We receive a wholesome diet of strong meat, but it is well balanced to produce faithful and fruitful saints who love each other and who love those not like themselves.

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Walking where Jesus walked:

Visiting the land of Israel brought Bible events to life as we walked in the steps of Jesus and saw the land He once lived in and will return to. A group of 165 people from fellowship churches joined Pastor and Sister Mitchell for a 10 day Israel tour in November 2008.

The many memorable places that we visited included Mt. Carmel to see the valley of Megiddo, the prophesied site of Armageddon (Rev. 16:14-16). We also walked on the "brow of the city" where the Nazarenes tried to cast down Christ (Luke 4:28).

Sailing on the Sea of Galilee in wooden boats and hearing Pastor Mitchell speak from Mark 4:35 about the calming of the storm brought a real presence of God to the tour. We ate grilled tilapia fish from the Sea of Galilee and visited the site of the multiplication of loaves and fishes as well. Seeing an actual boat from the time of Christ was fascinating (www.JesusBoat.com).

Korazim was a cursed city (Mat-

thew 11:21) that saw great fruitfulness but let in worldly influences by carving Medusa and the Zodiac into their synagogue. Following the narrow Jordan River led us to the ruined Roman city of Bet She'an where Saul's body was hung (1 Samuel 31:10), and just down the road fresh water bubbled up in a spring where Gideon selected soldiers for war (Judges 7:4-7).

We went up the hills into Jerusalem (Psalms 122:1-2) to what they believe is the Upper Room of the Day of Pentecost. This was the most incredible part of the trip, with all of us packed into this room of high arched ceilings, speaking in tongues and praising God until you were sure the room was going to collapse with the reverberating sound of the Holy Spirit.

In the Garden of Gethsemane the ancient olive trees are ageless because they have no growth rings and new branches grow out of the old (Isaiah 11:1). In the garden Pastor Mitchell spoke (Luke 22:39-46) and asked for testimonies from all the group leaders: Pastor Jose Torres of San Luis R.C.,

Sonora, Mexico; Pastor Terry Haynes of Carbondale, Illinois; and Pastor Joe Rice of San Diego, California.

By the shores of the Dead Sea we saw Masada by ascending in a cable car to the remnants of Herod's Palace and where in 73 A.D. the Zealots made their last stand against the might of Rome. The clay lots with the names of the last 10 men alive were found in the ruins. Along the Dead Sea we saw fresh water sinkholes, a recent fulfillment of prophecy (Isaiah 35:7).

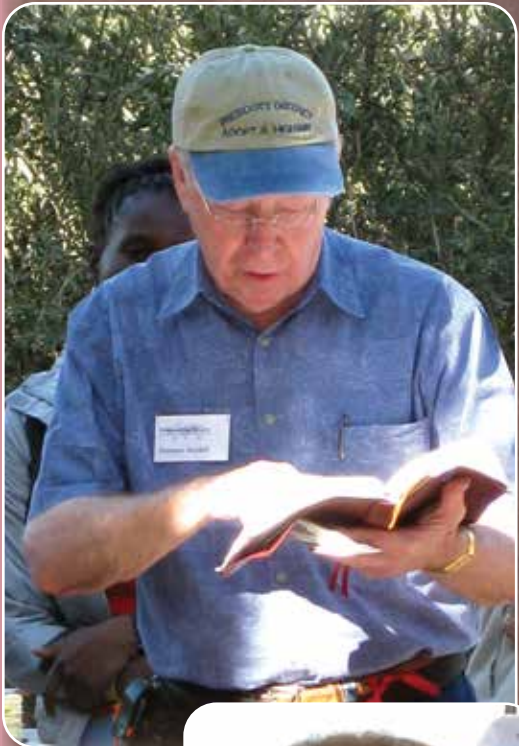
From the Dome of the Rock on Temple Mount Jerusalem looks lovely, and in the Jewish quarter kids having recess filled the streets with life and laughter. Our visit to the Holocaust Museum was a sobering memorial well worth the visit. We ended at Golgotha and the empty Garden Tomb, with time for worship and communion together before ending the trip.

It was a privilege to be able to share this experience with the many people from our fellowship who were able to go.

Greetings from the northeast area of Albuquerque, New Mexico.

In April 2008 we made a move of our church building and it has proved to be a good decision. The build-

ing is in a strategic location, right off of the Montgomery 125 exit.

In August we had a revival with Evangelist Leonard Williams. God used this man to bring a powerful renewing and the conviction of the Holy Spirit to the congregation. He gave a message to the youth in our congregation and had words of knowledge and encouragement for many. Since those meetings, we have had a steady stream of visitors. Our Saturday outreaches have been fruitful and we have seen at least 20 more saved and attending services.

There is a sister in the church who knows sign language and we were excited to see her sign Sunday's sermon to a family she brought to church. It is a blessing to have the ability to minister in this area.

Since our building is right off the interstate, it takes only 10 minutes to the next city of Bernalillo. With the help of The Door, Pastor Rosario Perez's church, and Pastor Medina in Albuquerque, we took outreach teams into Bernalillo and had a concert there in the evening. A business parking lot on Main Street was made available to us through a man to whom we had been visiting and witnessing. By the end of the night a small crowd had gathered. We had a little surprise visit by the local police, which drew extra attention. They happened to be looking for one of the men watching the concert and handcuffed him right on the spot. What a powerful true-to-life illustration in the midst of the songs and testimonies. By the end of the night there were five decisions for Jesus. We plan to continue reaching in to Bernalillo.

In October our church partnered with Pastor Ray Sanchez, also in Albuquerque, as they put on their Haunted House Drama. We are thankful for the opportunity to minister here and sincerely appreciate our mother church in the south valley and the surrounding Fellowship churches for their support.

This year we had 1,402 visitors and 260-plus decisions for Christ! In three years we have seen more than 4,000 visitors, many of whom quite possibly would never enter a church like ours. What we know is that these people will never forget the message they have seen and heard during these productions.

One of the great joys of any congregation is to see the fruit of our labors and investments rewarded, churches planted and effective impact made.

We have seen all of this occur these past few months. In September, Roy and Isabel Sublasky who have served this congregation in one form or another for nearly 25 years, arrived in Malaysia for another round of missionary work.

Revival meetings with Ron Meyer and Patrick Johnson brought a sense of urgency to the church as they ministered timely messages to both seasoned and newer saints alike.

After our August International Bible Conference, many of our teens came out with such momentum that they not only started but have maintained "teen-only" designed and led Thursday night outreaches.

The most significant outreach we do as a church each year is our annual Hell House event. This three-night haunted house (with a twist) has grown over the years and currently involves a cast of more than 200 people, 30,000 flyers, newspaper and internet advertising as well as a promotional website.

This massive effort is to present young adults with an incredible message of reality and hope. Our website Hell101.com has had 10,000 plus hits, and we have local media coverage every year. Visitors often wait two hours or more to enter Hell House. In fact, Arizona's largest nightlife and lifestyle magazine, the New Times, reviewed our event and said, "...the acting and production values are better than anything you'll see in other area haunted houses...".

Greetings from Chinle, Arizona, here on the Navajo Nation! As our church labors on the reservation we are seeing God's favor in every outreach we do.

This past June

we hosted once again the Chinle Camp-meeting Crusade, with Chuck Benson ministering to about 350-400 people each night. Every year during this time we get the opportunity to pray for, and lay hands on, the president of the Navajo Nation, Joe Shirley. The wonderful thing about his visit is that he is seeing the great things that God is doing in our lives here at the Potter's House. He truly recognizes the positive impact and contribution of our church is making not only in Chinle, but across Navajo Nation soil.

During the summer months, we take the gospel into the streets with our music and drama scene, Desert Storm. This outreach is done in our church parking lot and about 300 people from the community attend each time. God has blessed our drama team not only with creativity and humor, but with an amazing ability to minister and bring conviction to people from all walks of life.

In the fall, we take advantage of the many parades on the reservation. As our baby churches enter their parade floats, we labor alongside them, testifying and street preaching. In these last days, God has given us an amazing liberty to preach the truth and proclaim His life-changing power to a hopeless and lost generation.

We have had tremendous revivals this year with Carey Mejia and Jesus Vizzera. In September, we had Evangelist Asghar Ghafoor, an ex-Muslim, come to the reservation and encounter a different group of "Indians" with a vision to win their nation to Jesus Christ. Fifty-six people were saved and many were filled with the Holy Ghost. During the last night of the revival, there were 240 people in attendance. The following week we were able to baptize 16 people on a Sunday night.

In October, the theme to our first "Ma'iis Hideout" was "When Night-



mares Collide.” Evangelist Carl Cooper ministered at this teen rally. Our anointed drama team made use of their talents, and God brought conviction upon everyone there.

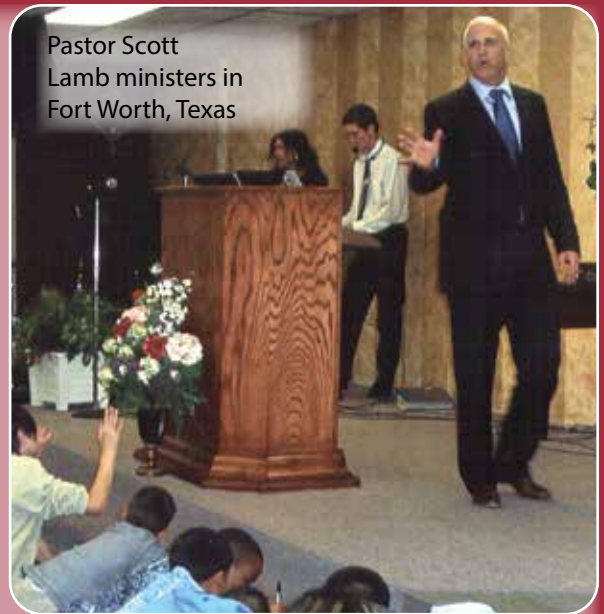

Testimony

My name is Mary Ann Garcia. I got saved in 1972. My first Bible verse was Phil. 4:13. *I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.*

Who but the lord knew that 37 years later I would be clinging to this verse in His word. Three years ago I began feeling weak and sick with a high white blood count. After several tests were done in the emergency room, I was hospitalized due to a cantaloupe-sized tumor in my lower abdomen. It was removed the next day in surgery and after a week on I.V. antibiotics I was released home to rest and wait 10 days for the pathology report to come back.

Praise God when the report came and there was no sign of cancer. A couple of weeks went by and again I was in the

emergency room sick and had a high white blood count. Another week on I.V. antibiotics and a negative test I was sent home a third time. The same routine, back in the hospital, only this time I was told I may have a blood cancer due to high white blood cell count. Again my test came back negative.

For three years the doctors and hospital couldn't understand my illness. By now I was so weak I had to take a leave of absence from my second year in college. By now it's been three years and two tumor surgeries, six cyst surgeries and a major surgery to remove my spleen and a blood transfusion that was sent for a bone marrow biopsy at Stanford university in San Francisco.

The test confirmed what was suspected three years earlier, cancer. I was diagnosed with C.M.L., leukemia. One of the mildest forms of leukemia, according to the doctor. My thoughts were, "Jesus, please don't let me die."

The first chemotherapy medicine that I was on was for nine months. Progress was very slow and my side effects became so bad that I could no longer stay on it. There was one other chemotherapy medicine they could try but it wasn't approved by the FDA. The doctors started the new chemotherapy but also suggested I have my siblings tested for a donor match. I needed it for a bone marrow transplant. My three sisters were tested to see who would be a match for my transplant. The doctors said things looked good. Sometimes one in three could be a possible match and the two weeks that followed seemed like two years. Then the morning game when the phone rang.

It was the hospital. I was devastated.

The doctors called me back later that second day and said I'd have to have several tests down in order to get on a

national registry for a bone marrow transplant. My daughter attends the Pottery House Christian Fellowship Church in Oroville, California and she called me the next day and asked me to come with her to revival with Aaron Saavedra. I told her yes. I could use some cheering up and fellowship with people who love the Lord as I did.

That first night I began speaking in tongues when we prayed. I felt so warm inside, like glowing heat within my body. And then came the altar call for healing. I'd been praying but I never asked for healing. Two weeks passed and I had my third bone marrow biopsy done to see what stage my illness had progressed to. And then my doctor's appointment came. My doctor greeted me in the lobby. He was all smiles. As we walked into the exam room my doctor said "We can't believe it. I had my annual dinner with the staff at the oncology clinic at Stanford university in Palo Alto California and you were the talk of the dinner. I knew one day you may go into remission but never this soon."

I asked him what he was talking about. "Your test came back and there was no cancer detected in your bone marrow tests." I asked if he was sure. "Yes. All the team was excited to see your results. No cancer."

My family cried with joy. I cried with joy. Thank you, Jesus.

I didn't understand why this was happening to me and as I got older,

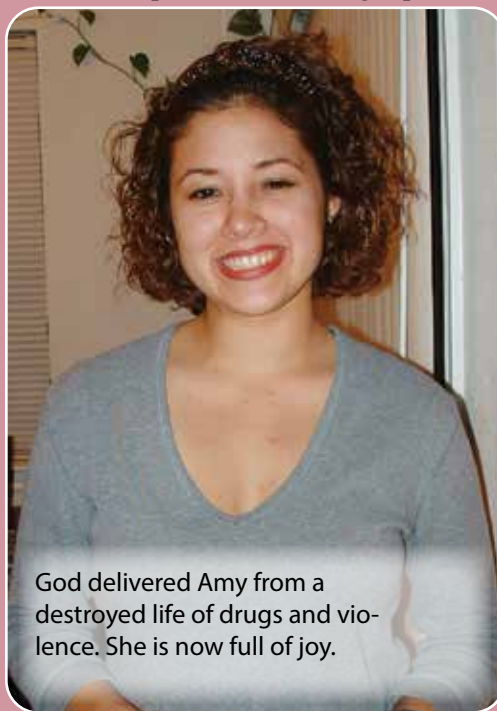
I questioned my whole existence on this earth.

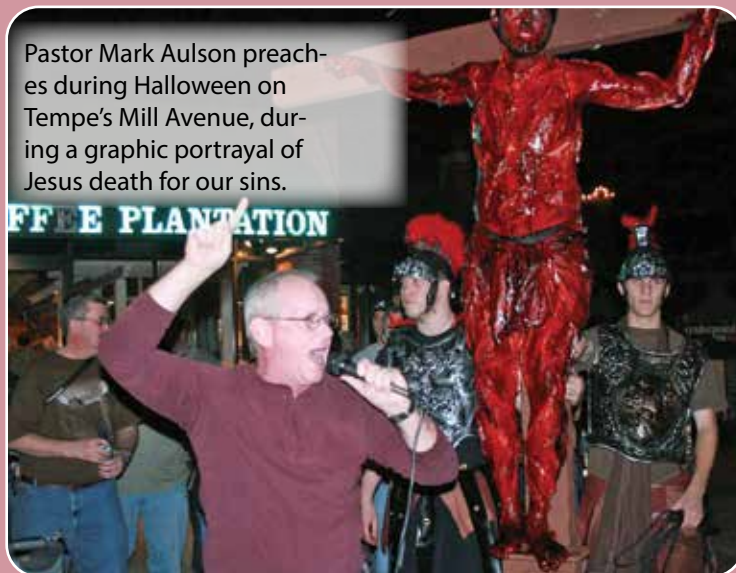
As usual, we went to Mill Avenue in full force for Halloween. What a spectacle to behold the masks and outlandish costumes as people streamed by.

Before and after the revival we had the play "Twice Dead," a re-enactment of Roman's testimony. God touched many people in each of the altar calls.

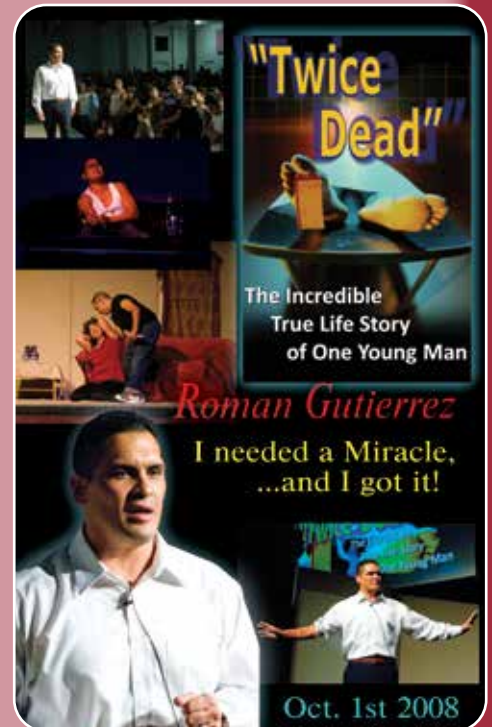
Our brother was able to go into some of our schools and share his testimony. Some young people were so moved that they came out to the evening service and gave their lives to Jesus.

Telegu-language Bible study in a nearby government workers' compound. Not able to find room in one of the Christian family's homes, they ended up setting up in the front room of a Muslim man. Singing songs, worshipping, testifying and giving altar calls, they have gotten great favor there. About nine or 10 married men attend the Bible Study regularly.

The disciples also started doing a Sunday School class at the same area, and are getting many young teens out each week.

This last week was Children's Day in India, so the men organized a movie outreach, and ended up with 30 young visitors. The following Sunday we had our first Harvest Night, with testimonies and fellowship, and had three saved.

We have also begun having our music scene on Sunday nights after service. While a couple of us set up immediately after Sunday p.m. altar call, the rest go quickly to the streets to pass out fliers.

In our first concert we had more than 50 visitors, and we've never had less than 20. In our most recent concert, the majority of our visitors were young Muslim men. At the altar call, one Hindu and three Muslim men came forward to repent. Not content with just praying a prayer, the three Muslim men immediately asked what they need to do. "Do we need to go help people? Feed the hungry? What's next?"

Keep praying for our churches in India. There is a great move of God taking shape, and the enemy would seek to destroy what is happening.

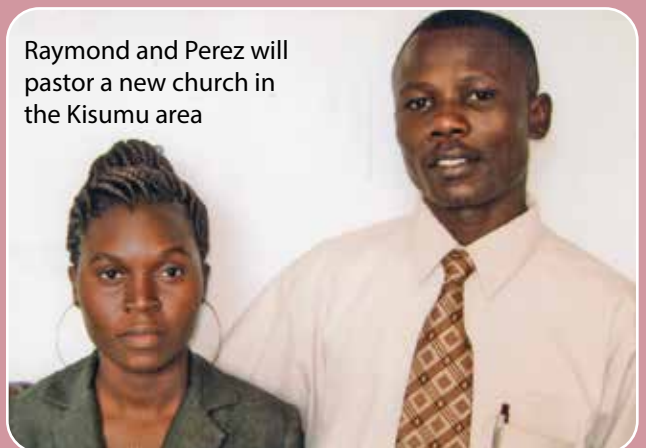

A year ago a disciple of our church had a terrible accident, we've had this year our first funeral (of a lady of the church) and also a baby was born dead. It was a hard time for everybody of the church.

On the other side we've seen many breakthroughs at different areas. God says that we are involved in a spiritual warfare. This picture becomes very alive when terrible things happen and after that immediately new people are added to the church. For many years we were fighting to see more people come into the church than the average of 60. Over the whole last year there has been a stable average in church attendance of 75 to 80 people.

But not only have we grown in more precious people. The new converts are also very busy to grasp the vision in reaching other people. They are not only going

ing around without crutches. A man with migraine was relieved from his pain. Many people in noticeable pain, left the stage cheering and thanking God.

With many Christians from the Dutch Fellowship supporting the campaign, and also about 150 local visitors each night, the tent wasn't big enough for the overwhelming attendance. It went from about 600 on Thursday, up to about 850 on Saturday, with about 200 people sitting outside of the tent.

Within three days 140 people prayed the sinner's prayer. A hundred and twenty-six convert cards were filled out!

One of the things we focused on during the preparations was follow-up. The church was instructed and ready to partner together in the greatest following-up efforts we had known so far and we saw our average church attendance increase with more than 20 people. All the core people were involved in following up several people and this is still going on. Every service new peo-

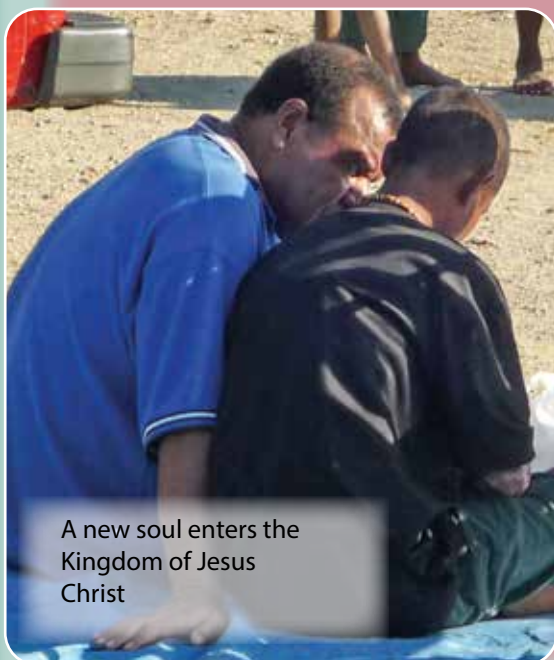

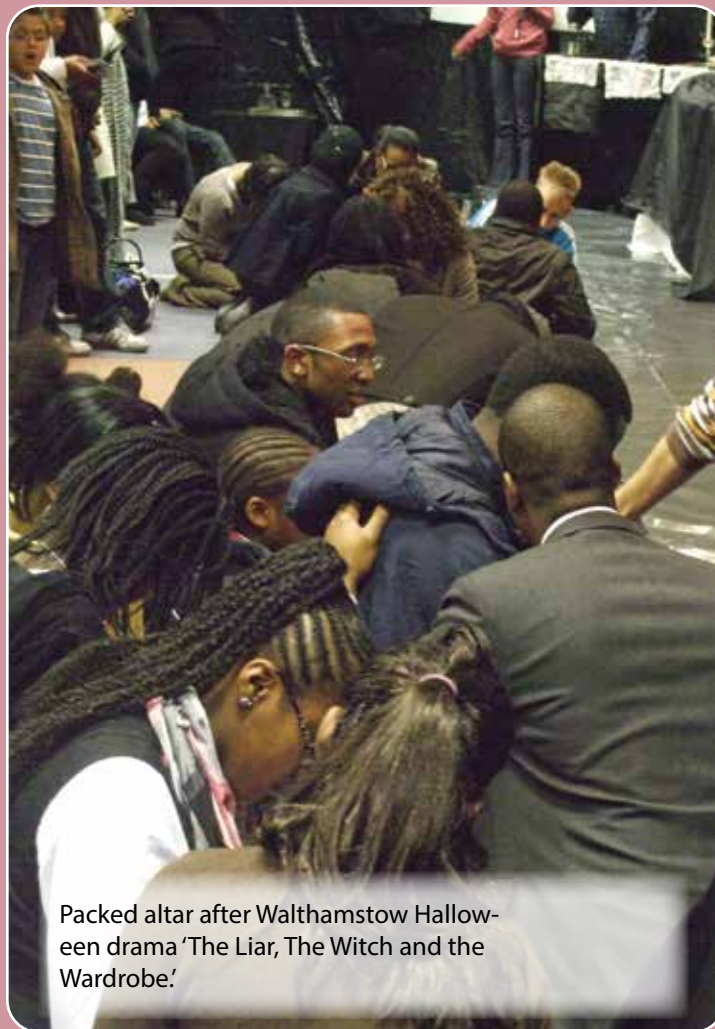
