God and by experience we know that this is a rare and a valuable thing.

There are plenty of people today who are willing to use others to use their gifts. But there is a vast difference between using others for their gifts and actually investing in their lives.

I get the (Christian) magazines like you do and like Pastor Mitchell I get them to look at the ads, to kind of just see what's going on. Everybody's promoting, everybody's hyping conferences. But the truth is, at those conferences you pay your own

way, you pay your own hotel, plus there is a sizable registration. They get to charge to preach the gospel.

We should never take for granted what we do, it really is an uncommon relationship, and it is crucial if the gospel is going to be preached in the earth. That's what Romans 10: 14-15 says, *"How shall they call on the one whom they have not believed in and how can they believe in the one they have not heard and how can they hear without someone preaching to them and how can they preach unless they are sent?"*

Sending is a divine call that originates in heaven, but that sending also involves churches and people who are willing to invest in others and support the preaching of the gospel.

The scripture says there is a beauty on those who go and there is a beauty on those who send.

I believe this relationship is something the devil targets. Some of the schisms, some of the splits we've experienced in our fellowship are the devil's wanting to attack this issue of investing in others and the support that goes to the preaching of the gospel. If somehow he could undermine, cut that off, he could cut off the impact that we're seeing around the world.

This partnership really is the true measure of spiritual health and spiritual vitality - this relationship. I read an article in World Magazine entitled, "Who gives 2 cents for missions?" It spoke of a group called the Empty Tomb that analyzes contributions and spending patterns of American churches. They have tracked

the giving trends of American churches and denominations going back almost a century, and they give a none too flattering picture of the priorities of American Christians today.

The percentage of income that Christians are giving is far away from the tithe. The thing that interested me more than that people aren't tithing, is what the churches are doing with that money. The article said that in 1920 the percentage of giving to missions of the total offering was 10.9 percent, just about a dime out of every dollar.

In 2003, almost 80 years later, conservative and evangelical denominations gave 2.6 percent to missions, with liberals giving only .9 percent, for a combined average for overseas work of about two pennies per dollar. "I don't give 2 cents." Basically that is the heart of American Christianity for missions.

Every man who has planted churches has had to face some of the challenges that are related to support. While it is a marvellous principle, the practice is biblical, and the Holy Spirit has helped us, there are inevitable challenges.

This isn't exhaustive and it's in a random order, but I've classified nine different kinds of workers, some good, some bad, some in between. These are the things that we have had to deal with when it comes to the issue of support.

The first is the ungrateful worker. This is the worker who has violated the line between the privilege of support and viewing support as an entitlement. It is this ingratitude that gives birth to the "I deserve" mentality. The truth is none of us here deserve anything except Hell.

I had the unpleasant experience a year ago of one of our pastors bailing out and leaving the fellowship. His letter to me stated, "I have been in the fellowship for 29 years and can no longer say that we are a fellowship and that we care for one another." In the last five years, between Pastor Mitchell and myself, we had invested in this man \$417,000. I understand that money isn't everything, but I said, "That's got to speak something!" Who else would do that? So in my letter back to him I said, "Yes, care is more than figures on a spread sheet, but certainly it speaks of something. Yet in your letter there is not one word of acknowledgement of that investment or love. That is grieving to me and to the good people

in Tucson who have sacrificed to support missionaries." You are going to run into the ungrateful worker.

There is another that I call the self-seeking worker, and this is the worker whose interpretation on life and ministry and philosophy is "It's all about me." Pastor Mitchell knows this personally. These aren't men that I supported but men that he put truckloads of money into, who eventually left and went their way. They took the churches and the equipment. Their justification was "This money or this support was invested in the gospel and that's how I used it, so it's okay."

Well yes, it's obvious it was invested in the gospel, that's why people gave it, but it was given in a relational and a fellowship framework. In other words I couldn't get up before my congregation and say, "Let's raise \$417,000 to invest in this person and in five years he is going to thumb his nose at us and go his way. Would they give? No.

Third, there is the irresponsible worker. Tom (Payne) did a session a year ago or two ago on this in detail, but this involves the mismanagement of resources. When it really takes salvation is when you have to bail out huge irresponsibility. This could be in a credit card debt that a pastor runs up in the name of a church. It would be one thing if someone called me and said, "You know, I'm \$1800 in debt, I haven't done things right," I can handle that. But when you find out, especially when they are pulling the plug, that it's \$18,000 or \$28,000 and their attitude is, "Hey - this was for the church," that's a hard pill to swallow. It is a spiritual issue, and you are going to have to face the challenge of the irresponsible worker who expects you to bail them out.

The fourth is the comparison worker.

This is the worker who is constantly comparing his levels of support on the field. The Bible talks about comparison. If you do it you are not wise. I'm not talking about people not given adequate support. The whole parable of the talents revolved around the issue of, "What are you doing with what you've been given?"

I call the fifth, the clueless worker.

This is the worker who fails to grasp that our goal and the church's goal is to raise up indigenous churches that are self supporting and self propagating. The goal is to get off support, and I have

been forced to remind men of this fact. I get monthly projections from men on the field who are basically handing me a bill.

There is a sixth - the "give me monster" worker.

This is especially real overseas when you transition from a U.S. worker to an indigenous worker. A worker sent out from the United States has operated at a fairly high standard of living as it relates to a third world country and that's not wrong, but there are pitfalls and obstacles for the succeeding indigenous worker to overcome. He's seen the ministry grow, he's seen God's grace that's been at work, he's under no delusion as to the role that money and support has played in this, and now he is faced with the challenge of moving that ministry forward. It's going to take money to do that, but you're going to have to contend sometimes with the "give me monster" that starts getting a hold of men in that setting that can really undercut what we set out to accomplish and what had been put into place.

There is the seventh, the unproductive worker.

This is the worker who is clearly not making it, and for them to remain there it's going to take buckets full of money. Even then the outcome is dubious. Some of these things don't have an easy answer, and every church planter has to wrestle through these but they do relate to support.

I call another the disconnected worker. And this is a slight departure - it involved area leaders and different churches tied to them - not birthed or directly related but who approach that as a mandate rather than as a ministry to serve. This isn't a mandate. This is a ministry to serve and if that attitude is not there there's a serious disconnect and a serious breakdown.

And the ninth, which is a good one, is the faithful or the faith-filled worker. This is the pastor who discovers God's resources for his own ministry. We have all personally had to work through this in our own lives. An important part of a man's development in life and in ministry is forged in the facing of financial pressures and seeing God meet those needs. The faithful worker will believe God to see those needs met in his own life and in his own ministry.

Our hearts are for the preaching of

God has wrought great fellowship from small beginning

Our fellowship has just passed a number of milestones:

We now have churches in **100** nations! We have **400** churches in America and **1,000** churches internationally! As I pondered where all this has come from (a handful of people in a hurting congregation in a town of 13,000 in 1970), I was reminded of Jesus' parables of how the Kingdom of Heaven operates in **Matt 13:31-33**: A grain of mustard seed and a pinch of yeast. Both illustrate the hidden nature of the kingdom of God.

1. We cannot measure the true impact of what God is doing – especially at the beginning. These parables were spoken at a time when there was opposition from without and defections from within. The natural result of these things is discouragement. Many make wrong evaluations based on outward appearances and wind up *despising the day of small beginnings!* There are none of our powerful churches or leaders who were impressive – at the beginning. Yet

the gospel and the nations of the world. That's going to require investments, sacrifice and support, but it also presents us with challenges that all of us have to deal with.

Paul's words in our text echo this understanding in verses 17 & 18 when he says, *"Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the fruit that abounds to your account. Indeed I have all and abound, I have received from Apaphrodites the things sent from you, a sweet smelling aroma an acceptable sacrifice, well pleasing to God."*

There's something about this that really is sacred. Third John verses 5-8 says, *"Beloved you do faithfully whatever you do for the brethren and for strangers who have born witness of your love before the church, if you send them forward on their journey in a manner worthy of God you do well. Because they went forth for His name's sake taking nothing for the Gentiles we therefore ought to receive such*

we see the grain of mustard seed become a powerful place of blessing and refreshing: *The birds come and lodge in the branches.*

2. The Kingdom involves disturbances. The ground 1st had to be broken and turned over by plowing, and the yeast makes the dough to ferment, bubble and rise. Before God can do a work through us, 1st He often has to disturb us: Our sin, our carnality, and our comfort zones. The difference between us and the ground or dough is that they don't have a choice, whereas we can choose whether or not to respond to God's disturbing hand. God convicts, interrupts, and challenges us so we can

fulfill His plans.

3. Faithfulness is the trigger for blessing. The actions taken by the characters in the story are not that impressive: Scattering some small grains in the earth, and kneading dough. Yet as they did what they could – things they couldn't do began to happen! The life force in the seed and the power of the yeast began to go to work – changing their surroundings. All over the world there are pastors and precious people who are doing what they can to try and place God into their surroundings – and often wonder if they are doing any good. Yet it is here that God goes to work and adds His power to our seemingly puny efforts.

I believe that for all the wonderful things we have seen so far – there is far more God will do in and through us. Let us stay confident in God's power, surrendered to God's disturbances, and faithful in our labors to see all that God intends for us!

that we may become fellow workers for the truth". One translation says "partners", another "allies"

This scripture acknowledges there is something sacred about this partnership and that sacred responsibility involves the sender and the sendee.

There's no getting around the reality of the cost factor of investing in workers and the preaching of the gospel. Without that responsibility on the part of the sender then the worker is in danger of financial ruin and all kinds of problems. The cost is worth it for the preaching of the gospel and the winning of precious souls.

The flip side of that responsibility calls for accountability and attitude, which will require the discipling of men in the school of financial support. Men need an understanding of the sacredness and responsibility of accountability related to support.

As a Christian, when you boil it all down, the heart is always the key. If that sacred responsibility is going to continue to flourish and thrive and I believe it is God's will for that to do so, then those responsibilities and attitudes need to be in place. I don't know if you can teach it, God has to do something.

Our churches are not filled with wealthy people giving out of their surpluses, our churches are filled with normal ordinary people who are committed to the vision of world evangelism. There is something very, very sacred about investing in others. It's something that needs to be guarded and contended for not only in our individual lives, our pastoral ministry, but in the hearts and the lives of the people we pastor. Because when people have that spirit, then you have the components that impact and the multiplication that goes beyond what any of us can accomplish by ourselves.

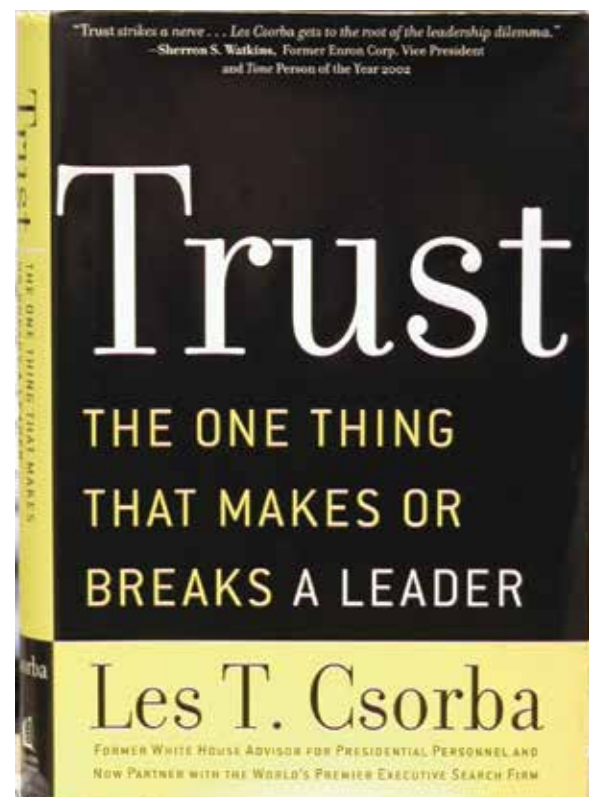
Les Csorba was an adviser to two Presidents (Bush 41 and 43). He currently is involved in the business world, and is a Christian. It is from the perspective of these three worlds (politics/business and the church) that he examines the greatest leadership lack in any area of life - Character!

The book is divided into three sections:

- The leadership call: Defining leadership and where it comes from
- The leadership famine: The crisis of a pragmatic world that has abandoned character for results.
- The leadership life: The call to character.

Csorba clearly examines the wreckage that lack of character has brought in every area of society: Business, politics, the home and the church.

He rightly points out that leadership is in essence a *moral* calling, and shows the need for moral leadership, which results in trust. This book is both personally challenging, and filled with great quotes for preachers.

The Church in Kingman continues to grow, with quality converts, good young families, and young men who want to preach the gospel. It has been an exciting time for us here.

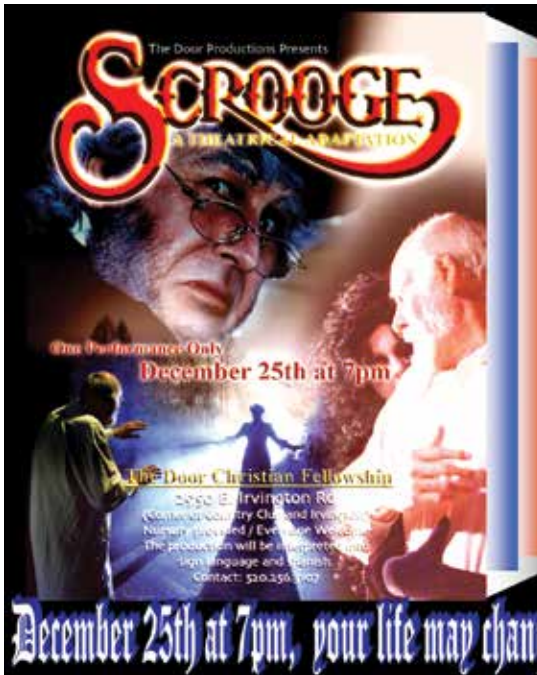
We followed January conference with a great revival with Fred Rubi, (it was the first revival the church has paid for by itself).

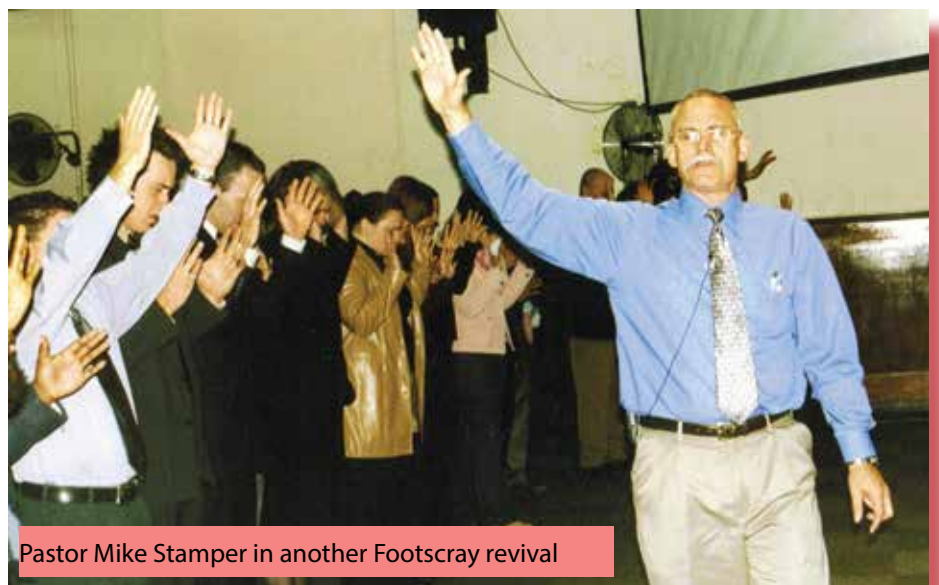
We continue to labor and take the call of God to evangelize seriously as we "bear the burden and heat of the day" with regular outreaches of movies, concerts and guerilla teams,

India, India, INDIA...seems to be on every one's mind and radar screen (as I write this President Bush has just left from highest level meetings), but all the attention is not merely economic or simply about energy deals.

While we acknowledge the huge changes, as this potential superpower begins to shake herself to rise up, those things only parallel some mighty forces that are shifting in the spiritual as well! What a sense of perfect timing The Spirit has in these matters! He foresaw the seismic transformation and right on time has positioned key couples in some of the huge cities of this nation of 1.1 billion souls.

Last December, seven of our pastors came together along with a good representation of their churches for the 2nd annual Fellowship India Bible Conference, in Bangalore (a.k.a. the Silicon Valley of India). It was a time of Holy Ghost preaching from Pastors Joe Campbell, Mark Aulson and our missionaries from The U. S. and Australia. The preaching was interpreted in three different languages for the hungry and tuned in assembly of some 300-plus disciples, although a large number of del-

egates are able to speak and understand English. A wide swath of discipleship issues were addressed. It was encouraging that this group that spans huge geographical, language, and social differences was melded together with one heart and one accord to hear and do whatever God would speak! This was very evident in the responses we got from the preaching, the challenges at the altar calls to consecrate themselves, and the excellent 'spirit' that was evident to serve all throughout the week of conference. One highlight - we took to the streets for a Jesus People March that attracted the attention of many in the area. What a thrill to see this representation of our Fellowship rising up to the streets boldly proclaiming Jesus even in the face of some very antagonistic religious forces.

The spirit of partnering among the missionaries was also quite encouraging. They will need all the synergistic multipliers that the Word of God promises when men can agree to loose and bind, to touch heaven for the earth. There is so much potential...I must testify, that personally, I was struck by what I saw and felt in my spirit. I sensed 'a quickening' that this is a spiritual gold mine for those who will pay the price to leave their comfort zones and lay it down on the altar and go and do a great work for the Lord.

A testimony in point; after conference I left Bangalore to fly to Mumbai (formerly Bombay, a megalopolis of 25 million) to

preach for Bob and Alison Hall in their pioneer work of two years. They had 93 delegates travel by train 24 hours to reach the conference, then same coming back, they arrived at about 7 a.m. the next day and a number of them were in early prayer! Pastor Hall was unsure of how many would turn out for our first night of revival and warned me the attendance might only reach 40-50 because the people were tired and needed to catch up from being away for a week. We were deeply moved when more than 130 came out! It was exhilarating to see the genuine and deep hunger of the people and especially that men are responding with an eagerness that has "the fingerprints of God" all over them!

I have been challenged to personally pray more, give more and do more for India. The stakes are incredibly high, the devil knows this middle kingdom is pivotal for not just the souls of precious Indian men and women, but also for the potential "seed" of future resources and missionaries to places we in the West cannot or will not access. This of course will be and is energetically opposed by the old serpent, it calls to mind the Apostle Paul's words in *1 Cor 16:9* "For a great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaries."

Nothing has changed in the epic contest, but through our God we can do all things! It is my prayer that God speak to men and women to seize the moment and give five or 10 years to launch movements all over Asia's other Powerhouse!

Youth are being reached in these concerts. One teenager who recently got saved has in turn brought his parents and sisters and they have all become born again and are regularly attending.
