Greetings from Prescott, Arizona.

After July conference, the congregation had farewell fellowships for J.W. and Anna Ballinger, who went into Tacoma, Washington, Gary and Patsy Basham, who took over in Sparta, Illinois, and Dan and Nancy Mazon, who went into Second Mesa on the Hopi reservation in Arizona.

In September, we hosted our annual Embry Riddle Day, in which we invite students and staff from the local aeronautical university. Eric Krahmer. Some who were saved in those special services are still attending today, giving us an open door to reach the students from all over the world who attend the school.

The next weekend, we enjoyed Native American Day, when Pastor Artie Aragon brings the Navajo Nation to Prescott. He preached a powerful sermon in the morning, and then we enjoyed an authentic Navajo lunch of fry bread and mutton stew, prepared by the ladies of the Chinle church. That evening the Chinle Choir sang, and a disciple from the church showed a video of all that God is doing in the Navajo Nation.

Pastor Wayman Mitchell has kept an unusually busy schedule since the July Conference in Prescott. After the conference, he preached an area-wide rally in Amarillo, Texas, along with the Mexico City Area Bible Conference, and the Oceanside Crusade.

He traveled to Holland for a tent crusade in the city of Delft. This crusade was significantly blessed with positive national and local press coverage. The national television station interviewed Pastor Mitchell, and for three minutes during prime time for the next two days, the news carried statements from Pastor and footage from the crusade.

God blessed the crusade with a number of dramatic healings. A record 900 people attended the conference on the closing night, and 133 people gave their lives to Jesus Christ, according to Pastor Bert Fledderus.

During the last week of August, Pastor Mitchell embarked on an around-the-world itinerary. An area-wide rally and miracle crusade preceded the first full Bible Conference in Melbourne, Australia, with Pastor Anthony Tilli. Pastor Mitchell and Pastor Paul Stephens were keynote speakers, and the conference launched three pioneer

overseas churches and one in Australia.

Pastor Mitchell preached and attended the Eldorado Park, Johannesburg, South Africa conference, which launched nine pioneer churches, including one in Namibia and one in Mozambique. A packed building testified to the health and blessing of that area of Africa. After the Africa conference, Pastor Mitchell traveled to London to preach for Pastor Peter Ajala of New London. Monday through Wednesday services followed a Saturday Men's Discipleship. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday Pastor also led sermon construction seminars with different pastors each day. Pastor Nigel Brown, U.K. overseer, organized these seminars.

After preaching 22 times on three continents among widely diverse congregations, Pastor Mitchell returned home exhausted but rejoicing in all that

God is doing. "God indeed is taking out of the gentiles a people for His name," Pastor Mitchell said.

Upon his return, Pastor Mitchell traveled to Upper Darby, Pennsylvania in company with Pastor Tom Payne for a Mid-Atlantic Churches Rally organized by Pastor Jon Overson. A good attendance and gracious spirit in the rally gave witness to the vision these churches have for the East Coast.

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Prescott brother shares thoughts on soul-winning

Proverbs 11:30 The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life; and he that wins souls is wise.

Proverbs 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue; and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

In 1901, J.W. Mahood, an evangelist, wrote a major essay entitled, “The Art of Soul Winning.” The preface begins with these words:

“Never was there such a great need for a mighty, Pentecostal revival in all our churches; and the key to such a revival is earnest personal work. But the membership of the churches is not prepared to enter upon this work. Multitudes know nothing of a personal Pentecost. Many are utterly indifferent. They do not realize their opportunity and responsibility before God. If they did, the revival would come at once. With the hope that many professing Christians may be awakened to duty, and hear God’s call to personal work in soul winning, this little volume is written.” (1)

Sparking the Fire

When I had been saved for two years, a brother in the church invited a handful of the saints to do an outreach in Ashfork, a sleepy little country town about 40 miles north of Prescott. His plan was to outreach twice during the week, and then show a film on Friday night...on the outside wall of a bar.

Late Tuesday afternoon, while witnessing with Sergio, a young man from the Dominican Republic, we encountered two young fellows, each about 20, walking along the road at the edge of town.

As both of us began to witness, all of a sudden, Sergio pressed in for a decision, and in short order, the three of them were kneeling on the side of the road praying a sinner’s prayer, in front of God and everybody!

It was stunning. It was as though a spark had leapt from Sergio to me. I felt the power of the Holy Spirit, and this “chance encounter” set the course of my Christian life.

During the week, I prayed with two people, and I felt a confidence and boldness building. When the movie was shown on Friday night, many visitors came. During



the altar call, several people went forward for salvation, and as I worked the crowd, I prayed with four more souls. I felt like a Piranha fish in a feeding frenzy!

Driving home that night, I stopped for gas at midnight in Prescott, and ended up praying with the gas station attendant to receive Christ. From that day on, I experienced an acceleration of God in my life.

When Jesus said, “Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men,” He was speaking of that very same impartation that will transform and empower a believer to take his place as a faithful witness.

It starts with the baptism of the Holy Ghost and fire. It becomes real and effective as we link our heart with vibrant soul winners to grow strong in our calling. Just as with the early disciples, we gain the wisdom to win in the going.

Teaching by Example

As he gathered men to Himself during the first year of His ministry, Jesus demonstrated the art of soul winning by having them go with Him and observe how He dealt with different people.

Nicodemus, the learned Pharisee, had great “head knowledge” of the scriptures, and was a ruler of the Jews. In this encounter, Jesus went right to the supernatural, “You must be born again.” (John 3:7).

The Samaritan woman at the well: After asking her to give Him water to drink He directed the conversation to “living water,” and then revealed to her the condition of her heart by dealing with her sin, her many adulteries. (John 4:3-26).

The rich young ruler: With great discernment and economy of words, Jesus attempted to show the man that he was a sinner, in spite of his self-righteous claim to have kept the Commandments. (Mark 10-17-22).

In training His disciples through the example of His life, Jesus was not only teaching them to win souls, but He was also preparing them for the fulfilling of the great Commission, to make disciples like themselves, who would also lead others to Christ.

Co-Laboring with Christ

“A true witness requires a supernatural dimension; you can’t reason them into the Kingdom.” (A sermon quote from Pastor Wayman Mitchell).

It is very encouraging to go witnessing, “two-by-two,” especially with new believers. I mean two people teaming up to go to the same house or to the same person or group. Not only can there be a greater dominion, it is a wonderful opportunity to gain valuable insights and wisdom in your witness. Iron sharpens iron.

At times, I’ve observed my witnessing partner and noticed his zeal and enthusiasm, and I realize, “Galati, you’ve gotten stale!” At other times, after finishing a particular encounter and then heading down the street, it’s a good time to talk over what just took place.

In comparing notes with your witnessing partner, it’s possible for the Holy Spirit to help you identify demonic strongholds that may be opposing your witness. That’s when it’s wise to marshal the “weapons of our warfare,” and take authority in that neighborhood. Pray, and pray in tongues. Bind and loose, and break the spirit of oppression that may be hindering you.

When we co-labor in that manner, a synergism kicks in, a chemistry that will make us a force to be reckoned with. The spiritual atmosphere will change, and your witness will have impact.

I can recall a guerilla team outreach that took place years ago. Ike Cook was the “Field General,” driving the van and dropping us off on various streets, pickup us up, and shuttling us through the neighborhood.

After I labored for some time, Ike

Greetings from the Door here in Albuquerque, New Mexico, where the power of God is still changing lives.

We have seen an outpouring of God's spirit as people in this congregation are constantly being challenged to be fruitful in prayer, giving, witnessing and serving God. There is tremendous potential for fruitfulness here. For example, when Bill Conrad came in and directed a powerful play, The Judgment, God put together an awesome cast and a packed out building every night. Twenty-nine people gave their lives to Jesus Christ.

In that same month, we added Thursday Spanish services to our schedule. These have become very fruitful and have brought numerous visitors to the church, fulfilling a vision that was prophesied years back.

As the New Year approached, Evangelist Jesus Vizzerra opened the doors of refreshing so we could face the world with stronger evangelism and boldness. There were deliverances and healings, and new souls were added to the church.

We are blessed in this fellowship to have Holy Ghost revivals.

Testimony

Hello, my name is Joe 'Flaco' Ponce, the only boy of four children. I turned to gangs, "Sureno" in Killeen for 12 years. My dad was a workaholic so I was able to run the streets at a young age; stealing my mom's cigarettes and sipping left over beers in the fridge. I lived a life of crime, you name it I did it, from drive bys, gang - banging, etc. All of my mess landed me

in prison at the tender age of 17 on two felony counts. I spent a year in prison, but once I was out - I ran back to the streets.

"I never looked back - that girl who invited me to church became my wife. If God can change me, He can change anyone."

That's when I got into the drug scene with cocaine, speed, and ice. I tried to clean myself up with a family but the drugs never left me - I began to sell pot by this time. Heartbreak set in as I watched friends get killed in front of me, and other friends were sentenced to 40-plus years for doing the same things I was involved in.

Apparently things never changed me because at the age of 25, I was right back in prison. I thought that if I joined a gang in prison, things would be better. I was terribly wrong. I realized by now that life was totally pointless. I had a home, three cars, the family dog, but no peace. One by one, I lost everything I ever had and wound up behind bars.

When I got out a friend of mine told me about this girl I met in a bar and said,

"Man, she's a holy roller, stay away from her!" I brushed him off, and a few weeks later, she found me and called me. She gave me her testimony, so I followed her to a Saturday night concert at the church February 10, 2007 and that evening, gave my life to Christ.

After this, I never looked back - that girl who invited me to church became my wife and now we just want to be an encouragement to others out there who are going through what we went through. If God can change me, He can change anyone - praise Him!

Testimony

Hello, my name is Mandy and I grew up just a little too fast. I started out with drugs and my first sexual experience at the age of 12. I got pregnant at 16 and worked in a bar by the time I was 18. My ex-husband was in the Mexican mafia and by age 22, I had three children.

As usual, I grew up in a broken home. I always saw my dad with different women and my mom was always working and leaving us at home alone. I followed the example of my older sisters and began to seek fulfillment in men because I wasn't getting that from my dad.

I first got saved November 11, 2005. I was on my way to kill my ex - husband because I found out he was cheating on me. I wanted my face to be the last one he saw. On my way, I thought about my kids and I knew right then I needed

Jesus. I went to three churches looking for God and all of them were locked. I stopped my car in front of a church and began to cry out to Jesus. My desperation only lasted a short while because I left God and went back to my sin. I remember one night getting high on coke I got from these guys. It was a set up - as soon as I got my buzz going, they raped me. Later I found out that I was pregnant during that time. I met Joe 'Flaco' in a bar and we became good friends - always getting high together. My life only began to get worse; always drinking and looking to drugs to ease my pain.

Many times, I would leave my kids with family members and run the streets. In January 2007, my kids came to visit and celebrate my daughter's birthday. I asked her what she wanted for a present and she said - "I want our family to go to church!" I was so convicted I went the very next service (Jan. 7) I re-dedicated my life back to Christ and spent the next few weeks looking for Flaco. Another brother in the church, Jose, told me that he knew where Flaco was and would get us together.

I witnessed to him one more time and he came out to the concert with me. Later that night, he answered the altar call. Not much longer after that, he became my husband - we are serving God with everything we have and raising a big family!

I give God all the praise for keeping me during my years of insanity; now, I can be a blessing to girls who are in the situation I came up in. Glory to God!

In the last seven months we have sent out three baby works - The Gougherty's to Layton, Utah; The Serna's to Los An-

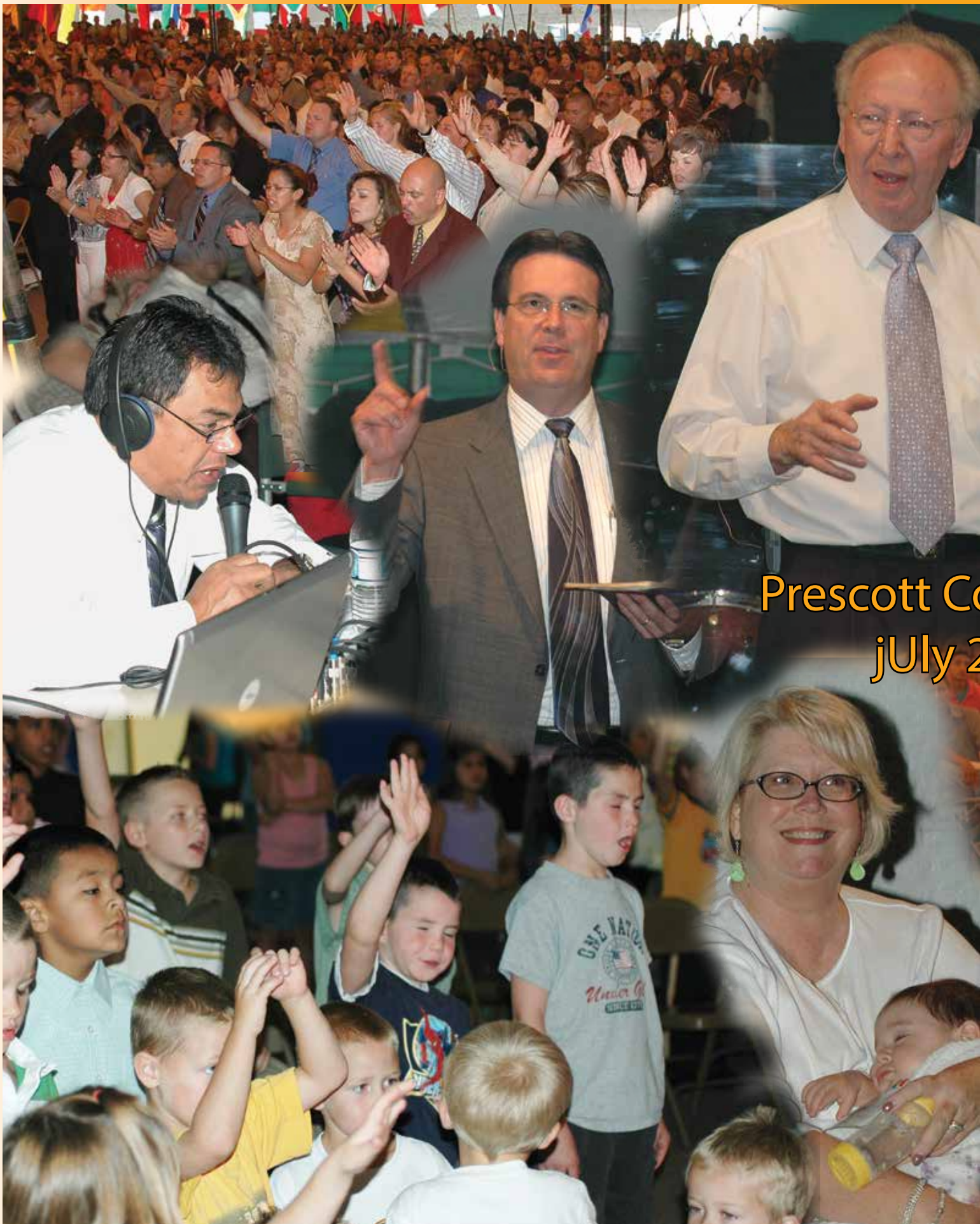

peace, Even in the hurricane...

Ken and Anne Haywood, family experience God's protection through monster storm

When Ken and Anne Haywood packed up their family in summer 2005 and headed for the Mississippi Gulf to pioneer a church, only to survive Hurricane Katrina and return to pastor in Kingman, Arizona, their experience left many scratching their heads.

Why didn't God simply send the couple and their four children to Kingman, just two and a half hours up the road from Prescott, in the first place?

The Haywoods don't wonder anymore. As they headed for India shortly after the July 2007 conference in Prescott, they did so with no fear, despite the fact that both admitted they knew nothing of what lay ahead. They just figured that after what they went through in Katrina, God can take care of them anywhere.

Ken and Anne served God for many years in the Prescott church. They married in October 1986, and in May 1990, they left to pastor their first church in Lancaster, California. They pioneered in Glendale, California, and then took over the work in Flagstaff, Arizona. After three years in Flagstaff, Ken came on staff at Prescott as an evangelist.

After several years in Prescott, God began to deal with Ken about the Mississippi Gulf area. A military base near Pascagoula offered a rich opportunity to share Jesus Christ.

The Haywoods left for the Gulf on August 19, 2005, traveling for five days with their four children, Paul, Rebekah, Sarah, and Hannah, and the family dog, Cooper.

Originally, Hurricane Katrina was on a course for the San Antonio, Texas, area. But the warm waters sucked it inside the gulf, and sent it toward Mississippi. The monster storm continued to build as the Haywoods approached the area.

The Haywoods were headed to Mobile, Alabama, but on the way, they found that the base at Pascagoula was closing, so they made a small turn on the freeway and headed for the Gulfport, Biloxi, Mississippi area. As the hurricane morphed

into a huge killer, that was when God began to show His hand.

"Gulfport was an area of 200,000 people, a vibrant, alive city, and we decided to locate there," Anne said.

"We went to stay in the Best Western Hotel, but they said we couldn't all stay in one room. For an hour and a half we went from hotel to hotel on the main strip. I'm thinking, 'I'm hot and sweaty, I want a hotel room,' but then I had a revelation. God was putting us where He wanted us."

The only place that would allow the entire family in one room was a Holiday Inn Express between the Holiday Inn and a Hampton Inn, both tall buildings.

"Ken went in, and the lady was thrilled we were there to pastor a church. She said, 'I'll make room.' She put us on the bottom floor at the back of the hotel," Anne said.

The family unpacked and began to hunt for a house the same day. "We knew there was a hurricane coming, but that was just part of life there, and we didn't think about escaping. God had brought us there," she said.

The Haywoods searched for a house for two days, but found nothing. By Saturday night, Ken had to make a decision. New Orleans had announced a mandatory evacuation, and cars jammed the Interstate 10 that runs through Biloxi. He began an internet search for a hotel somewhere within a 300-400 mile radius of the town.

"There was nothing available. By Sunday morning, we made the decision

to stay. We were in the safest place we could be, five miles from the beach and surrounded by tall hotels. Pastor Mitchell told us to do or buy whatever it took to keep our family safe. We bought camping gear, lights, a radio, water, and food. By Sunday morning the Wal Mart was only letting people out. We bought cans of stew, spaghetti, whatever we could eat cold out of a can. We filled the bathtub with water," Anne said. While preparing for a life threatening storm, they witnessed to people in line at the stores.

By Sunday afternoon, the town had imposed a 4 p.m. curfew. The Haywoods took one last drive up I-90, and saw that water had already risen to the lifeguard shacks on the beach. A marine life sanctuary moved their dolphins to the hotel pools for safekeeping. Industrial plants near the beach moved all of their vehicles inland.

"We couldn't escape, and we believed God didn't bring us here to kill us. We had such a peace," Anne said.

They needed God's peace, because the hotel told Ken he would have to sign a coroner's report to identify his family if he wanted to stay through the hurricane. "That was kind of frightening," Ken said. "It was very sobering as the head of household, writing my children's names and social security numbers."

The family had one last meal out,

watching the approaching hurricane on the news, and then holed up in their hotel. During the night, the hurricane built to fearsome strength.

"All night long we heard the wind, and when the building shook a lot, we prayed, and then went back to sleep," Anne said. "All the power went out, but we weren't afraid. That was incredible to me. We lost the water in the morning, we had no phone or cell phone, yet we had such a peace."

Ken had to take the dog out, and Cooper would normally have been nervous in the storm, but he was calm, too. Until a few hours later. Ken tried to take Cooper out again in an area between the buildings, but the wind came through and literally picked the dog up into the air. Ken reached quickly and grabbed the fur around Cooper's neck, and yanked him in the door. "If I hadn't done that, we would have lost him," Ken said.

For another 24 hours, the wind howled. The hotel had let the Haywoods tape the window and park their 26-foot moving van and their family van in front of it. "We would take turns watching at the window," Anne said. "Our parking lot was like a wind tunnel, and we watched as pieces of the roof of the place next door flew by. Yet we weren't afraid. It was like God was holding His hands around us. We had no TV, so we couldn't see what was going on. We finally turned off the radio, because the news was so devastating," she said.

They had plenty of reason to be unnerved. At one point, as Ken watched through the window, the 200-plus mph wind picked up the back end of their fully loaded moving van four to five feet in the air and slammed it back on the ground.

As the hurricane waned, God's care became more and more evident. Before the hurricane, Ken said, God spoke clearly to him to fill the family van and moving van with fuel. It seemed strange to him, because the family planned to stay in Gulf-

port and turn the van in there.

During one of Paul's turns at the window, he noticed that the dome lights and headlights in the Haywood's family van were on. Ken made his way out and disconnected the battery, because newer vehicles have a feature that makes the lights and dome light come on if it appears someone is breaking in. The wind was so strong, it activated this feature.

When Ken and Paul went outside on Monday, they found the wind had blown out the windows on one side of every car

in the parking lot.

"When the hurricane was over, we went to clean out the van. Ken got the kids working, but nothing could be saved. We got the seats back in. And when the truck was lifted up, it didn't hurt the hitch or anything. There was one cracked side mirror. Then they found a piece of wood that had woven itself through the tread of a tire, but had not flattened it.

"All the fury of Hell was thrown at us, yet God totally overshadowed us," Anne said. "So we were able to escape. Usually from Biloxi to Pensacola, Florida, is only an hour and a half drive, but it took us 10 hours. There was so much debris on the five lane freeway, only one lane was open," Anne said.

Because Ken had obeyed God in filling the vans' tanks, and had disconnected the van battery, the family was able to leave, and had just enough fuel for the 10-hour

trip. They landed in a seedy hotel, but were so grateful for electricity, water and phone service.

"We remember the awesome power of the hurricane," Ken said. "But there were funny moments, too. We had peace through the whole thing. After the storm passed, we walked to the hotel next door, and there were the dolphins in the pool throwing footballs at us. We felt like we were at Sea World all of a sudden, and we thought, 'how weird is this.'"

Other sights were far more sobering.

The neighborhood in which they had hunted for a house was gone. The other side of the street was under water.

They later found that the hotel they stayed in was the one emergency management personnel used as a base, because it was the safest place in the city.

The community in which they thought they would pastor nearly completely destroyed,

the Haywoods headed home. The Kingman church was open, and they settled in to the northwestern Arizona city seemingly for a long time. God had other plans.

Ken had spoken several times in passing with Pastor Greg Mitchell about India. But it all came together at the July 2007 conference in Prescott.

"On Monday night, Pastor Mitchell hadn't gotten through his first point when my heart was burning. I was saved in a Baptist church as a kid, and some missionaries came from the Philippines. I was captivated. When Anne and I were newlyweds, Don Galati went to China, and God began dealing with me. I have always told God I will go. Now we were in Kingman after the hurricane, and I began to hear things about India. I had

talked to Pastor Greg Mitchell a few times about what an opportunity that was for the gospel, but that was it.

“By the end of Pastor’s first point Monday night, God was speaking to me, ‘Will you still go? Are you still willing?’ In five or ten years, Kingman will be a church planting church, and my family is all there. But by the end of the third point, I was weeping. God clearly spoke to me – ‘Go make yourself available to Pastor Mitchell.’”

Ken found Pastor Mitchell and spoke to him. On Tuesday, Pastor called him to the platform and asked him if he would consider going to India.

“I said yes, and I haven’t slept a whole night since then,” Ken said. “I wake every night thinking about India.”

Ken and Anne, along with their daughters Sarah and Hannah, are now in Mumbai, India, pastoring the church started by Bob and Alison Hall. The Haywoods’ son Paul and daughter Rebekah are living and

working in Kingman, and attending the Kingman church, now pastored by Chuck and Kathy Haynes from Sparta, Illinois. Cooper the dog has found a good home with an Australian Shepherd breeder in Kingman, another evidence of God’s detailed care.

“Cooper was a trooper,” Ken said. “He went through the hurricane with us, and that made it all the harder to give him up. But he got a great home, and we have a peace about that.”

Ken and Anne both say that the experience of going through the hurricane changed their whole family.

“Something happened to us in that hurricane that I can’t quantify,” Ken said. “There was something supernatural about the experience. We saw God’s hand moving personally for us.”

“God didn’t take us out of the storm,” Anne said. “He overshadowed us in it. My kids saw that Jesus is real. The God that overshadowed us in Katrina is the

same God that will go with us and be with us in India.

“People have said, ‘You’ve never been to India. But there are 20 million people there who have no hope. They live their whole lives worshipping three million gods. How tormenting. They need to hear the truth of Jesus.’”

Ken added, “The situation in Kingman was perfect for me. I thought, ‘They’ll have to pry me out of here, I’m never leaving. I believe God heard me and said, ‘Oh really.’”

The Haywoods are in Mumbai, in Bombay, a city of 18 million – three times the size of New York City.

“There is no reason this church can’t be a self-supporting work. We’re here to work ourselves out of a job, to have native workers rise up and make impact on the world from their own country,” Ken said.

The Haywoods know God can make it come to pass. They’ve already seen His hand at work.

stopped to pick me up. I entered the van, and there was Ike, along with Bob Swope and Steve Garabay. Things were not going well for me. I was very frustrated, and so I vented, and said, “Man, I fell like a Jehovah’s Witness 2X2!”

That triggered something, and one by one, each of the other three spoke out and they, took, had been plagued with that same thought! A rousing exchange followed, and we were thrilled to learn first hand about the devil’s devices and the spiritual warfare that takes place then we fish for souls.

Lessons like that will keep you in good stead when you’re in the trenches.

The singular focus that we need

The New Testament gives us a remarkable account of the activity of the First Century church in spreading the gospel.

It is striking to note that in only two years, the believers in Asia Minor evangelized everyone in that vast region, both Jew and Gentile (Acts 19:10). This included Ephesus and Damascus, plus dozens of other large cities as well as smaller towns and villages, and even the nomadic tribes in the desert.

How did they do it? They witnessed. By following the example of the earlier believers in Jerusalem, they went from

house to house and declared that Jesus is the Christ, and He is risen from the dead.

When we consider those First Century saints, it’s easy to think: “Poor souls. How backward they were. If only they had our technology.”

No. The fact of the matter is that they were “on fire for God!” They were filled to overflowing with a love for their Lord and a passion for souls. And nothing else mattered but to preach the gospel and win souls to Christ.

Jesus demonstrated that very means of evangelism himself when He said to the disciples, “Let us go into the next towns, that I may preach there also, because for this purpose I have come forth.” (Mark 1:38).

The critical point is this: When we fish for the souls of men, one-on-one, eye-to-eye, heart-to-heart, a unique, we release a God-breathed dynamic. A true witness gives life to the hearer, and it sustains the life of the sower.

When our hearts are right with God, and we confess Christ before men, that is the proof of our faith for salvation. After all, if I don’t have faith for another’s soul, how can it be that I have faith for my own?

The faith that overcomes

The faith that pleases God is a faith that overcomes the downward pull of this earthbound existence.

In His letter to the seven churches of Revelation, even after dealing with their problems and inherent weaknesses, Jesus reveals His love for His church. To each of the seven as well as to Christians throughout the ages, He offers this great hope: “To him who overcomes, I will.”

When the final curtain is drawn and you step out into eternity, what will be the record of your life? As with Paul, which of us will be able to say, “For I (was) not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ: For it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone who believes.” (*Romans 1:16*), or “*I have fought the good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith.*” (*2 Timothy 4:7*).

We recently moved into a bigger building. After looking for about two years and checking between 30 and 40 buildings. Finally, we were able to get a building.

Everywhere we would go, they would tell us, "This is a Catholic community, the community will not accept

such a thing as that." Or the buildings were just too expensive.

This is the capital city of Spain, beautiful Madrid. One day before we had the grand opening of our church, one of the water pipes broke and the church flooded with water. Sometimes, if we just persevere, the blessings will come.

Greetings from Durban South Africa. Since the January Conference in Prescott Arizona we have seen a lot of momentum and growth in the Church. January through March we were busy preparing the land and purchasing a larger tent. In the last year we were able to raise R84000.00 (\$12,000), towards the tent and carpeting.

We had the grand opening in the new tent on Easter Sunday morning and started a healing crusade with Pastor Polaco. That week we had 27 saved, with an attendance of 151 the following Sunday.

In May we had a short three-day revival with Tom Payne. In just three days we had 50 saved and the following Sunday the attendance jumped to 209.

In June we celebrated two great years of God's blessing as a church and what a joy it was to look around and see all the new converts that had gotten saved and delivered.

One wife had been praying for her husband for 20 years. He was a staunch Hindu. God gloriously touched this man and his whole family is now serving God in our church. Recently he brought the family god lamp, put his foot on it and renounced all involvement in idolatry.

Another man named Joe was in a horrible car accident. The doctors didn't give the family much hope of Joe living. The Miracle of Joe Hurter (Written by Joe's sister, Jeanne)

On Sunday morning, April 22, 2007, Joe had a severe car accident. Paramedics were on the scene within two minutes. They found Joe dead on arrival. He had to be freed from the vehicle with their Jaws of Life equipment. They resuscitated him, placed him on life support, and took him

to King Edward Hospital in Durban.

At the hospital during CT scans, he ran out of oxygen. Staff could not locate replacement bottles or the manual breathing bag. A few other incidents occurred, but that is not important now. He should have died again, but the Lord had a plan. We knew that he would not survive the night in this hospital. We could only pray for a miracle.

That evening he was moved via ambulance to Nkosi Albert Luthuli Hospital. Please bear in mind that you only go there strictly on referral. Lucky for us, King Edward had no place for him in ICU. So, there is Joe, no medical aid, in ICU, in one of the most beautiful and modern hospi-

tals in the Southern Hemisphere!

I walked into church that night and read the blue banner on the wall that said "Expect a Miracle" and I did believe it with all of my heart.

After the service, Pastor Bill, Pastor John, and Pastor Neil went to pray for Joe in the ICU ward. Being human, they did not think that he would ever make it, but they prayed for his soul, because they trusted God.

His right eye was cut open from his forehead to his cheek. The blood was running from his right ear. His head was full of cuts, his ribs were dislocated, and he has spinal injuries. Doctors were unsure of the use of his eye and ear again. He was conscious only for a few minutes at a time, but he had no recollection of what happened neither could he remember when he woke up again.

On Friday, he started to respond more clearly. He thought that he was in a very bad bar fight and did not believe that he was in a car accident.

On May 11, Joe walked into the church very slowly with his neck brace on, (due to the spinal injuries) for the Healing Crusade with Pastor Tom Payne.

Everybody who had prayed for Joe just knew it was he although nobody ever met him. It was an absolute amazing evening! Pastor Tom Payne laid hands on Joe for a speedy recovery and healing.

Joe can see in with his eye, and hear with his ear. The rest are still healing daily. Everybody believes that Joe had received a miracle. God has a great plan for Joe, Cheryl and his daughter Jaymee.
