‘People ethics’ will preserve fellowship

I have a son-in-law who works for an electronics retail outlet. He’s in management there, and one of his jobs is to go to the competition and spy out the staff. If he can snag a manager and that person is hired, he gets a bonus. This is very common in the capitalistic culture that we live in, everybody’s fair game.

I had made friends with one restaurant manager a few years ago. Another new restaurant was opening near my church. I started going there and this manager showed up there. I asked him what was happening, and he said, “Well, they came and talked to me and watched how I performed at the other place. I guess they liked me and they made me an offer I couldn’t refuse.”

However, what may be acceptable in the business world is certainly something that can be very destructive in the realm of the church. One of the greatest sources of skirmishing among pastors, and I can say this with some small amount of experience, has to do with issues regarding people.

My first taste of this was when I was Door director in Tucson back in the late 70s, and a man in our fellowship had came to town to pioneer. Pastor Harold Warner had told him that if anyone goes to his church that had been saved and baptized at the Door, Harold Warner’s church, that he was to send them back. The man agreed, but then he talked to me later and he was very upset about that. He said, “I’m not here to mop up after Pastor Warner’s backsliders.” So it was his idea that if they were not currently attending the Door, they were fair game. Shortly after that, all the Rubi’s got saved, and they lived a couple blocks from where he was pioneering. I think they went to a few events at his church, and I think he had gotten the message. One time they walked in the door and he said, “Look, you guys gotta get out of here, you can’t be here anymore. Go back to the Door, that’s where you belong.”

All of us have our stories about our own skirmishes that we’ve been involved

in with other pastors taking on people out of our churches, etc. It’s easy for us to see that if we don’t install ethics when it comes to people, there’s going to be

a breakdown of fellowship. I think it’s safe to say that without the ethics that we uniquely practice in our fellowship that we would not be the fellowship we are today. On the other side of the coin, because of those ethics and how we have agreed to conduct ourselves when it comes to people, we have relatively few incidents. Some of them can be very loud, the few that we have, and can seem to dominate the landscape. They are important matters.

We’ll restate the obvious here, and perhaps add a few new angles that will give us some perspective because it’s important for these things to be on the table - they’re not going to go away. Our younger pastors that are coming up and getting sent out often end up in the skirmishing that I’m referring to, because they haven’t gotten their bearings yet as far as ethics and people.

I want to read a verse from Philemon. It gives us some guidelines and some help when it comes to this area. Let’s begin reading in verse 10. Paul is writing to Philemon and he says, “I appeal to you for my son Onesimus whom I have begotten while in my chains. Who once was unprofitable to you but now is profitable to you and to me. I am sending him back. You therefore receive him, that is my own heart whom I wish to keep with me that on your behalf he might minister to me in my chains for the gospel but without your consent I wanted to do nothing, that your

good deed might not be by compulsion as it were, but voluntary. For perhaps he departed for awhile for this purpose that you might receive him forever, no longer as a slave, but more than a slave a beloved brother especially to me but how much more to you both in the flesh and in the Lord. If then you count me as a partner, receive him as you would me, but if he has wronged you, or owes anything, put that on my account, I Paul am writing with my own hand, I will repay not to mention to you that you owe me even your own self beside.”

I want to talk about the historical reference. Whenever I think through an issue like this I like to go back to the origins of our fellowship, to some of the things that maybe Pastor Mitchell started wrestling with installing in the early stages of our fellowship. I think it’s always important to resurrect those insights and reasonings because it does give us a context for what we do today. One of the things as we all know that is unique in our fellowship is that we do recognize a very real need when it comes to people that there needs to be some ethical principles and guidelines that we adhere to.

One of the great shockers for a lot of new pastors when they go out is that they recognize that in the church world there are no ethics when it comes to people. This creates no end of chaos in the denominational and church world and I think a lot of division, a lot of church splits, a lot of pastors falling out of relationship with their peers has to do with the fact that there is no grasp of ethics when it comes to people.

One example of this is, we’ve disciplined somebody in our church for moral failure, we’ve put them out, and two weeks later they’re at another church on the platform, teaching a Sunday School or functioning and it spins our heads. We say, “Wait a minute, why didn’t you call me?” Well, they didn’t call you because they don’t have any ethics and they’re not really interested in anything that you might have to say, this person has obvi-

ously been hurt and wounded, and so they are taken on board and there is no inquiry, they take the individual at their word. Obviously we view that as unethical. On the other hand you can turn that situation around and you would be very wise, when somebody comes to your church that has a bad experience story from the church that they were attending that you not just allow them to draw you into that. You may take them into your church, but you should keep an eye out before you mount them on the platform.

Another understanding is that it didn't take very long in our church planting history for problems to erupt when we have multiple churches in the same city. Over the years we have come to some conclusions that there are certain things that members of our churches or people that we are working with cannot do. There are certain things that if we are going to uphold ethics that a pastor cannot do, for example, when it comes to somebody else's people. We view this as an integral part of how we operate as a fellowship.

Let's look at our text here. Paul says, "I'm sending him back, whom I wish to keep with me." I wanted to keep him in my church. He's functioning. He's got ability.

There are three things here that I think are relevant to our discussion. The first is that Paul viewed Onesimus as being an advantage to himself. And the problem is that most people stop right here. We stop at the doorpost of, "this is an advantage to me," and we're not looking at a big picture, or background or any other factor. This is so true, we've all had the experience of having people march into our church, and they look great with their family and children, especially when you're pioneering. They have something to offer, they may know the "ropes," they may have some function in our fellowship. They may have ability and talent, and they are people, and they are there, and they want to tithe, etc. so we say, "These people could really help me."

Certainly in the religious world this is where the consideration ends. There is no concern for where this person has come from, what their history or relationship is with the former church, and in most circles today they wouldn't even care about that. If a person came with a horror story it would be believed and accepted and the present advantage is what dominates the landscape. Therefore a lot of pas-

tors make the mistake that they will take anyone on board no questions asked and no accountability or they will allow that person to draw them into their conflict or rebellion or whatever that may be from their former experience.

Paul viewed Onesimus as an advantage to himself, but he lived within the boundaries of ethics, and this determined his course. Paul would not allow the advantage he was gaining by Onesimus's presence to supersede the ethical issues involved. Most pastors today don't make that bridge. Paul was in prison, he was emotionally and spiritually suffering, Onesimus was a great blessing to him. But Paul's position was that this was a circumstance that needed to be reconciled. Think again how hard this must have been for Paul. Philemon may never have found out about it, or Paul might have said his need superseded the ethical problem. This involved a long journey and a lot of time, but today, pastors won't even pick up a telephone and find out, let alone what Paul is setting in motion here, which was probably a long-term, many months process.

The third thing that I see here in this text is that it mattered to Paul that he and Philemon were in agreement. He could have legislated, or made a decree. He is Philemon's spiritual father, and Philemon may have gone along but here is the key to all this. Paul was afraid that Philemon would go along grudgingly because the offence of Onesimus against Philemon was egregious enough that Philemon was genuinely hurt and wounded. Paul's embracing of Onesimus would be a source of jeopardizing his relationship with Philemon. For the sake of having this individual Onesimus minister to him, Paul was not willing to take the risk of sacrificing relationship with Philemon. And so, "I'm sending him back."

How many times, even in our fellowship, have pastors made the mistake of taking someone on board but not taking in to consideration the violation that's involved or the possibility that there may be an issue here. You'd better investigate and you'd better find out, because what's more important -we believe in preserving, providing cities of refuge for people, rescuing and salvaging people, but I think that it is a problem that pastors don't take into consideration relationship with their peers and they don't look down the road. Paul is basically saying, "I am

not going to force this issue. Before there is any freedom for this man to minister to me he's going to have to take care of this situation, reconcile it, and I'm going to have to be in agreement with Philemon about him." He asks the question in the text, "If he has wronged you, or owes you anything..." well, both of those were true. Onesimus had wronged him and he did owe him. He was a runaway slave and he burned Philemon somehow. It's kind of like the question that Zaccheus stated when he said, "If I have wronged any man." Well, you're not asking the question if you haven't. So Paul knew this had to be dealt with and it had to be reconciled.

That gives us a basis from which we can approach the issues that we have to face in our fellowship. It's not a perfect template for every situation, but at least it gives us a starting point for how we are going to approach various issues that involve people, which are the ethical principles, the relationship with our peers, etc.

There also on top of this is a very fundamental truth that is part of the historical component. We believe as a fellowship, and this was installed very early on. Pastor Mitchell was dealing with rogue hippies who wanted to get saved and then hit the road and hitchhike and carry on, so he began to preach that God has a place for every believer, that God's will for your life has an address. The religious world has obviously dismissed this element. There is no sense of location when it comes to the will of God. We live in a mobile society, and I think the average time of a Christian attending a church is 2 1/2 years. The idea of life-long membership in the same congregation is pretty much unheard of today in Christian circles. Much of the doctrine we have concerning this comes from 1st Kings, when there was famine in the land and God spoke to His prophet and said, "It shall be that you shall drink from the brook and I've commanded the ravens to feed you there." That there was a geographic, physical location that related to God furnishing that prophet's need in his life. I remember Pastor Mitchell preaching about faith, and he was referring to Abraham, that real faith working in your life will always fix you to a location. And that location is going to be fraught with

Attitude toward time dictates impact of our lives

It seems incredible that another year has passed. It was a short year ago some of you were reading *The Trumpet*, perhaps just coming out of January conference, full of inspiration and resolve for all the things you were going to do in the year ahead. And did you? Are you now filled with regrets of wasted time, missed opportunities and lost focus?

A simple difference between success and failure, impact or uselessness is our attitude towards time. Often those who are the most effective are those who are conscious of the nature and value of time: It is rapidly passing, and it can be traded or used to accomplish things of value. They therefore make deliberate choices to see that their use of time accomplishes the things God intends, and does not simply become

“lost.”

Eph 5:15-16 *See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, 16 Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.*

Paul says that a mark of foolishness is the careless attitude towards time, and a sloppy use of time. A wise person walks carefully or deliberately in order to ensure that they make the most of dwindling opportunities to accomplish God's will in life.

Adoniram Judson wrote, “A life once spent is irrevocable. It will remain to be contemplated through eternity. The same may be said of each day. When it is once past, it is gone forever. All the marks which we put upon it, it will exhibit forever. Each day will not only be a witness of our conduct, but will affect our everlasting destiny. How shall we then wish to see each day marked with usefulness? It is too late to mend the days that are past. The future is in our power. Let us, then, each morning, resolve to send the day into eternity in such a garb as we shall wish it to wear forever. And at night let us reflect that one more day is irrevocably gone, indelibly marked.”

I pray that we will be people of wisdom and mark the upcoming year with wise decisions that bring usefulness.

challenges and difficulties, and it's going to be hard a lot of times to remain in that place. But that's one of the foundational truths that we embrace, that there is something sacred about location that needs to be guarded, and part of the culture of your congregation.

We can't always hold people in place, but there is a dimension of ethics and righteousness that helps us as pastors and helps the individuals that we are working with to determine where they should be. At least for now, the Apostle Paul is saying to Onesimus, “You don't belong here, and so I'm sending you back.”

I want to talk about some of the absolutes that we adhere to. This provides some of the framework and the structure that will solve 95% of our problems. These are the absolutes that we have to teach our young pastors. There are five basics. The first one is that we don't accept people from other churches without question. You have to find out what's going on. It's up to us as pastors to ascertain whether a person is a “refugee” or a “fugitive.” This is one of those absolutes

that will maintain the goodwill among our pastors.

The second absolute is that you don't counsel people from other churches. Evangelists don't counsel people. You don't accept phone calls of disgruntled members of other congregations.

Third, we don't allow people who are under discipline to shift churches within our fellowship. That's obvious, but it's happened.

Fourth, we need to adhere to the structure for reconciliation. Pastor Mitchell gave a perfect example of that. Somebody shows up at his doorstep or the church's doorstep and wants an immediate hearing and so he knew to throw back at this individual the structure that we have for reconciliation, that you have to make people go through the process no matter what their story is. When your brother sins against you go to him and him alone. Have you done that? If that fails you can get a larger hearing with church council, etc. Our adherence to the structure will resolve a lot of problems.

Finally, if you do receive someone

from another congregation, in some cases, especially if there have been problems or a conflict, there should be an appearance before the church council to introduce this couple. There should be no immediate promotion into ministry and absolutely no badmouthing of the former pastor or situation, and no drawing of the congregation into the situation.

There is also the issue of marriage. Ever since I can remember in the fellowship, when a disciple marries a woman from another church, they attend the church where the man is, because we have always tilted toward the discipleship of the man, and there have been a number of recent situations where I've seen this still playing out, and I wouldn't want to see this loosened up. It's one of those things that if we don't recommit ourselves to this we'll have problems. “I don't like giving up good sisters in my church to another,” so you have all kinds of problems that can erupt if we don't have that basic understanding. There are exceptions no doubt, but that's how we function as a fellowship.

We also did an expanded version of this in a couple's front yard as a "block party" that saw several decisions for Christ. There is nothing greater than seeing people respond to an altar call in the open air after a simple Gospel presentation!

In addition to these, we have been helping our baby church in Springfield and our sister churches in the area with out of town outreaches. 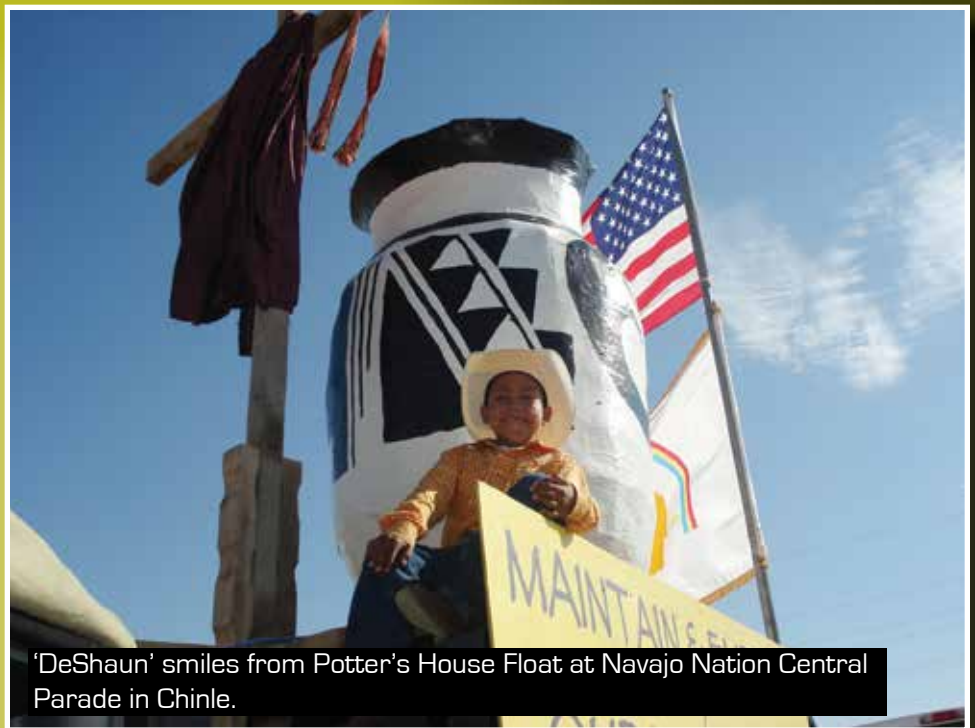

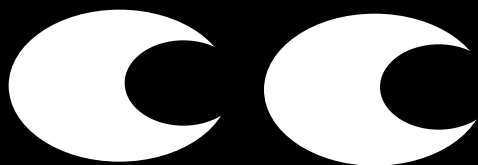

for salvation. We just started our Home Bible study and we are excited about all that God is doing.

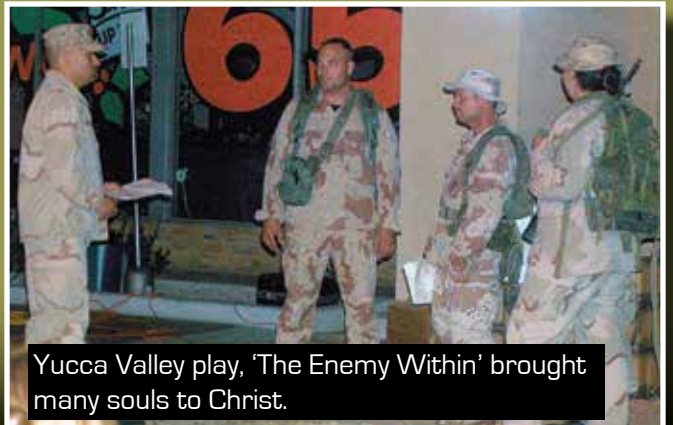

Upon hearing the name "The Door," he realized this was the place God was leading him to. God is using his changed life as well as his brother to bring many of their relatives to church.

In November, several Spanish services were organized in our churches in Zwolle and Rotterdam, where we took several of our people. Their nationalities range from Chilli to Honduras and Peru to Curaçao. It is a blessing for them to hear the gospel

preached in their own language and their enthusiasm is visibly growing.

This month we also celebrate the weddings of two of our disciples who thought it was time to add some more people to the church and steal a girl from Zwolle. Another reason for enthusiasm!

We look forward to hosting pastor Mitchell in the annual Dutch tent crusade prior to the summer conference. Previous years in Utrecht, Leeuwarden and Den Haag were a great success, and we pray that God will use this event as a platform to do great miracles in our city as well.

Please pray that God will continue to bless our congregation with new fruit and to let them grow strong, as we pray for you.

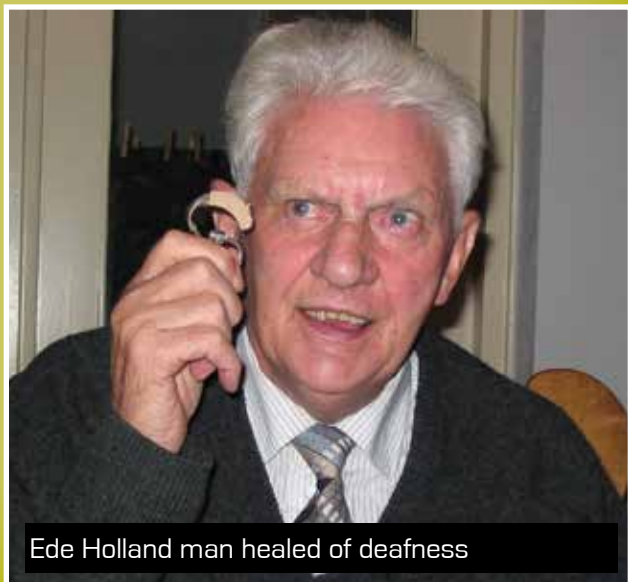

These last months God brings in visitors almost every service. New people are locked into church. Recently our teenagers formed a rap group called 'The Next Generation.' They have a desire to reach out to other teenagers who do not know Christ. Also more and more children are coming to the Sunday-school and Children-church. Greetings from Guangzhou, China.

It has been four years since my wife and I were launched out from the Door church Holland, Europe into mainland China.

It was the beginning of a very exciting time.

During the national holidays in 2004, we went for the first time to a place in the mountains for fellowship and preaching and baptisms. During

these meetings one girl gave her life to Jesus Christ and she preached the gospel to all her friends and relatives in her city.

So many people got saved in her hometown that a new church was born. And so we opened a baby church in Dongguan.

We were especially depending on friendship evangelizing, because Communist China does not allow any Christian activities. All kind of printed matters are still prohibited for import, and we are not allowed to evangelize or to do anything in public.

But despite these obstacles that hinder us, God opened an amazing door.

Since the beginning of the year 2006 we can enter the universities freely and we are able to evangelize, although we need to be watchful for the authorities.

Since October 2005 we organized our first rally together with the Macau church, Dongguan church and Guangzhou church.

We just moved into our new building in July 2006 but as expected this didn't happen without resistance. The building owner's reluctance to lease the building to us at an affordable price and for a longer than normal term dashed our hopes to have our first service in January. But as the congregation began to lay hold of our Almighty God, He came through by changing the heart of the owner who agreed wholeheartedly to our terms. This sur-

prised even his estate agent who had been working for him for more than 20 years. We thank God for Pastor Campbell and the Chandler congregation for both their prayers and financial assistance.

Since moving, the church has grown through outreaches as well as walk-in salvations. God has truly put an excitement and burden for the lost in the hearts of our people. Outreaches are bearing precious fruit as the faithful take to the streets as well as homes and institutions.

Tuesday night's outreach is to a mental health home. The outreach, in the form of a service with praise, worship and preaching is miraculously breaking bondages and to date we have about eight souls attending regular Sunday services. We just concluded a water baptism and fellowship dinner where seven souls were baptized. We are also seeing precious souls being birth into the Kingdom in our churches in Bangsar and Setapak as the pastor's and their congregations there labor unceasingly to win souls to Jesus.

I'm having business meetings with disciples every Sunday morning at 8 a.m. regularly. Young people from the church are raising themselves to outreach the city seriously.

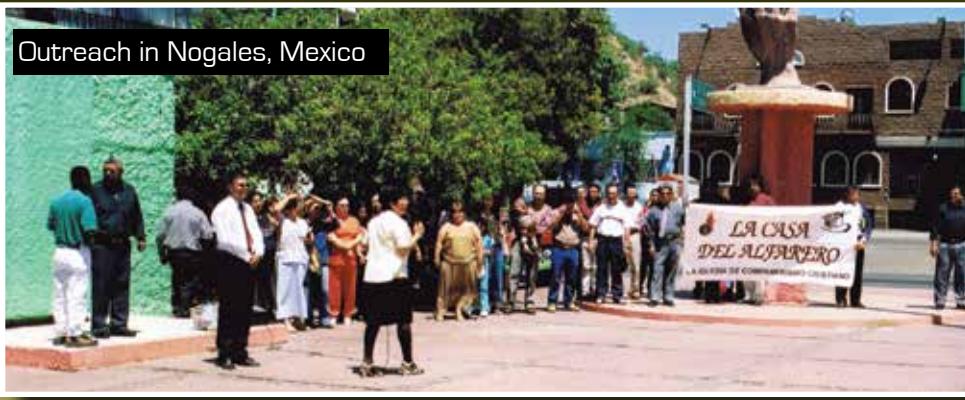
God has opened up doors in a local newspaper where I have the opportunity to write two articles a month, where I'm taking advantage to write on any topic, whatever I want.

God is moving in a powerful way and expanding His Kingdom here in Russia. We have been very busy preaching, outreaching, witnessing, and engaging into all sorts of battles to see people saved and locked into the congregation, as we always did before. But for the past few months we believe the Hand of the Lord and the heat of the battle are bringing us to a powerful breakthrough not only here in Vologda but all throughout Russia.

After the fireball Men's Rally with Pastor Mitchell and Pastor Harold Warner that we had in May and after all our summer labours we had a fantastic Summer Bible Conference in August. A number of souls were saved each night and we have some of them still coming to the church, growing and establishing in faith.

sinusitis. And the most remarkable healing was a man with a brain tumor who had been scheduled for an operation to remove it and yet had hardly any hope for survival. He was brought from another city right from the hospital two days before the operation and was prayed for. Next day had an x-ray of his head in Vologda and the doctor was shocked. He wrote a prescription cancelling the operation, saying that it was obviously a non-cancerous growth that required no surgery. So the man was gloriously healed and the name of the Lord was highly exalted that night.

Continue to pray for us here in Russia and for the other 18 of our churches as we continue to press the battle to the gates.

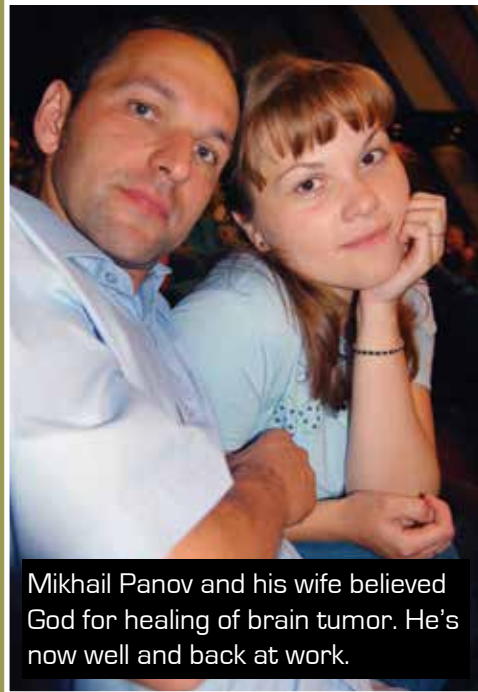
Man escapes hospital to get prayer, is healed of brain tumor

Hello. My name is Mikhail Panov, I work as an electrician. One day I received an order to replace an old electric meter in an apartment. When I entered in I immediately felt the presence of the darkness. With my spiritual eyesight I saw a demon holding a spear. That moment I felt that the spear fell upon my mind and it was like a big mirror shattered into many splinters that I could not put together. I understood it was an assault against my mind. I lost the sense of reality, did not understand what was happening around me, I could not do my work, and my tools fell out of my hands. Great fear came.

I knew I needed spiritual support and I began to call different numbers to ask for a prayer but my phone did not get connection. The situation was horrible. I don't know if I looked like a Gadarenes possessed man but my condition was terrifying. I could not speak because my mouth did not obey, my mind was attacked, and I could not get my thoughts together.

I came out of the apartment and I was wandering about in my neighborhood for a long time. I felt like someone was driving me all the time to the roadway to kill me, and since I didn't understand anything, drivers honked their horns and I was almost hit by cars several times. He who drove me, wanted to kill me. There were several deep pits fenced with red warning plastic tape. I came up to the edge of a pit and something stopped me from making another step to fall in. When I finally came home late, I was pale and could not speak. I had foam on my mouth, and my wife called the ambulance. Then I found myself in a hospital.

Doctors took a picture of my brain. Even now they cannot give a clear answer of what happened to me because it had a spiritual cause. There was a shift of the left part of my brain, but what made me really scared was that they found a tumor in my brain! My attending surgeon made a firm statement that it would take an operation to remove the tumor - more shocking news. I was moved to our regional city to another hospital equipped for such an operation.

I do not describe all the devil's attacks during a whole month while I was in hospitals. All kinds of negative, demoralizing and desperate thoughts drilled my mind. The devil was constantly attacking my faith and trying to break it by all means. I remember myself praying and sincerely crying before the Lord saying, "Lord, heal me." The doctors and the staff did not allow me to leave hospital even once to go to church. I felt like I was imprisoned waiting for an execution. Praise God that Christians visited me, called me and inspired me, it powerfully supported me. I am thankful for all their prayers and fasting. It was a powerful encouragement for me.

Two days before the operation my pastor, two brothers and my wife came to visit me and to pray for me. Before they left they dared to suggest to me to believe God and to escape (it was the only way) from the hospital to go to Vologda church where the revival with Evangelist Dennis Wright was held. I had nothing else to do but to believe and go there in faith in order to avoid surgeon's scalpel. I talked it over with my wife and we agreed to trust God with all our problems.

The devil tried to put doubt in my mind, wanting me to stay in the hospital. He mentioned all possible consequences

if I just escaped without informing doctors (Your sick leave will not be paid, you will lose your job, you won't be taken back to the hospital, there will be other problems.) We made a step of faith and escaped from the hospital saying, "Lord, we believe You will help us."

When we got to church the evangelist and the whole church prayed for me. There was a prophesy that I would be healed and that we would save the money that we would have spent on medicine had I been operated on. That prophesy began to fulfill the very next day when I was x-rayed in Vologda. It was an expensive procedure, but four times cheaper that they offered me in the hospital! According to this new picture Vologda doctors said there was nothing to be afraid of, and that thing that my doctors called a tumor decreased two times in size and no surgical intervention was required! The next day when I was supposed to be operated on we returned to the hospital, came to the chief neurosurgeon, and showed him the results. He said, "I do not see any reason for any surgical intervention! You are okay, there is nothing serious."

Then we asked our attending surgeon, "How come, you have appointed an operation when it was not required at all?" He began to deny that he appointed that operation! But before that he had been a 100% positive that the operation was absolutely necessary, the case was serious, the operation would be very difficult and possibly the left part of the body would be paralysed. Doctors of our local hospital compared the x-ray results, had a council, gave no clear explanation of what had happened, but provided all necessary papers so that my sick leave was paid and I kept my job.

God gave us a victory as we were faithful to the Lord though all devil's attack. This victory does not belong to us alone but to all those Christians who prayed and fasted for me, called and visited me believing in the divine miracle.

And God did that miracle! Praise the Lord!

Greetings from The Netherlands. God is moving in our country in a tremendous way. Many of our churches are seeing people getting saved and locked in.

Here in Zwolle, we've seen a breakthrough. God has brought many people in our church from different cultures. As a result of this, our church services, preached in Dutch, are many times translated into English, Spanish, French, Farci, Russian, and sometimes German and Persish.

In the last four months we had nine weddings, of which were seven young couples. 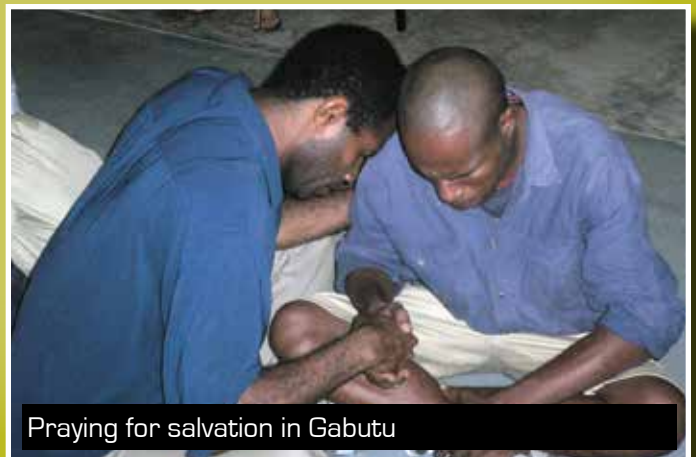


March for Jesus is part of conference in Cebu City
