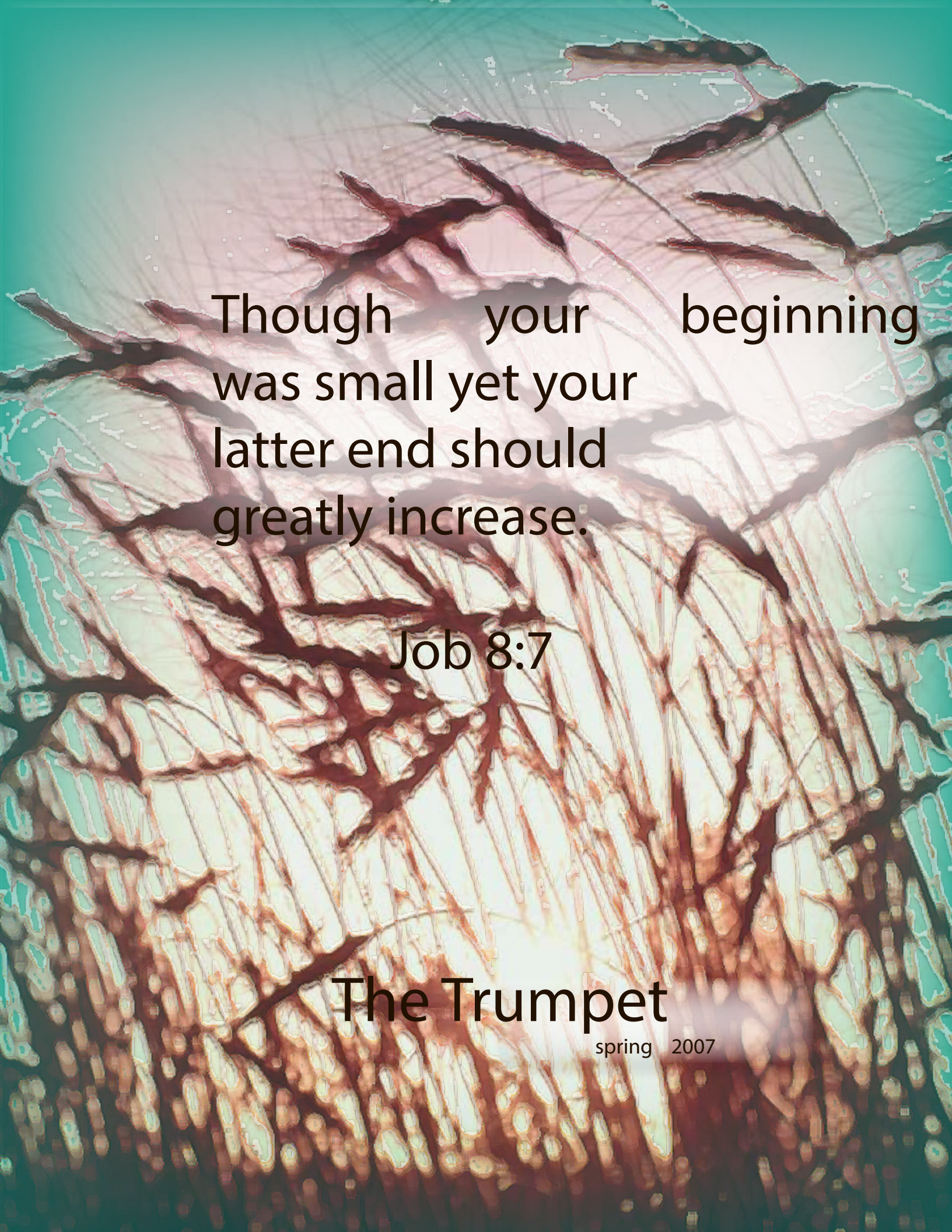

Hello from Prescott, Arizona.

At the closing of our Home Fellowship Bible Studies, our Youth Bible Study group went out to the streets after each study and outreached at one of our entertainment centers in Pres-

cott Valley. They lead anywhere from 10-15 kids to the Lord when they stepped out in faith. What a tremendous stirring for our youth to see God's blessings as they labor for His kingdom.

Even though our winter season seems a little quieter than the summer, we still continue to press on with our Saturday outreach teams. We take the gospel outside our walls and confront people with their sin. Inevitably God is faithful to give us souls. It doesn't stop with just weekend outreaches either. We have dedicated saints who continue year round bringing hope to the kids and adults with their local and out of town jail ministries. Each Sunday they give us report about what God is doing in the hearts of these broken, lost souls. We repeatedly hear about how five or eight people have agreed to repent and give their hearts to the Lord. Everywhere there is a child or adult facing the consequences of their sin that results in having to serve time in jail or a juvenile facility. We are thankful for our saints who are allowed the privilege to go into our jails.

We also sent a team of workers to the crusade in San Luis for Jose Torres in March. This was a phenomenal time. We had many reports of people stating that this was their 5th or 8th time going to San Luis and this was the best one ever. We had workers in the parade, in drug rehab centers, and walking the streets sharing testimonies and inviting everyone to the crusade and praying with the unsaved. One particular woman was told by her doctor that she would never have the use of her arm again. There she was standing in front of hundreds of people believing for God and she got it, praise God! As many of them did, they walked around smiling and moving to share what God had just done for them. There were 330 decisions for Jesus Christ and many healings in the San Luis crusade. God is good and faithful to His promises.

Australia adds third conference, San Luis crusade successful

Pastor Wayman Mitchell has been involved in a busy schedule since Prescott's January conference.

Pastor Mitchell partnered with Pastor Alberto Maleno for a very successful crusade in Almeria, Spain. The crusade was well planned and organized in a local community center in downtown Almeria. All of the fellowship pastors and churches in Spain cooperated, and some 80 people, including pastors and workers from England and Holland, who came and evangelized. The crusade was well attended even though unusually cold weather and snow made conditions difficult.

Seminars in the morning included several speakers. Pastor Gene LaValley and a Cuban Hispanic interpreter made the crusade very encouraging. More than 70 people gave their hearts to Jesus, and many miracle healings took place. The first lady Pastor Mitchell prayed for had cancer, with pain throughout her body. She returned each night to bring visitors and has since confirmed her healing with a doctor's report of "no cancer."

Pastor Mitchell travelled to Guam, Marianas Islands in February for one of the best attended crusades ever at the Ipao Beach bandshell. Hundreds were saved and many were healed. Among those was an 11-year-old girl whose mother brought her for prayer, saying doctors had burned

warts off her, but they always came back. After prayer, the mother called to say she had examined her daughter and the warts were gone.

Pastor has preached a number of one night crusades and Pioneer Rallies, including Blythe, California and Albuquerque, New Mexico with very good results.

Accompanied by Sister Nelda Mitchell, Pastor Mitchell travelled to Australia in March for leadership meetings and the national conference in Perth. These were outstanding times. Two new international churches were announced, along with pastoral changes, five new pioneer churches in Australia, and the announcement of another regional conference in Melbourne, Australia. This adds to the new regional conference that was held for the first time in Sydney, Australia in January.

Some 120 youth and chaperones travelled to San Luis, Mexico on March 23 and 24 for the annual Healing Crusade and Youth Invasion. During the three day crusade and out-

reaches, more than 329 people prayed for salvation. The youth participated in a large Jesus parade in the city while passing out flyers and evangelizing. Many outreaches into rehab facilities for male and female drug addicts made this a day to remember. Pastor Mitchell preached Thursday and Friday nights and conducted a Friday seminar with Pastor Greg Mitchell and Pastor Richard Cox. Pastor Jim Ballinger concluded the crusade on Saturday evening and continued in revival in the San Luis church.

Nationalism a threat to work of God in fellowship

Some of the righteous men in our fellowship are not here today, because over a process of time subtle seeds begin to creep into their hearts. Not only are they not here, and hurt us in what God would have us to do, but have pretty much destroyed their own lives. I want to look at 1 Cor. 1.

I noticed a number of years ago, when Nick Ung planned to pull the work in Petaling Jaya, Malaysia, the highest card in his spiritual deck was nationalism. This was the easiest card that he could play and it carried the most weight. It was an anti-American thrust that “we did not understand, we were Americans, we were foreigners, we did not have their interests at heart.” In playing that, he discredited my authority in that church to some degree. Then he began to say I was going to steal the church. Never mind that Prescott and others had invested God only knows how much money. He said I was going to come in and steal money, that I was going to put my son there as the pastor. None of this was true. I saw this again in Mexico with Raul Ramos, and most recently in the Philippines with Minging Mores.

In the first four chapters of Corinthians, Paul is dealing with this issue. Chapter 1, vs. 10: “Now I plead with you brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ that you all speak the same thing. That there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and the same judgment, for it has been declared to me concerning you, my brethren, by those of Chloe’s house, that there are contentions among you. Now I say that each of you says I am of Paul, I am of Apollos, I am of Cephas, I am of Christ. Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you, or were you baptized in the name of Paul?”

Over in Chapter 3:1-4, “And I brethren could not speak to you as to spiritual people but as to carnal, to babes in Christ. Ifed you with milk, not with solid food for until now you were not able to receive it and even now you are still not able. For you are still carnal. For where there are envy, strife, divisions among you, are you not

carnal behaving like mere men for when one says I am of Paul, another I am of Apollos, are you not carnal? Who then is Paul, who is Apollos, ministers through whom you

believed and the Lord God gave to each of you. I planted, Apollo watered, God gave the increase. So then neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters, but God who gives the increase. Now he who plants, he who waters are one, each one will receive his own reward according to his own labor. We are God’s fellow workers. You are God’s field, you are God’s building.”

Then he kind of capitalizes on this in chapter 4 with vs. 15: “You may have 10,000 instructors in Christ, yet you do not have many fathers, for in Christ Jesus I have begotten you through the gospel.”

What we’re talking about is not just nationalism, but in a pure sense, is patriotic devotion or love for one’s country. We can move through to ethnicity, this has to do with race, cultural groups, language and customs. Or tribalism, which is a group of people united by birth under that same leader, claiming descent from common ancestors or a clan. Now everyone here falls under these groups. It’s inescapable. It’s true naturally but it’s also true spiritually. In the natural everyone of us was born in a nation, there’s language, there’s accent, there’s culture, there are values and beliefs, that’s inescapable. In the church, that’s also true. We’re born and disciplined, we’re trained nationally, but also out of various churches. Guys say, “I’m of Prescott, or I’m of Tucson, or Chandler.” This is not evil in itself. Many times when a guy says this he is trying to identify himself

and locate himself. This is not a problem when men’s hearts are right, when there’s common vision, fellowship and common

wealth. This is what’s brought us incredible blessing, fruitfulness and enlargement around the world to our fellowship. Acts 2:42 “They continued steadfastly in the apostle’s doctrine and fellowship. All who believed were together. They had all things in common. They continued daily in one accord, gladness, singleness of heart. And the Lord added to the church daily and the disciples multiplied.”

Acts 4:32 “The multitude of those who believed were one heart, one soul, neither did anyone say anything of the things he possessed was his own, they had all things in common, and great power and great grace was upon them all.”

The truth is when we’re born again, we’re born into another kingdom that has to supersede our national citizenship. We’re born into the kingdom of God, we’re citizens of heaven and the Bible says we become a spiritual commonwealth. Eph. 2:12 “That at that time you were without Christ being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, strangers from the covenants of promises, having no hope without God in the world, but now in Christ Jesus you who were afar off have been brought near by the blood of Jesus Christ.”

You can’t escape a dimension of culture, but the bottom line is when we’re born again, when we’re part of the fellowship, there’s a bond and a citizenship that supersedes the natural or the cultural, or what church you are from. It has to do both spiritually, and in the natural. Paul is saying in these scriptures that you cannot allow your self-interest and selfish ambi-

tions to destroy the fellowship and what God is doing and what we are as a group of churches. Phil. 2:2 *"Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests but also the interests of others."*

No individual has the right to to destroy the fellowship, what many of us here have given our lives to. So our aim is indigenous churches, but not national churches. Not independent churches, not "you can do whatever you want to do." Once you are appointed a leader, you can't take those churches in any direction you want. It doesn't mean you own those churches. This is a total violation of what we are and what we do. In the Phillipines, this violated standard, pattern, discipleship, vision and years of Americans and others who labored there, preached there, and invested hundreds of thousands of dollars. Mingging Mores got into the treasure hunting schemes and pyramid schemes. One man wrote of him, "His tendency has become to be anti-American under the guise of being nationalistic and patriotic." So Pastor Glen Cluck is having to pick up the pieces of all this.

I want to tell you from my perspective that I am alarmed when I begin to hear this national card beginning to be played. These men under Mingging know he holds their destiny and their future in his hands. He's going to determine who preaches in his conference, and he's going to determine opportunities. He can either encourage them, serve them, be a blessing and promote them or he can kill them spiritually. So what happens, and I saw this firsthand in the work in Malaysia, is men who are concerned about their spiritual destiny, are totally intimidated, and they fear challenging, even though they may know and feel something is wrong. Unless they are very strong, they will not challenge that, and in this case, it will go on for years, this subtle sowing behind the scenes.

From my experience, a pastor or a leader will disguise his anti-Americanism behind his nationalism or his tribalism.

Jose Torres said, "What I perceive many times, this is what is missing in the hearts of men, the understanding that the Bible has a culture of its own, not based on color, nation, or roots but on the Word of God."

The thought is this internal link by color of skin and national roots. If you

say, "Things are different in (your country)," this mindset does away with Biblical principles, Holy Ghost conviction, and begins to introduce personal opinions, and likes and dislikes. It becomes an excuse for violating fellowship standards and policies. Another statement is, "We're not in to those American views. We're more humanitarian," or, "The Americans don't understand us, they can't relate." What happens when this card is being played is that many times there is a resentment of any confrontation, any discipline, any demand, any accountability. It computes out in "American dominance." They put this out to the members, "We're more understanding, we're more compassionate, we're more sensitive, loving, and caring. The Americans are hard, cold, indifferent, and don't care about us, and don't understand us."

When I begin to hear this card played, the aim is always to discredit. The leader or pastor is afraid he's going to be exposed. It's either morals or money, or he's harboring rebellion. He's setting the stage to pull the church or churches in the future when he feels the time is right. It's not just nationalistic. It can be spiritual tribalism - "I'm of Campbell, I'm of Payne, I'm of Haynes," or whoever I am. It's the same flavor if they're barren or unfruitful. One man said "The reason my church is not growing is because of the Americans. We're different. Our culture is different." When there is unfruitfulness, a barrenness, or disciples aren't being made, and churches aren't being planted, then there's a tendency for a national leader to begin to play this card. Or if a pastor or leader becomes bitter, he's not getting enough recognition, or there's jealousy, or he's been confronted or disciplined about an area of his ministry or life then these seeds begin to grow. We have sat at this table with men who at one time had given their lives to the fellowship. Later we had to deal with these same men and their hearts were unbelievably wicked. That didn't happen in a moment, but it happened. The card I see played many times is that they have a better idea, they have their own agenda. There is pride involved, or they don't want to bear the reproach of what we are. They don't want to judge fornication, to hold the standards against sin and adultery. We're not Assembly of God, we're not TBN, we're not Rick Warren, we're not Hillsong. If that's what you want to be, then you ought to go. But nationalism is an excuse to deceive others

and to manipulate. The bottom line is that nationalism becomes a cover for self interest. These signals set my alarm off.

Mark Aulson was just in Australia preaching and a pastor came up to him and said, "What are you trying to do, make this a Prescott colony?" This man is pastoring a church that Prescott had pioneered and three Americans had labored in, one of them Greg Mitchell. That upsets me when I hear that because I've seen this in the past. So I asked the men on the trip to Israel, "What do you think he meant by this?" One of the men said, "What I keep hearing is, 'Prescott is old, it's outdated, we're moving on, we have our own identity, we have our own flavor.'"

You change your name, you change your services, you change your style, and every new fad that comes down the religious world, you embrace that. You begin to isolate your church from preachers or pastors. This all plays together. You begin to promote those who will support you. It doesn't matter if they're qualified, if they're righteous, loyal to the fellowship, or hold standards. You will not have those in to speak who are loyal and who will deal with issues. One pastor was confronted, "Why are you having all those Americans in your church?" like he was a traitor or there was something wrong with him. The verbiage changes. It's no longer discipleship, it's "mentoring." There's a de-emphasis on the altar call. I mentioned the embracing of all the outside programs in the latest megachurches. It's unending. We stand for something. Those who embrace nationalism say, "The fellowship is trying to control me, or us. They don't care about us, they don't understand us, they're trying to make us Americans, they're not one of us." It's a violation of a sacred trust and it's deadly.

Tribalism and ethnic posturing have gutted Africa for decades. I have a quote from the Congo. They have incredible natural resources and population. "Elections won't bring democracy, they'll bring chaos. The winners will scoop up the pool and tell the losers to go to Hell. The losers will say the game was fixed and take to the bush. Since everyone voted on ethnic lines anyway, they'll be back where they started and worse. That's the history of Africa."

If you follow this through, the reason the Corinthian church never became what it could have become - here's a church of resources, and geographic location - and

Accept no substitutes for God's standards of victory

In **2 Chron 12** the Bible tells the story of an enemy King (Shishak) who comes and carried away the shields of gold which Solomon had made. These shields were the result of David's reliance on God in battle, and were used by Solomon in connection with temple worship; the presence of God made real in human lives. But the temptation is to make substitutes: **2 Chr 12:10** *So King Rehoboam made shields of brass to take their place...* Shields of brass stand for several things:

1. When we substitute human effort for God's presence: Shields of gold came from victories as a result of God's will being sought, and an attitude of dependence adopted in battle. As we become more knowledgeable and experienced, it is easy to manufac-

ture our own standards of victory. Our aim can become wowing people with professionalism or talent, and impressing them with programs. The shine of the brass causes people to fail to examine the reality.

2. When we care more for looking good than doing good: Rehoboam did not have the same dimension of victory at work in his kingdom that his father Solomon did, but all he cared about was looking like he did! The

shine of appearance is more important than the seal of the spirit. This is hypocrisy.

The real threat of accepting substitutes is that there comes a time when people no longer know the difference. **Rev 3:1** *"To the angel of the church in Sardis write: ...I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead.* For personal believers, nothing will take the place of obedience and personal holiness. For churches, the standard is genuine conversions, disciples being made, and churches being planted. Anything less is simply a substitute for the real thing.

Getting the gold back begins with a decision to settle for nothing less: *Accept no substitutes!* May we be honest enough to genuinely examine our lives and churches; To repent if necessary

yet when you read 1 and 2 Corinthians, they never grew up. The division and schism killed their fruitfulness.

We must speak the same language. We were just in Israel. There was in the 1850s a man who gave his life for one thing - that Israel would speak a common language of Hebrew. Our guide said Isaiah could come back today and stand on a street corner in Jerusalem and preach and everyone would understand it. When the Jews came back they came from every corner of the earth and they all had different languages. Ben Yahuda gave his life to that because he understood that if they did not speak the same language they would never be able to come together as a nation. Alexander the Great's creation of the first common greek dialect was because it was critical for the fusing and victory of the army. This became the New Testament Greek and imposing a common greek dialect allowed Alexander to combine the army and communicate internally.

We're at this table, a number of nations, and we have influence over a lot of churches. The future is going to be de-

pendent upon us speaking the same language. Phil. 1:27 *"Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of your affairs and you stand fast in one spirit, in one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel."*

Chapter 2, *"Therefore if there is any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the spirit, if any affection and mercy, fulfill my joy, being likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord and one mind. Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself, let each of you look out not only for his own interests but also for the interests of others."*

And so, why the Americans? Who made us in charge? You may not like it, but it was God, by His Holy Spirit. We've all played a part, but God chose to move through Pastor Mitchell, and the fellowship was birthed in Prescott. It began in America. That doesn't mean we own the world. We've given our lives for these nations, in missionaries, money, etc. but

what we are as a fellowship was very much hammered out in the heart of Pastor Mitchell and in the heart of Americans. It's been passed on. Tools, principles, pattern, standard, vision, heart, righteousness. This is not a problem normally when we're small or desperate or we need the Americans. The test will come when those people are no longer looking to the Americans - they are looking to you. Are you then still loyal to the fellowship, to the investment, and those who have paid a price for you?

The future of our fellowship is very much resting at this table. Pastor Mitchell's not getting any younger. One day he's going to go into eternity. None of us live forever. I pray practically every day that he may serve God with longness of life, but the reality is, what are you going to do if Pastor Mitchell leaves? Are you just going to piss all over everything that has been sacrificed and labored for, the battles that we fought? Are you just waiting for that day?

What if Jesus tarries - five years from now? Twenty years from now? Some of you have 20, 30, 40 years. What are you

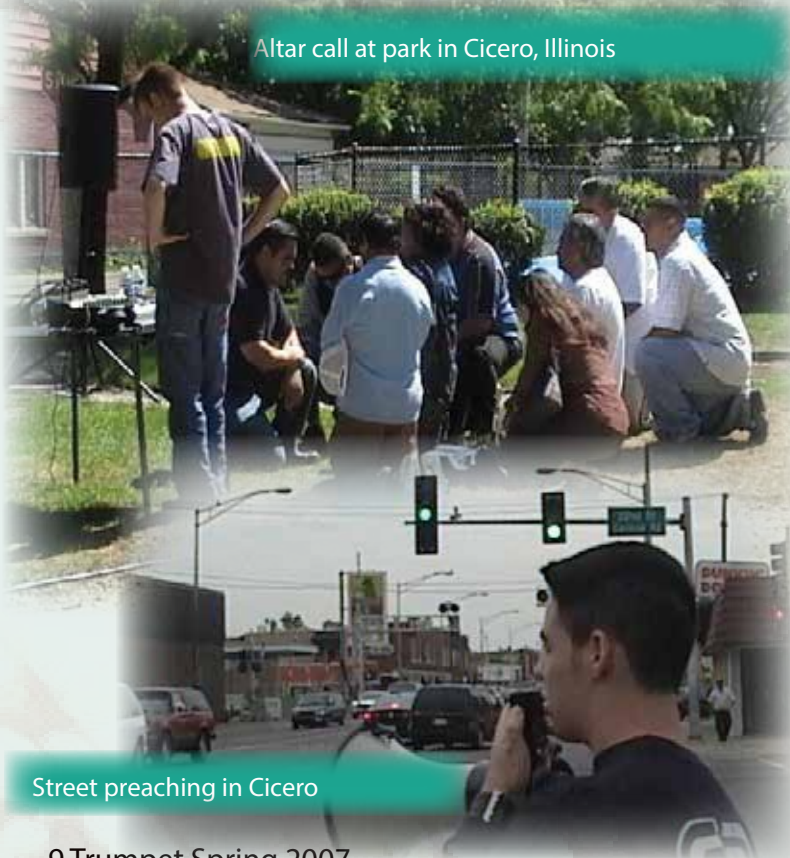

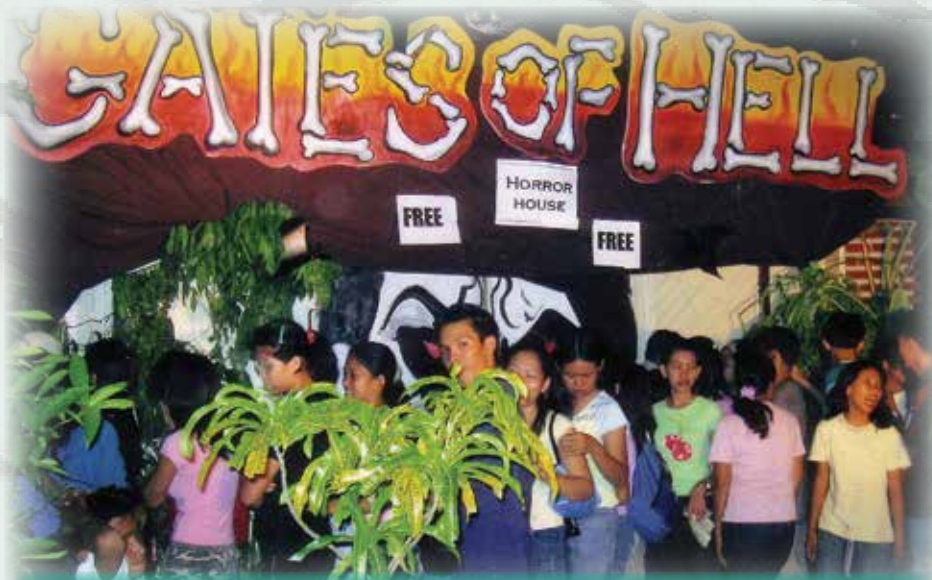

I send you greetings from Port Elizabeth, the capital of the Eastern Cape in South Africa. My wife Judy and I were launched out of the Beechboro (Perth) Australia Conference in 2005 to pioneer a new church in Port Elizabeth.

Prior to this we had been pastoring the Bunbury Church about 2½ hours south of Perth in Western Australia.

We opened in November 2005 in a busy area of the city, Newton Park, with a Healing Crusade. Pastor Joe Zeable preached. This birthed the church and by August 2006 there were 25-plus regulars of mixed race (whites, coloureds and blacks) attending. This is by no means a common thing in South Africa and a real miracle was being established by God in Port Elizabeth.

Another of our Fellowship Churches out of Tucson, Arizona (Pastor Harold Warner) had been operating in the city of Port Elizabeth since 1997 and had grown to 100-plus solid congregation, with the majority being vibrant young Xhosa men and women between 15 and 25 years of age. Pastor Isaac Cortez, his wife Doris and children Daniel, Denise and Victoria, out of San Antonio Texas (Pastor Richard Rubi) had successfully pastored the Church since early 2003, bringing it from a raw bunch of teenage believers to a powerful group of maturing young men and women of God. They're now marrying and seeking God's destiny for their lives in the Harvest!

At the September Conference 2006 in Johannesburg, Pastor Cortez and his family returned to the USA and took up the pastorate of the Church they had pioneered in South Side San Antonio, Texas. During the Conference, Pastor Richard Rubi asked if we would merge the work we had been pioneering in Port Elizabeth with the one that Isaac Cortez had been pastoring. Our response was immediate and positive, and there is now a combined Port Elizabeth Potter's House Christian Fellowship Church functioning with an urgency of vision and purpose in these last days.

In October we saw 120 decisions for

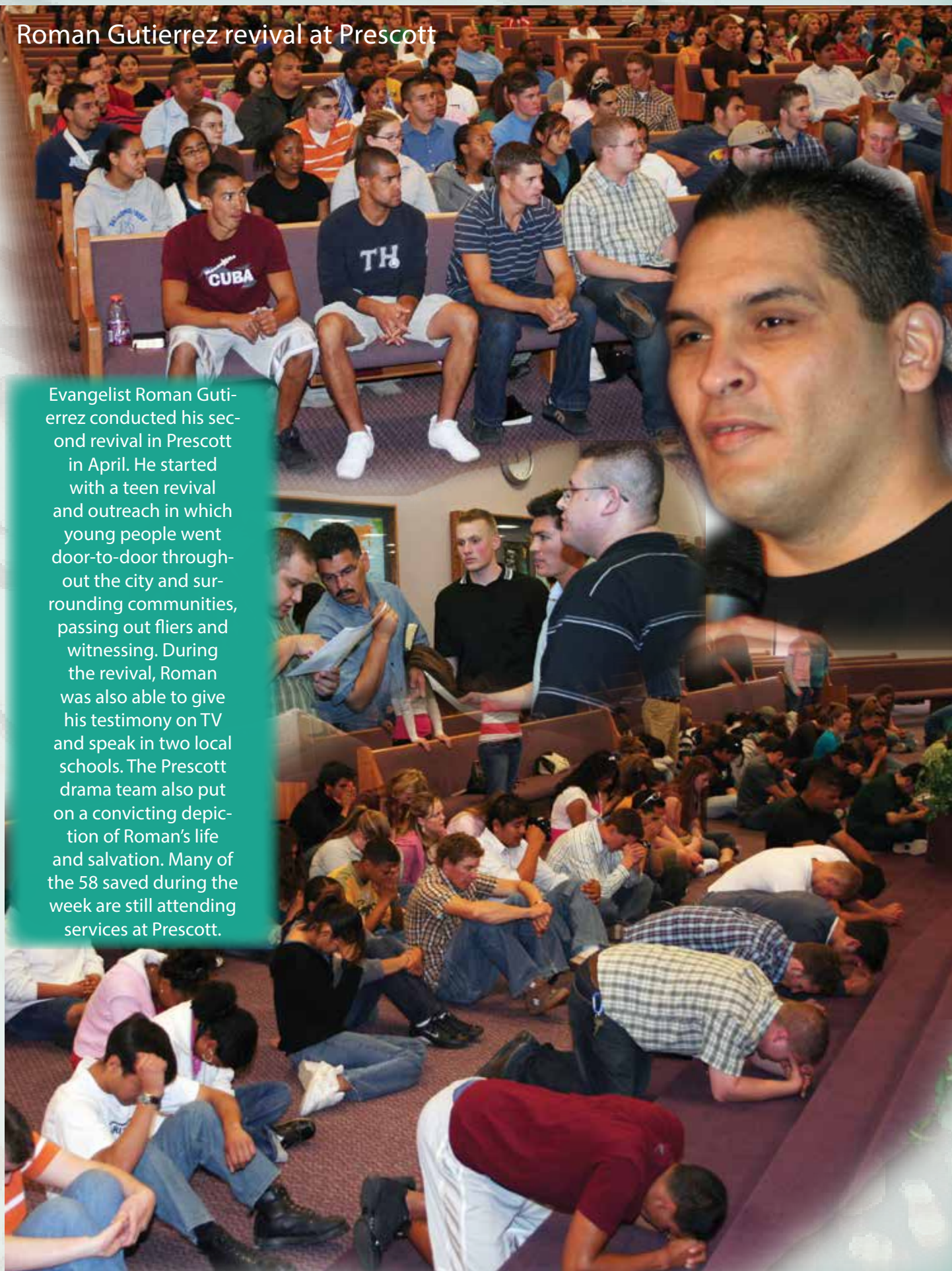
