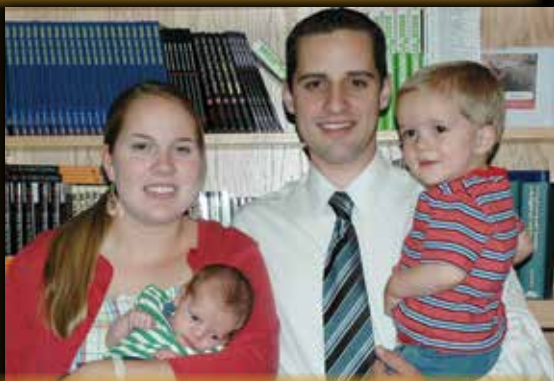

Pastor Mitchell has imparted to the Prescott church a vision of evangelism for many years, and the Prescott saints have responded to the call to do whatever we can to reap the harvest that is in the earth.

During the summer months the level of outreach activity ramps up in Prescott. Our vision and labor turns outward and we labor in many different venues and expressions, some tried and true, and some new and innovative.

While our new concert ministry building was being prepared, we took our concert ministry to the streets. We set up in parking lots, neighborhoods, and other places in Prescott and Prescott Valley and put on a concert with our bands. We just testify of Jesus and preach the Gospel and people who come by get saved.. Once the One80 was ready, our focus of music and drama evangelism shifted to this new location near downtown Prescott. Already we've seen a breakthrough in souls saved in this new venue.

A highlight of our summer outreaches is the annual God and Country presentation on the courthouse plaza. We put on a patriotic presentation that is not just a hook, but a statement of our loyalty and appreciation to live in a great country like the United States.

Pastor Mitchell steps up and preaches the Gospel and conviction falls on the many hundreds of people who sit in rapt attention throughout the program. People respond and are saved right there. Many saints from around the Fellowship come to help us reach out to the thousands of people who throng the courthouse plaza during the 4th of July weekend. Our church

puts a float in the parade, preaching the Gospel to the people who line the parade route. What a burst of ministry and evangelism hits our sleepy little city during this time.

Our summer conference is a gargantuan undertaking, but the Prescott saints rise to the challenge and count it a blessing to serve the great conference body. We are able to minister to the needs of those who come to be ministered to by the unique and powerful preaching that takes place under the big top.

More than 2000 people are a part of the evening services at the tent, eager to hear what God is saying, and to partner with the Prescott church in our world-wide vision of evangelism. Thank God for all who attend our conferences, and desire to be a part of what we're doing.

Along with our One80 concert ministry, we continue to do music and movie outreaches every other Monday night at the courthouse plaza throughout the summer. God has helped us and we've seen many people saved as a result of these outreaches.

We continue to send our bands and impact teams to other cities to help evangelize and win souls in other places. These always return with a good report of souls saved and fruitful ministry no matter where they go. This includes Oceanside, California, an outreach pastor Mitchell calls "the greatest street meeting in the world." We are able to send our technical crews and impact teams to this unique event and the church is glad to hear the reports of what God did to save and heal in Oceanside.

We are blessed to be able to give and go, whether it's our pastor's world wide ministry expression or our local areas of ministry and responsibility, we take seriously the call to preach the Gospel, and we have done this faithfully since 1970. We are also blessed by those who help us, by coming on impact teams or youth extremes or sending a band or drama team. We thank God for those who pray for us and our pastors.

Tent crusades, rallies on Pastor Mitchell's itinerary

Pastor Wayman Mitchell has had a busy summer. He preached a tent crusade in Farmington, New Mexico and preached the Oceanside, California crusade with many people in attendance and many saved in both places.

The first rally in Federal Way, Washington with area churches from Canada, and the McMinnville, and Portland area was a great blessing.

Seven people came down from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho to make this a great impact. "Federal Way, Washington is a great miracle, and that congregation is rapidly growing, averaging 125 people," Pastor Mitchell said.

Pastor conducted an area-wide rally in Bobby Montoya's church in Amarillo,

Texas as well as a Saturday morning seminar with area churches attending from as far away as Oklahoma City.

Pastor preached a tent crusade in Groningen, Holland for Paul Leidekmeyer with 140 decision cards. Fifty-three new people attended

his church the following Sunday. The newspapers and television came in and no less than five color photos and articles came out in the next three days advertising the event.

Pastor Mitchell ministered in the Zwolle church and in the first two days of the European Conference in Zwolle.

Nearly 1,500 people attended the closing night with four overseas works launched, along with seven new pioneer works in Holland.

The Chandler Bible Conference afforded Pas-

tor two preaching spots, and launched two overseas workers and six pioneer churches.

Pastor Greg Mitchell accompanied Pastor Mitchell to Walthamstow, England for three nights and two days. The Walthamstow Town Hall was packed, along with the church building during daytime Men's Discipleship classes.

Pastor Greg and Pastor Mitchell team preached, answered questions and concluded with a Pastor's and Wives seminar.

"The fields indeed are white unto harvest and we are looking at a busy schedule for the Prescott Church as well as our Fellowship as a whole," Pastor Mitchell said.

That's what inspired Pastor Greg Mitchell to set out to find a new home for our concert ministry. After some searching, a building was found close to downtown Prescott that for many years had been a furniture store. When it was decided that this building could be remodeled to suit our needs both now and into the future, Pastor Wayman Mitchell gave the go-ahead and we purchased the building at 422 W. Gurley Street.

When Pastor Greg showed a video of the new building to the church on a Sunday morning, the place exploded with cheers and praise to God who had helped us.

Thus began a campaign to convert a furniture store into a state-of-the-art music, drama, and video outreach forum. One of the fun side lines was a "Name the New Music Scene" contest. The rest of the activity was hard work. But finally the day came to christen the Prescott Church's new venue for outreach and ministry on July 5, 2008.

One80 is now the name of our concert ministry. The building has room to seat 400 easily. We enjoy state-of-the-art sound and video. We have air conditioning! And already we sense a renewed zeal and thrust of evangelism that is a direct result of this new facility.

The bands and actors have risen to the challenge and are knocking our socks off with music and drama. Saints are bringing their friends and family and many of these visitors are being saved. It's exciting to see what God is doing, especially among our young people.

In the future, this fantastic building that God has blessed us with can be used for many different kinds of ministry and outreach. And if we'll be faithful, God will continue to bless our labors with lasting fruit.

timonies, and one-on-one witnessing which resulted in 25 people accepting Jesus.

My name is Toni Cherim and I got saved on June 9, 2008.

It took a long time to get where I am today but my troubled life started at the age of seven when my parents got a divorce.

I couldn't understand why they didn't love each other and this caused me to become an emotional wreck, blaming myself for my parent's break up.

My brother and I were forced to live with our mom who placed everything from drugs to alcohol before her children. Because my mother was emotionally unstable and gave no attention to her children, I tried finding acceptance in drugs and relationships at an early age of 13.

We were moved from mom's house to dad's because she didn't want the responsibility but living with dad was like living in a drug house. The only time we spent time together is when we were getting high.

Feeling unloved and rejected, loneliness and depression began sinking in and my only thought of escape was to end my life. Because I was too scared to kill my self I got deeper in drugs, I loved the way it made me feel and

started living life like there are no consequences.

The first time I heard "I love you" was from my brother, whom after having seen the mess I made of myself pleaded with me to go to drug rehab.

I came out of rehab and three months later I was back into the drug scene where I met a guy who I thought loved me. We sold and did drugs together, then I got pregnant and my dad didn't want anything to do with me because the baby's father is black.

My life was spinning out of control; my boyfriend started hitting me all the time and for the first time, I dropped to my knees and asked God "If you are real come and rescue me from my misery."

Not long after that someone came to my door, invited me to church and told me that Jesus wants to have a personal relationship with me. I knew that God had answered my prayer; I was so excited that I couldn't wait to be picked up for church.

I gave my life to Jesus and for once, I know that I'm loved and accepted and I've had no desire for drugs or alcohol.

I still can't wait to get to church.

God is stirring our congregation and we are experiencing breakthrough like never before. Couples are coming in and we're doing water baptism at least once a month.

Men are rising up, preaching music scene, challenge nights, and committing their lives to the cause of the gospel.

In the last four months we have seen a total of 53 people gave their lives to Christ.

ing regularly for one month in response to a challenge by the youth leader, Ryan Scott. They not only fasted from food, but from other things that easily distracted them from God.

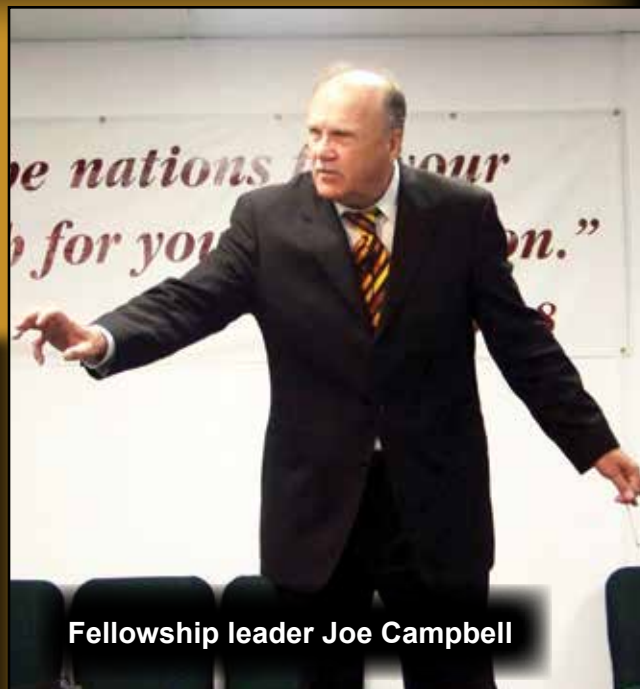

In June, we baptized eight new converts. It was great to hear their testimonies of the work God has done in their lives.

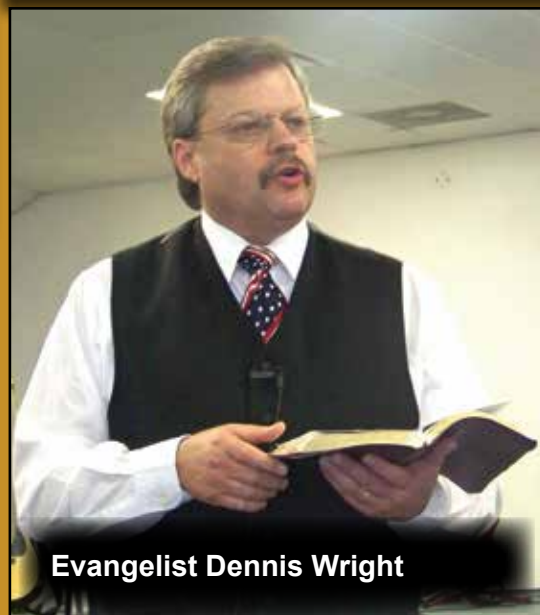
In July we had Pastor Harold Warner here for a revival. It was the first time he has ever preached in Killeen and was a landmark time for us.

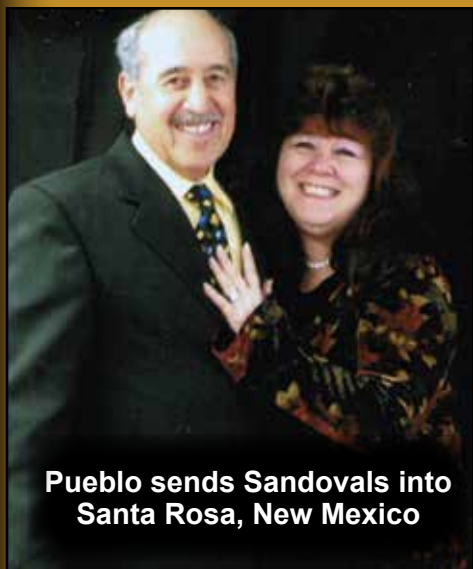
