As the weather began to warm up we began to take the Gospel to the streets and to outreach with our impact teams and our bands, helping our fellowship churches all over Arizona.

We are able to send guerrilla teams to make impact in cities from Cottonwood to Phoenix to Las Vegas. Our guerrillas labor all day long going door-to-door preaching the Gospel and winning souls. Our teams are genuinely ministering to people and touching lives.

Bands play outdoors or in parking lots or public parks or even in the church's concert scene. But they don't just play music, they genuinely minister the gospel and testify and aim to see souls saved. Every Sunday morning we hear the reports of what God did, and we rejoice to be able to play a part.

For many years we have been able to send a large group of our teens and their chaperons to San Luis Mexico to participate in their city-wide miracle salvation healing crusade. We sent seven van loads of young people to join with saints from McMinnville, Oregon as well as from around Arizona, California, and Sonora, Mexico.

This small army spreads out over bustling San Luis witnessing for Jesus and testifying of the grace of God and inviting the needy to the crusade services. This outreach has grown to the point that the open air facility was filled to overflowing every night. More than 800 people were saved and many notable miracles of healing were witnessed.

In Prescott we invited teens from around the fellowship to come for a Youth Extreme in

April. Pastor Adam Porter from Federal Way, Washington came to minister to the teens before they went out for a day of ministry and evangelism. More than 30 young people were saved during the day of ministry.

We followed up that time with a revival meeting with evangelist Dennis Wright. God poured out His Spirit on us and He moved wonderfully throughout the week. Many legs grew out in very unusual and dramatic fashion. Not only did this glorify God, it saved many people thousands of dollars otherwise spent on pain killers. Our faith was stirred and new converts were electrified at seeing God move in divine healing.

Throughout the spring months we continue to labor in outreach, evangelism, ministry, home Bible studies, One80, and any other way we can think of. And God has been faithful to save and add to the church those being saved. Memorial Day weekend we were once again able to use the downtown courthouse plaza as a venue for evangelism, with music, movie, and personal witnessing. We saw 10 souls saved our first night out for 2009. Thank God for His faithfulness.

As we move on under the ministry of Pastor Greg Mitchell while Pastor and Mrs. Wayman Mitchell labor in Australia for a time, we are constantly striving to use the tools we have to bring the Gospel to our community. We put a band on the roof of the One80 and preached to the party goers across the street.

We had a Battle of the Bands and invited bands from the outside to participate. We have a car show with live music to attract people who don't normally come to anything we do. We put on full length plays.

In May we said good bye to Rich and Brianna Maerk as we sent them out to pastor in Marana, AZ.

God bless you all as you follow His will into the future.

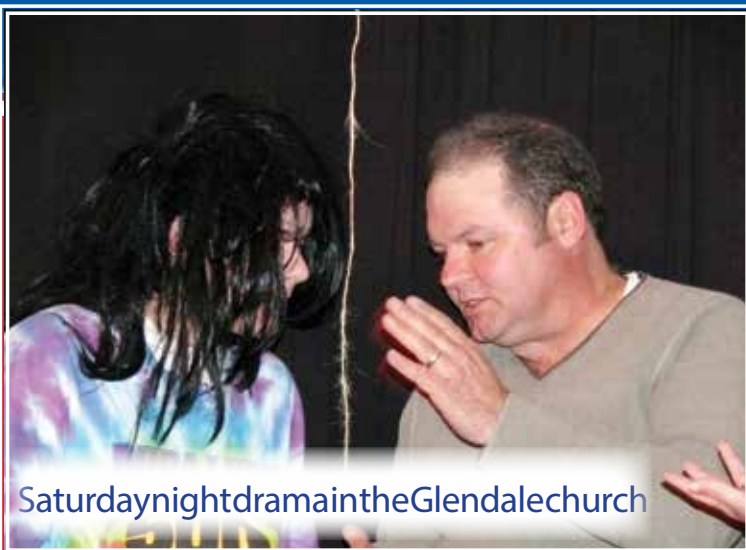

Shortly thereafter, we rolled up our sleeves and diligently went to work on our themed concert and drama presentation entitled "Ghost Town." It

31, after coming from our pastor's birthday party, she was feeling light-headed, and all

of a sudden she lost her sight. We received a phone call that she was being rushed to the emergency room. During the time while sister Sally was in the emergency room, the doctor's informed her that her blood sugar was well over 300 and she needed to be put on insulin for diabetes.

After she was sent home that night she still wasn't feeling well but still attended Sunday morning service. She later suffered multiple strokes that forced her back into the hospital. This left her legally blind; she could barely make out faces and suffered memory loss. They placed her in a nursing home facility where she would undergo therapy. They hoped to see if any vision could possibly be restored, or else she would have to accept the fact that she might be legally blind the rest of her life.

This treatment went on for about a month until the nursing facility stated that she wasn't disabled enough to be in the care of the facility. Sally returned home and was cared for by her son, Stevie, who worked overnight and would come in the morning and take care of her until her husband would return home from work later that evening.

During this time sister Sally hadn't given up hope and the church would continue to pray for a complete healing for her. We had revival with Pastor Andy Anderson that begun on April 12, Easter Sunday. That Sunday night Evangelist Anderson called for prayer for healing.

Sister Sally raised her hand and was escorted by her husband to the front where Pastor Anderson could lay hands on her and pray for her. Pastor Anderson gave Sally some encouraging words and began praying, pleading the blood of Jesus to heal our sister. Although Sally's vision hadn't returned that night she didn't lose faith in God's promise.

My pastor received a call from her son Stevie the next morning saying that as she woke up, she was screaming, "I can see!" "I can see!" She then began to call her other son Rene, and her family to tell them the good news! Sister Sally's vision was restored after months of being legally blind. She gave all the praise and glory to God for her miracle recovery. We truly serve an awesome God!

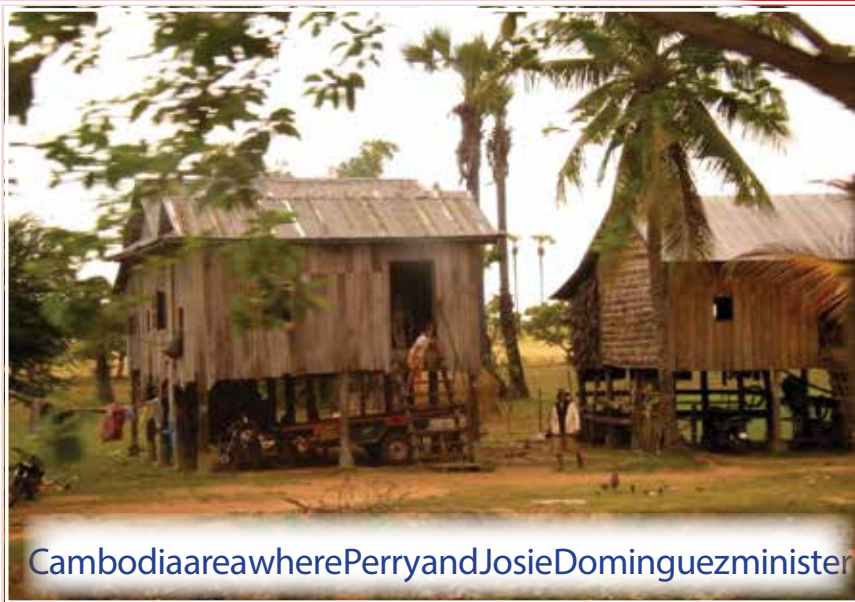

Often as it seems, the beauty of a nation can disguise the ugliness of the sin that lies beneath the surface. Everyone in this nation goes to church on Sunday, but the majority of the nation is backslidden from the revival that this nation was birthed in.

Bad examples are everywhere you look, as many of the mainline church pastors drink and smoke. Apathy is a plague upon the hearts of multitudes. But, desperation for truth is rising up in the hearts of young people.

Despite opposition from Hell and religious people, God has been powerfully moving here in Samoa. He's helped us to get into three high schools in the last year. Usually, we'll see anywhere from 200-300 students saved. At one school we went to in February, we saw about 500 students get saved! God has been graciously giving us young disciples that want to do something for God. When we go to these schools, we have been sewing for the future harvest in this nation.

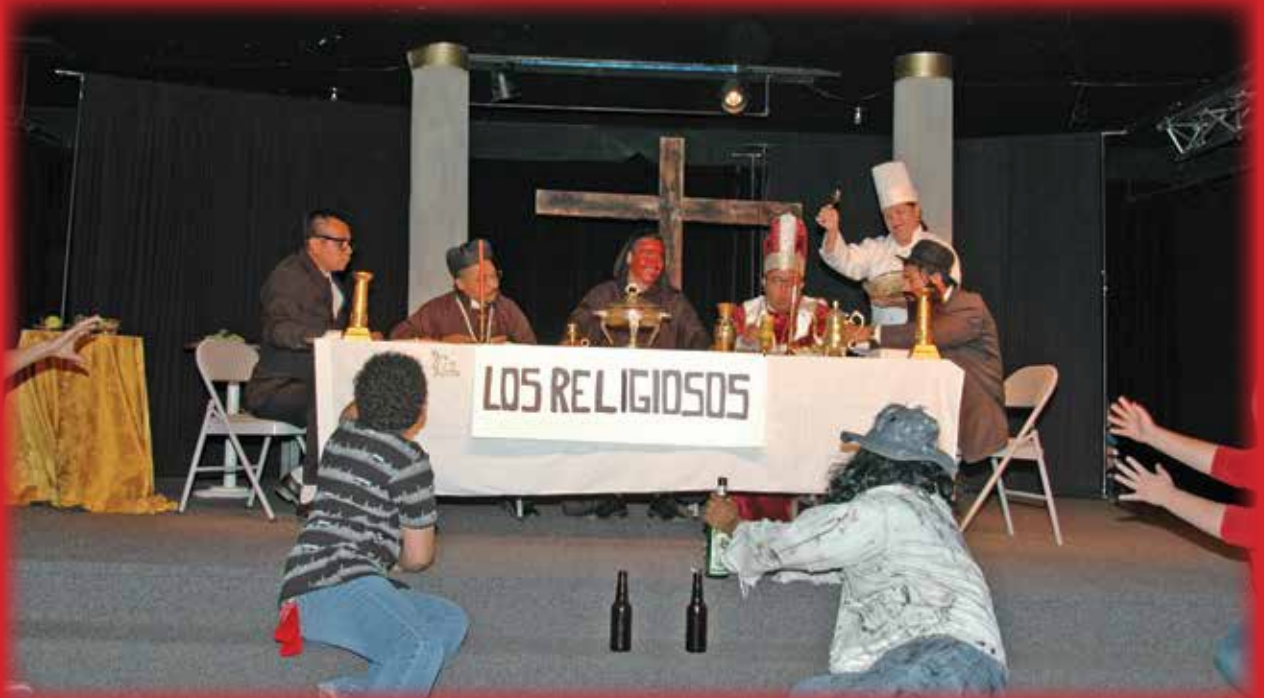

We want to win every square inch of our city for God and as many souls for Jesus.

When Prescott opened its new One80 concert scene last year, our Spanish speaking brothers and sisters quickly saw an opportunity to reach other Spanish speaking people in the community. They put together their own concert scene with a drama group, and they bring in bands from around the fellowship to minister in Spanish. They outreach in the community and invite visitors, and they are seeing the fruit of their labors and prayers. In May, for the Mexican Cinco de Mayo celebration, they put together a big outreach with drama, music, testimonies, and afterwards, a big buffet of authentic Mexican food. After the outreach, they had a great report - 150 people came to the outreach, and 18 people gave their lives to Jesus Christ. They conduct the Spanish One80 on a Friday once each month, with about 100 people, including visitors, each time.
