Greetings from Prescott, Arizona.

Our Monday night outreaches this summer, at our downtown courthouse plaza, have been uplifting. We are seeing an average of six people receive Christ as their Lord and Savior each time.

Due to the summer visitors that frequent the downtown streets we are seeing many new people make decisions for Christ through our outreaches, plays and concerts. Our Saturday Underground concert scenes have been promising as well.

One one of our Saturday morning outreaches one of our ladies from church spoke to a girl who was from the Philippines. She told the woman, "We have churches in the Philippines," and the woman said, "Yes, I know, my mom used to take me to one." God is faithful to follow this girl all the way to Prescott, Arizona.

Our new convert Foundations class is full again with six new converts. Pastor Baretto teaches a Spanish-speaking new convert class which is just as effective. The Spanish-speaking Prescott congregation averages about 100 people, said Spanish Pastor Eddie Barreto. Pastor Barreto took the church when Pastor Ralph and Vicki Blanco went to pastor in Carlsbad, New Mexico. Pastor Barreto said the Mexican people have received him in a very gracious way.

"This was a very awakening thing," he said. "They received me so quickly, and have been so hospitable and friendly. My family is so impressed with that."

At press time the Prescott church is gearing up for one of its biggest outreaches of the year, the God and Country presentation at the downtown Courthouse Plaza. After the 4th of July parade, hundreds of people are milling around downtown, and that's when the church puts on a stirring patriotic pageant, with a clear cut Gospel message.

Prescott Potters House members also put in nearly 300 hours building this year's float for the parade. The parade's theme is "Unspoken Heroes," and the float capitalizes on the theme with a patriotic presentation and the declaration that Jesus is the true unspoken hero. Dennis Keppel preaches a simple salvation message from the float as it travels the parade route. The float had its debut a week earlier at the Prescott Valley Days parade, and many heard the message of Jesus Christ. Parade announcers read a script about each float as it passes, and this year's message from the Potters House is one of support for troops who serve in harm's way, and who rescue the hurt and lost, "as Jesus did when he died on the cross to rescue us from our sins."

Pastor Wayman Mitchell has been involved in many crusades, discipleship classes, crusades and rallies in the past six months.

In late March Pastor Mitchell ministered in the El Paso, Texas conference where new churches in Santiago, Chile and Mexico City, Mexico were announced, along with a US pioneer work and changes of pastors and workers.

In April, Pastor Mitchell travelled to Davao City, Philippines with a team with Pastor Mark and Michele Aulson and a team from the Tempe, Arizona church. Along with the conference, Pastor Mitchell preached a crusade in the middle of Davao City, in which dozens were saved and healed. The conference launched a number of churches, including one into Indonesia, the first overseas work for the Davao church.

Returning home through Manila, Pastor Mitchell preached one night in Mandaluyong, where the congregation of 200-plus people is thriving under the leadership of new Philippines leader and Pastor Boyet Despedia.

A crusade in Glendale, Arizona for Pastor Jeff Rens resulted in a good number of salvations as well as miracle healings. This was followed by rallies in Killeen, Texas; San Jose, California; and a crusade and men's discipleship in Las Vegas, Nevada with Pastor Scott Lamb.

In early May, Pastor Mitchell preached a pioneer rally in Las Vegas and a men's discipleship in Tucson, Arizona. He also preached in Tempe, where under the leadership

of Pastor Mark Aulson, the church has recovered its destiny, launching a record number of churches.

Pioneer rallies in Jacksonville, Florida under Pastor Ron Meyers, were followed by a tent crusade in Las Cruces, New Mexico. The month concluded with Pastor Mitchell meeting in Yaroslavl, Russia with 140 men from Russia, Mongolia, the Ukraine and Sakalin Island for intensive all day seminars and evening rallies with Pastor Tom Payne. Under the leadership of Pastor Sergei Golubev, the Russian men were powerfully impacted by the Holy Spirit.

Pastor Mitchell, along with Pastor Rob Walsh of Sydney, Australia, then travelled to Auckland, New Zealand for an area-wide mini-conference. A wide variety of native islanders of the South Pacific along with New Zealanders had three days of powerful meetings, followed by three miracle services in the Henderson church under Pastor Ron Chisolm.

At presstime, Pastor Mitchell was on his way to Brasov, Romania for their national conference, accompanied by Pastor David Maldonado. The report for this trip will be in the Fall issue of the Trumpet.

Discipline with hope redeems souls; protects church

I'm going to talk about church discipline. The issue has been very much a part of our fellowship from its inception. From the time I got saved in the church in Tucson, discipline was something that was talked about. I remember being somewhat uncertain about when people were put out of the church. But it is the way that we conduct the business of the Kingdom of God, and it is in contrast with the religious world we live in.

In one article that I read entitled "Church Discipline, the Outdated Practice Believers Desperately Need," says that "...the latest research indicates that it is sometimes hard to tell the difference between Christians and the rest of the world. The divorce rate among Christians is just as high as it is among non-Christians. The same can be said for abortions. Some leading evangelicals say the church could be doing much more to reverse the trend. The essential problem is that the body of Christ has all but ignored the Biblical mandate to discipline members of the church for sinful behavior." The author goes on to say, "If we tolerate sin within our own churches, within our congregations, what right do we have to speak about sin in the world?"

He says that the church has become far too consumer oriented, afraid of offending anyone, and it has allowed the American secular ideal of private space to become far too influential in the church. The Bible doesn't give us rights of privacy, he says, in fact, the Bible is very intrusive. The early church lived together, accountable to each other for the way they maintained their marriages, raised their children and lived their personal lifestyle, he said.

So we have a huge conflict raging in the religious world, and there are reasons why I think this discussion is important. When Pastor Mitchell first talked to me about discipline, I remembered Pastor Warner did something recently and it's not a new subject that we're grappling with here. While we're all familiar with the issues of discipline, there are a number of

things that keep coming up, that are worth restating and discussing.

There is a danger in our fellowship of sectarianism, where different branches of our fellowship start embracing different things as fellowship policy. Our fellowship, we all recognize, is one fellowship, that is made up of a number of sub-groups. There is a danger of different standards being established. In America for example when it comes to abortion laws, they differ from state to state. So you'll have one resident from one state fleeing to another state because their laws are more conducive to the person's personal agenda.

What holds us together as a fellowship and what will cause us to survive as a fellowship is embracing certain things across the board and having certain principles and standards in agreement.

The purpose here from a leadership standpoint is that we maintain cohesiveness so that when we go to our respective spheres of influence, what we discuss and decide here can filter down.

We can't have everyone doing their own thing in the name of church discipline based on rumor or whatever. 1st Timothy 5:20 says, "Those who are sinning rebuke in the presence of all that the rest may also fear. I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ and the elect angels that you observe these things without prejudice, doing nothing with partiality. Do not lay hands on anyone hastily nor share in other people's sins. Keep yourself pure."

I want to talk here about the nature of

sin because we have to put discipline in context. There are a lot of reasons, I suppose, why people exercise discipline, but we have to take a spiritual, contextual approach from the Word of God and it has to do with the nature of sin.

Sin has a spiritual component that is

toxic to a congregation. Sin is not just about one individual doing something wrong. It has an influence beyond that particular individual and this is a battle that all of us are aware of and that we fight all the time. Sin is not passive, it is active. I think one of the problems today, even in our fellowship but certainly in the world, is that pastors take a passive approach to their pastoring. Because of the nature of sin, a proactive approach is necessary, because sin is aggressive, it has the ability to spread, to influence, and to undermine the health of a congregation. Therefore, you cannot be passive in how you deal with it. Sin requires a proactive approach that is sometimes very intrusive.

The mentality today that produces some of the things that article talks about is that "...down at The Door, down at the Potters House, you're too judgmental. We're about love here at our church. There may be sin, but we let the Holy Spirit deal with that. Our role is to love and accept them."

Well, imagine taking a passive approach to something like cancer, just saying, "Well, this is nature, we'll just let nature take its course." We know that would

be a death sentence, and we also know that today cancer to some degree can be dealt with, if you take a very aggressive and proactive approach. I think a lot of passive pastors are passing a death sentence on members of their congregation because they are not taking a proactive approach when it comes to sin.

Sin is toxic and it is infectious, this is what the Bible so clearly communicates. This is what caused the Apostle Paul to be on edge when he had a report from another church that there were contentions among them. This would immediately get his back up because there was a toxic component that was emanating from certain individuals.

In Corinthians 5 when Paul is dealing with a moral issue, he says, "Your glorying is not good, do you not know that a little leaven leaveneth the whole lump?"

There are a number of ways that we deal with sin. It's not just in the guys who "discipline," although that is what we are talking about today. There are other ways we deal with sin. We preach on it. Part of the cutting edge of our ministry and one of the things that is distinctive is that from the pulpit, we deal with issues of sin in people's lives. While that is normal to us, it's what we do as a matter of course, it's certainly not what's happening in the religious world.

Joel Osteen made the statement that's now infamous, "Two words you'll never hear in my church, 'sin,' or 'Hell.'" Well, Mr. Osteen is in a sense passing a death sentence because he's taking a passive approach to his pastorate, not investing himself when it's necessary to deal with sin.

We know that having a cutting edge in your preaching that deals with sin clearly and gives people an opportunity to come under conviction, make decisions, and answer altar calls, will go a long way.

Another means of dealing with sin in the church is prayer. A component of every pastor's prayer life has to be focused on this issue. We spend time in prayer, asking God to help us and equip us to deal with sin in the church, whether it's going to be from preaching, or if we need information to come to us, so we have a component of prayer that helps us to deal with this issue.

I think that when we're preaching faithfully the mind of God and we're praying, that the majority of issues get

dealt with. Some serious things are being dealt with that we're not even aware of in people's hearts and minds. We think we know everything that's going on, but we don't. We're preaching on something, people are coming and repenting, things are being dealt with, they're getting healed and making decisions and moving on. So we're avoiding a lot and we're dealing with a lot just in those two forms - in preaching and prayer.

Then there's the third form of dealing with sin - the congregation itself that will serve to fight sin as it emerges. A healthy body produces antibodies. When we get sick with a virus, it triggers a reaction in our body that begins to fight against sick-

church. There is a lot going on out there that the righteous membership of our congregations is calling out and dealing with. So all of those things are out there and working, and should be operative and working.

But what we're talking about here is when sin survives all of the above. Sinful behavior can survive good, strong, healthy preaching, it can survive someone praying, it can survive the correction that may come from the brethren when someone is hiding or covering, when they have an agenda or they are unrepentent. This requires what we characterize as church discipline. It requires a proactive approach that goes beyond the pastor's preaching, or prayer, or depending on the congregation to deal with it. Then the pastor has to sometimes step in and render some kind of a decision, and call the individual to some kind of an account.

If we fail here, there is a congregational judgment that comes. If you read in the book of Revelation the church at Pergamus is generally characterized as the compromising church. The church at Thyatira is characterized as the corrupt church. That being said both of those churches were highly commended. God

said of the Pergamus church, "...you hold fast to my name." The church at Thyatira was commended for their works, love, service, faith, and patience. There were good strong, spiritually driven members of that congregation, but the problem was that there were issues of sin that weren't being dealt with, and that was going to bring a judgment. There was either a passive approach taken or a wilful approach, where we know something is going on, and we're not going to deal with it. You know that this was the curse on Eli's house. It was tolerance, leniency and passivity when it came to known sin. 1 Sam. 3, "For I have told him, that I will judge his house forever for the iniquity which

he knows because his sons made themselves vile and he did not restrain them."

So what does that say about the tone of much of the Christian world today? It's exactly the same. God expected Eli to intrude upon their personal behavior and deal with it, either by judgment or by calling them to repentance in some way. This

helps us to qualify one of our sacred charges and duties - we have to exercise proactive discipline when it's required.

I want to talk about the purpose of discipline. The first is that we have to protect the church. Because of the toxic nature of sin and the capacity for it to spread beyond an individual, church discipline has to be proactive. The idea is to marginalize the influence of the person who is unrepentent and in sin. Sometimes the person has to be removed from the congregation. But we tend to think of discipline only in the context of putting people out of church. There are a lot of other Biblically based methods of discipline that aren't that extreme.

1 Timothy 5:20 says, "Those who are sinning rebuke in the presence of all, that rest also may fear." So you have the effort to protect the church but also that it is public, and I don't mean standing someone up, I don't think that is what this verse refers to, but if someone is under discipline in the church, it's going to be something that is known. This helps to deter others from sinning.

Then, of course, discipline has to be in the context of redemption to the indi-

Commitment ensures that we finish well

One of the most common problems of life is people who do not finish well. In diets, exercise, jobs, relationships and hundreds of other areas people begin well – but down the road they are no longer doing what they started. This is hurtful in natural life, but deadly in the spiritual realm. Jesus speaks of this reality in the parable of the sowers: 3 out of 4 fail to produce in the long-term, and Paul tells of *Demas who has forsaken me*... 2 areas that this becomes crucial are: Staying saved all the way till the end, and continuing to do the work God has called us to. I'm sure every person reading this knows people who are no longer serving God at all, and others who are not serving God like they used to. Why would this be?

1. Some fail to do the work neces-

sary: The emotional rush is nice at times – to be excited or stirred; But a large part of serving God boils down to work: **Luke 13:24** *Strive to enter in at the strait gate...*

Spiritual laziness produces death.

2. Some are not willing to pay the cost involved: This may be the cost of disapproval in our relationships, or the cost of our own plans.

3. Some let people derail them: In

many cases of longevity failure, there is a story of an offense held on to, that sidetracked them.

The end of the life of Joseph is an inspiration to us: He was 17 when God 1st spoke to him, and he was 110 when died - 93 years of serving God! **Gen 50:25** *Then Joseph ... said, "Promise me that you will carry my bones with you out of Egypt."* He was concerned about his testimony – even on His deathbed! We can make it all the way!

Longevity requires ruthless honesty: Are we still doing what it takes to ensure we stay saved? Are we still doing today what God told us in the past, or have we moved away in a different direction? Our decisions have direction and momentum – they take us places, good or bad. Let's make commitments today that will produce longevity.

vidual. This is the spirit that drives all discipline. Discipline is not punishment, it's not a final judgment on a person - "That's it, there's no hope for you, you're going to Hell, get out of here." We discipline with hope - that has to be the driving impetus of all discipline. Galatians 6:1 "Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in the spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted."

So that's an interesting verse because it comes with a little warning, that you'd better help people and discipline with the spirit of redemption because apparently there is some kind of a judgment that can come back on you if you are just out there wanting to punish and judge, you have some kind of personal agenda, your feelings have been hurt, or it's personal, that will come back to bite you. So there's a redemptive element here. 1 Corinthians 5:4-5 "In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, when you are gathered together along with my spirit and the power of the Lord Jesus, deliver such a one to Satan, for the destruction of the flesh that his

spirit may be saved in the day of Jesus Christ."

Here's a two-edged sword. It's a harsh judgment putting somebody out of a congregation but it's a redemptive hope that this person's going to be salvaged. We know by reading 2 Corinthians that they were salvaged and redeemed. The idea there is of trying to destroy something in a person's life so that something else can be saved. If this is not the driving force, if we don't orient ourselves toward redemption when it comes to discipline, discipline will end up being abused. You'll end up kicking people out for any and every reason, you'll take things personally and use it as a means to get rid of dissenters. When you're under attack or dealing with issues in your own life as a pastor, if you don't maintain a right trajectory here, it'll end up getting abused. We all know that failures can be turned to successes no matter how bleak a person's situation may be. We've seen so many cases of glorious and wonderful redemption. Some of the very best people in my congregation today are some of the ones

that have had to suffer through some very serious discipline in their lives.

There are a few practical ways that we handle discipline:

- As pastors we need to honor another man's discipline. If someone shows up in my church from another church and I call that pastor and he says, "That man's under discipline," that's all I need to know. I'm not going to involve myself in the personal details of that story. If someone has a legitimate complaint about how they've been treated or disciplined, we have a way of dealing with that. You can go to an area leader, but it isn't my place to hear someone out who someone else has put under discipline.

The primary reasons for discipline - one of the things we use to determine whether we need to discipline is, is this person's behavior damaging to the flock if we allow this to go unchecked? Certainly moral issues; doctrinal issues in which the person's contrariness is damaging the congregation (II Timothy 2:25-26); and someone who sows division or discord to a destructive level (Romans 16:17-18).

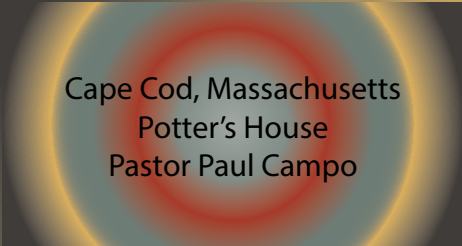
Our new year began with Pastor Aguilar challenging the congregation to believe God

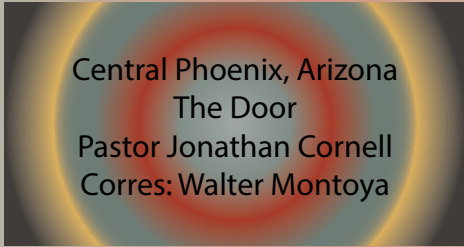
Carlsbad, New Mexico

Greetings from the Door Christian Fellowship Church in Central Phoenix, Arizona.

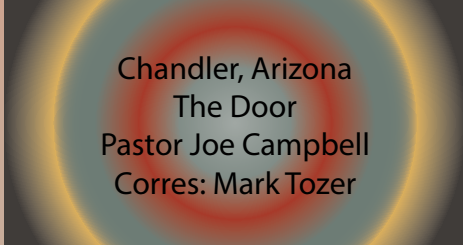
God has been tremendously helping us with our outdoor Evangelism.

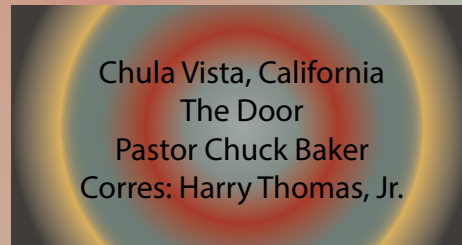
the testimonies of more than 40 people. There is nothing like hearing the testimony of a new believer during a baptism service!

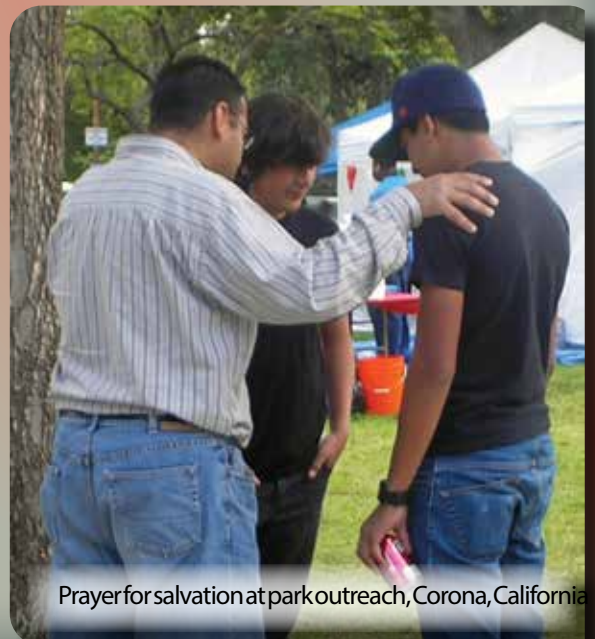

sented our "Resurrection Western," The Tombstone on the Highlands University campus for two nights on Easter weekend with several making decisions for Christ.

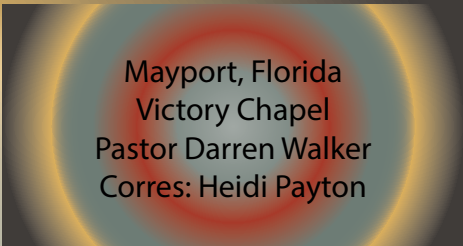

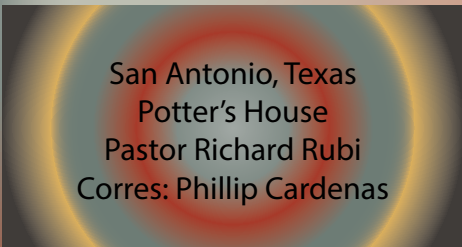
Greetings from the beautiful Wasatch Mountains.

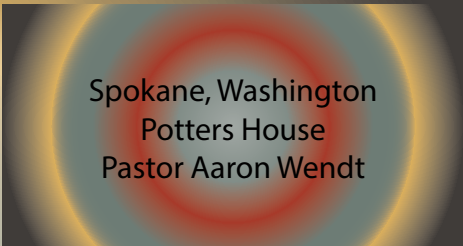

Greetings from the Philippines!

We just had our National Bible Conference from May 7th to the 11th. Our guest speakers were Pastor Greg Mitchell from Prescott and Pastor Glen Cluck from Guam. We truly experienced a powerful move of God, through preachings which were very relevant and timely.

We had an average of more than 700 in attendance in the morning seminars and an average of more than 1,000 in the evening services. New local pastors also emerged and veterans also contributed to the equipping of the body through Spirit-filled preachings..

The Philippine congregation of our fellowship is again gaining ground and spearheading the move of God in the region. A new work has just been planted in the neighboring Indonesia, from our Davao-Mindanao churches.

After the turmoil last year, we are happy to declare that the Philippine congregation is totally restored as it is already mounting in firepower and taking up the challenge of evangelism. We acknowledge the help extended to us from the Prescott congregation through Pastors Wayman Mitchell and Greg Mitchell who came last September 16, 2006, and ensured the restoration of the Philippine churches, by way of giving substantial financial support, as well as by sending Pastor Glen Cluck from Guam to re-establish basic fellowship standards and principles, and also by encouraging other evangelists to do revival meeting for us.

Of significant contribution also were the revival meetings done for us by Evangelists Larry Monteith of Prescott, Arizona and Dave Marks of Canada. Again the benefits and beauty of fellowship were rekindled in our hearts. We never felt as proud again to know that we are a part of a fellowship and a part of a move God is doing in the earth and in this time.

We thank God for what He is doing in our midst here in Nairobi. We have seen lots of things happening since the report we submitted last year. On doing a count of all the souls that got saved here just last year (2006) in crusades, outreaches and within the church, we saw a total of 10,117 souls!

We started this year with strong follow up on the converts that got saved in November and December last year and as a result of this we have seen about 15 to 20 of them lock into the church.

We started a Thursday video outreach this year that has turned to be very fruitful. In one of the outreaches we went with no advertising, music or anything, set up the equipment and started showing the movie and to our amazement we had a crowd of about 450 to 500 people and about 250 of them responded to the altar call. Every time we go out for this outreach scores of people are responding

to salvation.

In February we had a revival with Pastor Taddwa from Uganda. The church was very encouraged and refreshed. In March we had a crusade and revival with Pastor Larry Teshima from Grants, New Mexico. In just the three days of the crusade we counted about 950 people responding to salvation and about 30 of them were healed. One woman who had a stomach problem for eight years came for prayer and at the end she was instantly healed of her infirmity. One young man who had lost vision in one eye for three years also came forward for prayer and after the prayer he opened his eye and vision was totally restored. Pastor Teshima was so thrilled and said to me, "Before you even ask them whether they are healed you can know by the wide smile on their faces!"

Pastors Alvin Smith from Tucson and Desmond Bell from D.R.C. Congo have passed by for one-day revivals that were very fruitful, timely and encouraging to the congregation here.

We had our annual Easter drama for three days in April during the Easter weekend. We performed our Kenyan version of "The Final Exit." We would go out for processions bring the people to church and stage the drama to them. Crowds kept increasing by the day. There was such a powerful conviction of God. By Sunday in the final show, we had about 750 people in the church! All in all we counted about 350 people responding to salvation in just the three days. We are now focusing on our August conference and hope to send out a pioneer work.

In March our church was able to send a revival to Guaynabo, Puerto Rico. Pastor Angel Ortiz has a dynamic core of young converts who responded to every challenge, and brought to church uncles and aunts and brothers and even a few M.I.A.s!

In April, Pastor Anthony Trujillo brought revival to Panama and ministered to visitors and congregation alike, as he stirred up our vision for the lost and reminded us of our real purpose in Christ. Throughout the revival we saw people saved and healed and saw people powerfully dealt with by the Holy Spirit.

In May, Pastor Mario Sanchez brought an impact team from Mammoth, Arizona. Each day we hit the streets and outreached bus stations and shopping centers and back alleys. During services we saw many miracles, including addicts praying for salvation, five young adults dramatically baptized in the Holy Spirit, and several notable healings. All week long the team ministered tirelessly, witnessing and singing and preaching and testifying. In our

services we had people from Colombia, Peru, Ecuador, Mexico, the U.S., and of course Panama!

The day after the revival, we piled into five cars, drove an hour and a half from the city, and baptized nine believers in the Pacific Ocean!

We thank God for our sister churches, who have impacted this country hand-in-hand with our congregation, and for our mother church, the Las Vegas Christian Center and Pastor Ray Rubi, who, all the way from the hills of Northern New Mexico, are

changing lives in Southcentral America and the Caribbean (who would have thought it possible?).

Kaselehlle! We bring you good report from the island of Pohnpei.

Glory to God, for everything we've witnessed for the past eight months. God has given us favor in this place. We were launched out from Guam on June of 2006. Three days after we arrived, we held our first service in our living room with four people. The next service we had 16 people in attendance. For the third service, we rented a conference room and had 21 people come out!

That first month, I met several individuals who've already heard about our church and the miracles God performed in Guam and in Chuuk. I even had several visits and calls from people who heard from a friend or relatives, asking to be prayed for. One elderly gentleman came to my home and asked to be prayed for, for back pain from surgery years ago. God healed him. Because of that, I received a call from another man inviting me to their village to pray for their family. When we went there, we saw 45 people come out, 35 salvations, and 18 healings!

In January we had the opportunity to go into the high school dormitory and show a movie. About 70 students came out, and 50 of them responded to the call for repentance. On February we were able to preach at a community fundraising event and saw a number of people saved.

In March, we did a two-night miracle crusade in one of the villages here. We saw 200 people the first night and 170 people the second night come out. The result was 55 salvations, and 19 responding to the call for healing. One notable healing from this crusade was an elderly woman who has been hunched over for years. She was instantly healed and her back made straight. We're still getting many visitors from these two major outreaches. Right now we're averaging 50-60 people in attendance. Praise God!

We count it a great honor and a privilege to be in this fellowship. We appreciate all your prayers and your investments for Micronesia.

We have just completed our 5th revival since coming here, with Pastor Pieter Visser from Scarborough, West Australia. 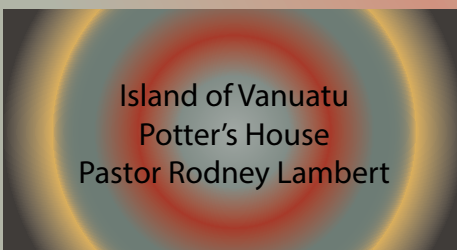

Jail ministry gives hope to the hopeless, young and old

Praise God for the doors He has opened into the jails and prisons throughout the U.S. and also in foreign countries. From here in Prescott Arizona, He has enabled me to go and minister in these places, to bring hope through Jesus Christ into places where hope is not on the menu.

For the past nine years I have been privileged to go to the Adobe Mountain School, a correctional facility in Phoenix to conduct a weekly Bible study. The majority of the boys we meet in there

are members of street gangs and have been involved in some pretty outrageous things. I have seen some dramatic life-style changes through Jesus touching them and changing their hearts.

I was able to go to several prisons in Peru and Brazil in the last few years and these are places where hope is almost nonexistent. Human rights abuses are the rule in those prisons. The inmates are very receptive to the Gospel and there are local follow-up teams to be there for them. Thank

Testimony

God saves couple in Prescott's early days; sees them through two battles with cancer

Denny and Jane Halverson know what it's like to face adversity, and they know firsthand that God is big enough to see them through. Today, they're able to encourage others who face the same mountains.

Jane was raised Catholic, and while her parents required that she attend church, by third grade, she said, she had stopped believing in the ritual. "I still believed in God, but I had no concept what that meant or how to reach Him. There were times when I was growing up that I felt I wanted to please God, but I had no clue how to do it."

She was attending high school in Prescott in the early 70s when revival broke out on the heels of the Jesus People movement in the US.

"It kind of started up in other churches, but they rejected the whole hippy thing, which is how Pastor Mitchell ended up with them. I was 15 when I really got a clear presentation of the Gospel. I wanted to get saved, but I knew I'd have to fight with my parents, and make a stand with my friends, and I was never that kind of person."

That presentation was during a Billy Graham film at the local theatre, and Jane said it continued to pull at her for years.

"You try to run away, but in Prescott at that time, you couldn't go to the courthouse plaza without someone coming and witnessing to you. At every job I got, Christians witnessed to me. I would pull out excuses, but in the meantime I was collecting every Gospel tract I got. By the time I got saved at 21, I think I had a complete collection of Chick tracts!"

Jane said she knew the Gospel of Jesus Christ was real, but she kept destroying her life.

"By the time I was 21, I was an alcoholic, and I was shacking up with an idiot. Finally, I said, 'this is stupid, I know what's right.'"

In September 1975, she gave her life

to Jesus at a park outreach in downtown Prescott. He radically changed her in that moment.

"I felt like the weight of the world lifted off my shoulders. The great thing was that I went home and threw away hundreds of dollars worth of booze. I was into mixed drinks, and that was expensive. I started going to church immediately, and said, 'You mean you only have church three times a week? What do we do on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday?'"

Jane married the man she was living with, but he didn't live for God. He left

her pregnant with a son, but even then, God did not desert her. "The testimony of the whole thing is that God sent a good man my way, a man who would love us both."

Denny Halverson grew up in the Midwest, the son of devout Lutherans. "My father was on the church council, and an usher. We went to church regularly and I did it all – Luther League, choir, catechism, vacation Bible school, all under duress. I never saw an altar call, never had the opportunity to get saved or say the sinner's prayer. But I knew the Bible stories

and there was that natural conviction," he said.

God stayed on his trail. "Out of the blue people would stop and witness to me. I remember Campus Crusade for Christ in college. I was enough of a pseudo intellectual to invite them in for an argument, which I never won. I was smitten, but too proud to submit," he said.

In 1974, Denny came to Prescott. "Within hours that first day I was being witnessed to in the concert ministry under Charlie's meat market (Charlie and Marcia Foster run the tape ministry in Prescott).

He got a job at Yellow Front, a family clothing/sporting goods store in Prescott. "Who was working at Yellow Front? Mark Aulson, who never let me alone for almost two years."

Denny remembers taunting Mark unmercifully about his Christianity. "We would make him so angry at work that he would go in the bathroom and pray in tongues. We would pound on the door and imitate his tongues."

One day, Denny observed a man and woman stealing from the store. The next week, they were back witnessing to him. They had gotten saved. From that one place of employment, many were saved, including Dave and Polly Burke and Mike and Sue Rush, who still serve God in Prescott today. "There was a continual stream of witnesses like that," he said.

He was transferred to Cottonwood, but somehow knew he'd return. "I knew I would get saved. It was just a matter of how long I could hold out. Mark Aulson asked me one time, 'Don't you ever get lonely?' I said no, but I was desperately lonely.

Finally, in 1977, Denny moved back to Prescott, and surrendered to Jesus. His life changed immediately, and as people in the congregation reached out, the loneliness also left. "One of the things I never forgot was Bob and Sue Mammen inviting me over for dinner. I sat on the floor playing with their kids. It was the first time in 10 years I was in a family setting, and it was so refreshing. It's one of the things I remember – being invited into families."

Denny had met Jane in church, and had watched her struggle through the pain of her husband leaving. The two married, but they didn't know that the toughest times of their lives were about to come.

"I got pregnant with Matthan, and he

was born in 1984. After he was born, I found out I had cancer," Jane said. "Here I was with a five-year-old and a new baby."

The diagnosis began a 22-year battle with Hodgkins Disease, during which the Halversons learned to lean on God, and to accept the help and support of their brothers and sisters in Christ.

During the first battle with cancer, Jane underwent radiation treatment five days each week in Phoenix. A longtime sister in the Prescott church, Sidney Zynda, was living in Phoenix at the time, and Jane and baby Matthan stayed at her house, while Denny coped at home with his work, and son Jonathan.

The treatment took a year. Sometimes Jane would be hospitalized for a month at a time with pneumonia or other complications, at which time Denny would have both children at home.

"That's when the people of God were a big blessing," Denny said. It was during this time, Denny said, when he felt he was drawing on a bank of faithfulness in prayer and tithing. "My life was in turmoil. I was going to church, I was believing God that there was a bankroll in Heaven from years of tithes and prayer. I needed to draw on this," he said.

Jane also had to learn to lean on God. "At the very beginning when I was diagnosed, I felt like God told me I was not going to die from it. I had a peace about it. Matthan was a miracle baby, and I felt, 'Why would God give me this miracle baby just to kill me?' I hung on to the safety bar, and said, 'We're going to make it through the ride.'"

Both agreed that they would put their hope in God. "I said, 'I can have a sick wife and be a single parent with God, or without.' It was a no brainer. 'I'm going to put my hope in God.' Then you go day-by-day," Denny said.

Jane recovered, but 10 years later, in 1995, she began to have symptoms again. This time, she had to have chemotherapy, and spent weeks in Flagstaff, Arizona for treatment. At one point, doctors collapsed her lung in an effort to do a biopsy. She spent a week in intensive care, and distinctly remembers being near death.

"I remember looking down into the room, and seeing myself on the table with all the doctors around me," she said.

Denny said he got a call from the hospital telling him to get there right away.

Twice, Denny said, doctors took him aside and tried to help him prepare for the worst.

One of the biggest battles occurred when Jane was back in the hospital for more chemo. "I started feeling demons gathering. I couldn't see them, but I knew they were there. A spiritual battle was going to be fought in my hospital room, and I knew I couldn't fight it. Somehow, I got Denny on the phone, and said, 'You need to come.' The next thing I remember is coming around and him telling me he'd been there for three days, praying."

Denny has never forgotten those three days. "I put my Bible on the bed, and wrote down every healing scripture in the Bible. That's what I prayed for three days," he said. He still has that paper in his Bible.

Today, Jane and Denny reach out to those who fight the same battles.

"Before this," Denny said, "I didn't know how to ask or receive help. Betty Bronson would come in to do my laundry and I would hide it. The women would want to clean our house, but I was too proud. Through the whole thing I was reduced to, 'You can't do this (alone).' In that you also learn how to help. When people go through this now, Jane and I are able to help."

"I still have battles, the chemo left some damage. But since my name has been on the prayer list, that is better. We work and we wonder why. Frankly, I totally believe that at the first sign of cancer God could have healed it just like that. He didn't, but I have to say I'm a better person. Twenty-five years ago my empathy level was very low. I had no clue."

Recently, Marcia Foster fought her own year-long battle with cancer. Jane's encouragement meant a lot to her. "It's something no one can really understand unless they've gone through it. She just encouraged me, that I could come through it."

So God has faithfully kept the Halversons— from the days He pursued them in witness after witness, through the sicknesses, the financial difficulties, and the spiritual battles. Today, the thankful couple has moved into a new home in Prescott Valley, and Denny runs a successful custom cabinetry business.

Jane sums it all up in a few words: "And so we made it through."

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
