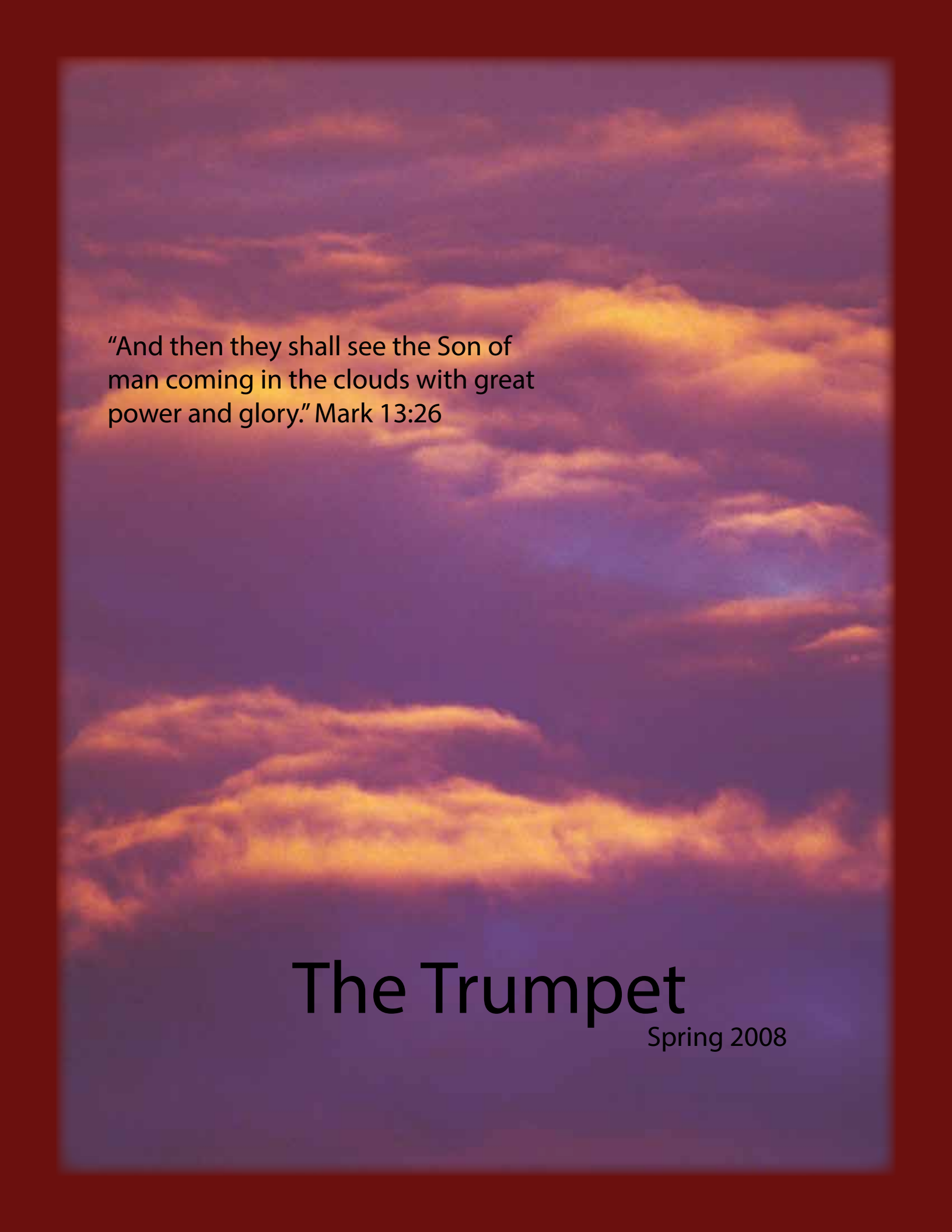

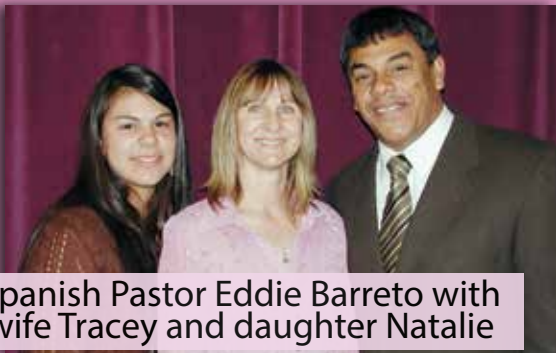

Pastor Mitchell ministers in Mexico, Australia

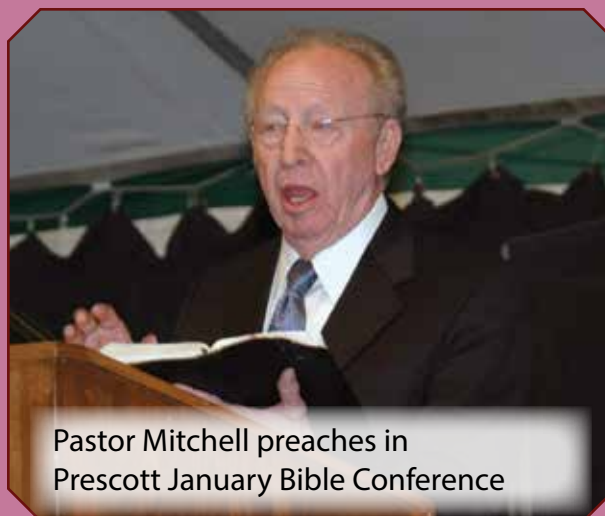

Building disciples happens on purpose

Thomas Monaghan is founder, president and chief executive officer of Domino's Pizza, Inc. From 1979 to 1985, Domino's grew from a small debt-ridden chain to the second largest pizza company in America. When asked to account for the phenomenal growth of the company, Monaghan explained, "I programmed everything for growth." And how did he plan for growth? "Every day we develop people - the key to growth is developing people." Not special cheese, not a tasty crust, not fast delivery schedules, but people!

As pastors, we are called to do more than have religious gatherings, large crowds, and impressive programs. We are called to reach the world in which we live. We are called, Jesus' own words, to "preach the Gospel to every creature." However, as any man who has bothered to look at a map recently could tell you, we are woefully inadequate for the job.

Suppose your church doubles in size overnight. Exciting as that would be, could we then say we are reaching the world? Imagine if men and women from every nation and continent sat in your seats every week. Would *that* qualify as touching the world? Even in churches with thousands of members, the obvious reality is that men of God can not and will not make a significant impact in their lifetimes unless they *build other men*.

While the central theme of Christ's ministry on earth was the redemption of lost mankind, His central instrument of redemption was played out in the arena of discipleship. He crafted men who were able to accomplish the two critical elements of evangelism: soul winning and disciple making.

So how does one go about "building men?" Do we need to find the latest fad conference, daily devotional, or 12-part video series? While I am far from being an expert, I have been, as a disciple, "built" and "crafted" by two of the finest disciple makers there are, and I believe the Word of God has something to teach us.

In 1 Chronicles 17 we find the moving story of David's desire to build a temple for his God. His righteous desire to build a permanent house for Jehovah is met with a gentle rebuke by God Himself.

In 1 Chronicles 22:7-10 David recalls, "My son, as for me, it was in my mind to build a house to the name of the Lord my God; but the word of the Lord came to me, saying, "You have shed much blood on the earth in My sight. Behold a son shall be born to you, who shall be a man of rest; and I will give him rest from all his enemies all around. His name shall be Solomon, for I will give peace and quietness to Israel in his days. He shall build a house for My name, and he shall be My son, and I will be His Father, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom over Israel forever.

Here we find the keystone lesson of building men: **We are limited creatures.** As David lived through an era of warring and bloodshed, so his son would live in an entirely different era, one for which David was not qualified nor accustomed to minister in.

As pastors and men of God, we must grasp that we are limited. We must learn that we cannot do everything and that if God's will is going to be accomplished on the earth, then we are going to learn how to raise up, train, and partner with men over which God has given us stewardship.

This exposes the battle of pride: Small minded men are affronted by the advances of younger men, even their own disciples. I pastored a group of men whose previous pastor could not, would not, let them think for themselves. He had to be, in the words of Pastor Wayman Mitchell, "The bride at every wedding, and the corpse at every funeral.

Imagine if David had felt this way? What if he could not accept that this kid in his house was going to get the glory for what David had always wanted to do? Imagine if David could not accept that his "disciple" was going to progress his ministry into regions David had always dreamed of?

God taught us all a very powerful lesson in the succession of Solomon. That is, we are living in a particular time frame and geographical location, and often, if we want to reach beyond that, it is going to be through the men we raise and disciple in our spiritual house.

So what is the process involved? Is there a magical key? In our story, we find a few very insightful lessons in the life of David.

In 1 Chronicles 18:7-8 It says, "*And David took the shields of gold that were on the servants of Hadadezer, and brought them to Jerusalem. Also from Tibhath and from Chun, cities of Hadadezer David brought a large amount of bronze, with which Solomon made the bronze sea, the pillars, and the articles of bronze.*"

If you read on through chapter 18 and beyond, you find that David begins a focused program of amassing a large amount of raw material for the temple. He stockpiled gold, silver, bronze, cedar, nails, hinges, even purchased the threshing floor where the temple is ultimately built.

The first function of the disciple maker is providing the raw material of ministry. In our lives, we are called to provide these men in our tutelage enough material that they are able someday to build something of value.

We provide the raw material of the revealed Word of God. That is, we

preach with inspiration and anointing so that we may pierce their hearts and souls with what God is doing on the earth. Dry, heartless and uninspired preachers will never kindle the fires of passion that may one day cause a man to take his family to the ends of the earth.

We provide an atmosphere and exposure to the supernatural realm. We don't hide from the miraculous. We revel in the power of simply believing God and taking Him at His word. A man who is never exposed to the supernatural realm of Christianity and who never encounters true faith is highly unlikely to be willing to lay his life down for the cause.

We provide the raw material of opportunity. One of the great tragedies is meeting qualified, able young men who could do so much, but they sit in a church that has no ministry opportunity beyond sweeping the floors.

In Prescott, we were literally drowning in opportunity. If you were so inclined, you could be involved in something every day of the week. Our pastors allowed us to try new things, sail uncharted waters, and, believe it or not, they allowed us to fail.

These "raw materials," and I'm sure many others, are the stuff that ministers are made of. They are, more accurately, the atmosphere of the mother church. Preachers, disciples, and missionaries are not created in a vacuum, but in a highly charged womb, rich with spiritual nutrients.

In 1 Chronicles 22:2 we read, "So David commanded to gather the aliens who were in the land of Israel; and he appointed masons to cut hewn stones to build the house of God."

As David's time with Solomon was drawing to a close, we find his preparations stepping into a new arena.

As a disciple, I was blessed to be under the influence of a number of great men and leaders. I was continually, over the years, immersed in the raw material of opportunity, anointed preaching, and the supernatural realm. However, as my time in the Prescott church drew to a close, things began

to change.

In the last nine months, Pastor Greg Mitchell began to work directly with me on a number of issues. As I was approaching "launch date," the generalized discipleship that happens in a large church clearly began to change gears.

The second function of the disciple maker is providing the hewn stones of ministry. Just as David began to prepare Solomon's foundation for his "ministry," the pastor is called to do the same for his disciple.

The hewn stones are vastly different from the raw material of ministry. These are carefully crafted elements that are custom made for each man. These stones were something beyond Solomon's ability. They were out of his league. And yet, in a love for his son, and a desire to see him succeed, David in his wisdom provides these

finely crafted building blocks for him.

What are the hewn stones? One is the element of preaching. I was literally, hands on, taught how to preach. I wasn't simply sent out in the hope that I "got it!"

In our "Serious Men" class we were (literally!) lined up against the wall and told to "street preach." As we would timidly speak out, Pastor Greg would stop us, saying "No, I want you to preach, not mumble."

Why is that? Is he a sadistic man? Bent on embarrassment? No, he recognized that the young men were, at that time, just a touch too timid. He carefully crafted boldness in us!

Then we were grilled in doctrine. When I was Door director, Pastor Greg would hand me scriptures and ask me (at 8 in the morning), what

I saw in them. I was taught how to think, how to mine the scriptures, how to ask questions of the scripture to get a sermon. I can still sit down and read the Bible and hear his voice asking me questions about the scripture's author, audience, and purpose. He was not content to hope that because I had heard great preaching my entire life that I would "get it," but rather he invested his time and energies and crafted within me the hewn stones of ministry.

Pastor Mitchell Senior would always allow the disciples to be there when he was writing sermons in the morning, and would carefully (by way of example) teach us how to keep a sermon focused. We were thoughtfully schooled in the genius of a concise sermon.

Both pastors were instrumental in crafting our attitudes and mindsets.

More than once a stern rebuke literally saved my life. They allowed me to blunder, rebuked me for it, and in the process carefully crafted these critical stones in my life.

I was taught people skills. I was schooled in counseling. The art of organization, planning and forethought was drilled into me day after day. And to this day, my pastors are still, by example as well as direct communication, crafting within me the skills of ministry.

There is one final element. In 1 Chronicles 28:11-13 it says, "Then David gave his son Solomon the plans for the vestibule, its houses, its treasuries, its upper chambers its inner chambers, and the place of the mercy seat and the plans for all that he had by the Spirit, of the courts of the house of the Lord, of all the chambers all around, of the treasuries of the house of God, and of the treasuries for the dedicated things; also for the division of the priests and the Levites, for all the work of the service of the house of the Lord, and for all the articles of service in the house of the Lord."

The third and most vital function of the disciple maker is providing the Godly pattern. You can teach a

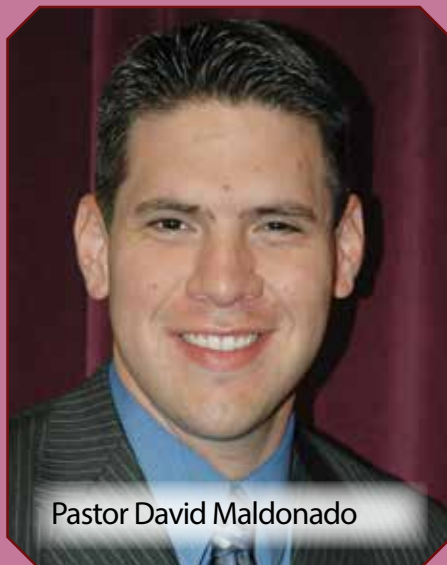

Today's church suffers from a 'hope deficiency'

It is astonishing to me that for as much hope as there is in the Bible there is such a "hope deficiency" in the church. For people who are supposed to be "the hope of this generation" how is it we can become so cynical and pessimistic? Then the bigger obstacle; how do we minister at any level, with any kind of longevity... without allowing disappointments and failures to condition our perspective of life, ministry and the harvest field?

1 Corinthians 9:9 *For it is written in the law of Moses, Thou shalt not muzzle the mouth of the ox that treadeth out the corn. Doth God take care for oxen? Or saith he it altogether for our sakes? For our sakes, no doubt, this is written: that he that ploweth should plow in hope; and that he that thresheth in hope should be partaker of his hope.*

No doubt it is hope that causes a farmer to buy the desolate field, in hope of a bumper crop. Without it there is

no willingness to sacrifice, toil or sow seed. Why would you risk pouring in your money, time and effort into something you really have no expectation that God could move and bring to pass

a mighty harvest? What could be more humdrum? Someone has said, "There are no hopeless situations; there are only people who have grown hopeless about them."

The reality is there are no guarantees. You may labor for weeks or even months and the visitors don't come, or that person doesn't stay saved. What will you do then? Will you lower your expectations? Maybe you just won't risk as much so as not to be so disappointed the next time.

I encourage you, despite what your recent harvest has or hasn't produced: sow your seed, sacrifice and labor again. After all what if this is the field, this is the seed, and this is the season? There is only one way to find out. SOW! Matthew 9:37 Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest."

man to preach, to study, to plan and organize to his heart's content. You can teach him people skills and how to pray for the sick. You can teach until you're blue in the face, but if you don't provide the pattern, before long, they're building schools and orphanages, drowning in the stream of ecumenicalism, and selling their birthright for religious trinkets.

The 'pattern' is the most critical element in any man's successful ministry, whether young pastor or experienced minister. We must know why and how we do what we do. The pattern, or plan, is our strategy for success, and we must impart it to our men.

Many young men are launched into the harvest field with some vague idea about how the church they came from functioned, but without a clear idea of how to get there. Pastor Ri-

chard Rubi's July 2007 sermon, "The Craftsmen are Coming," deals ably with that issue. Imagine if Solomon was provided a mountain of material and finances, but David never shared with him the plan that God had revealed to him? Would he have built the temple of David's dreams or a theme park?

The pattern is not man's idea of the kingdom of God, it is not a document of codes (the color of thy sign shall be...), nor is it a bondage to a young pastor. When a young man lands in a new city, it is the pattern that enables him to begin, to navigate the treacherous waters of religious nuts, and build a firm foundation that will last.

Our men should know why we do what we do. Why do we have firm ministry standards? Why do we have an order of service? Why don't we let women preach? Why do we avoid the

ghettoes and the million-dollar gated communities when choosing a location?

The plan, or pattern, or whatever your phraseology happens to be, is nothing more complicated than our strategy for success.

Our disciples should be taught (as I was) about the mistakes we made. They should be allowed to ask us "why" without us accusing them of insubordination. If they don't know why and how we do what we do, rest assured, they will never do it.

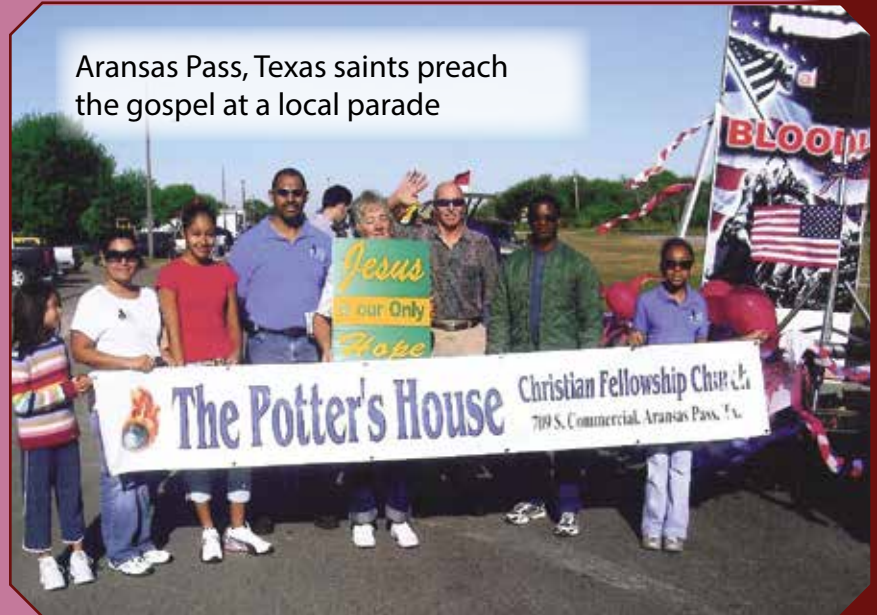

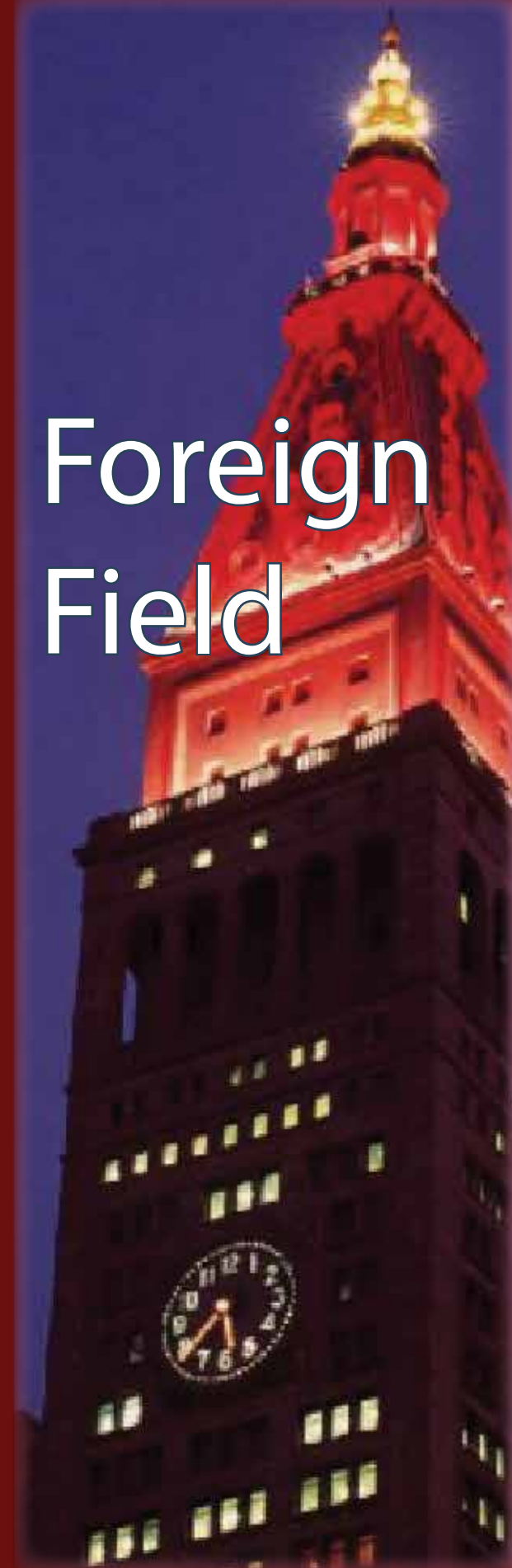

We stayed with a group of 80 to 100 people in a hotel in the mountains near Guangzhou for 4 days. The group consisted of people out of the churches of Guangzhou, Dongguan, Macau, Zhuhai and Beijing.

For this rally we had pastor Valk from Zwolle, Holland as our main guest speaker, just like October last year. He also brought his wife Jessie which was very nice and encouraging for the other pastors' women. The preaching of pastor Valk was very encouraging, challenging, up building and brought clear direction for the churches. Several family people, friends and colleagues of people that also had come to the rally got saved. Also we have seen some healings. Our breakfast discipleship class brought around 100 men. A powerful and challenging sermon was delivered and repentance and commitment were so apparent.

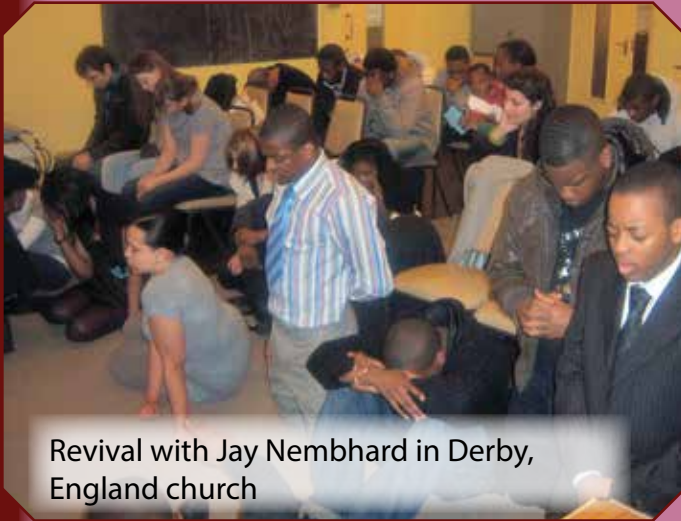

My wife Stella and I landed in Trichy and started this church in May of 2001 with 5 people. We have grown to 125 in the last 7 years and we are an indigenous church, totally self supported.

We launched a baby work in the 2007 India conference which kindled a fresh fire of revival in the hearts of our church members which reflects in the sacrificial pledges they have made beyond their capacity.

Recently, I was asked to pray for a college lecturer who has hepatitis B virus. Her stomach felt like a rock and she lost her appetite and has not been eating for months. I led her in simple prayer and she forgave her family with whom she had stopped talking for more than a year, and prayed for her healing.
