As our busy summer season of outreach and evangelism winds down I thought it would be worthwhile to reflect back at what the Lord has done in and around Prescott Arizona through our local church.

Many years ago during the Jesus People revival we started putting rock music bands downtown on the courthouse plaza to play Jesus rock and give public testimony to Christ in a format that young people would relate too.

It's amazing that these many years later we continue occupying the downtown courthouse plaza to put on music and movie outreaches all summer long.

Yavapai County has been gracious to let us use the popular courthouse plaza every other Monday evening between Memorial day and Labor Day for our evangelistic outreaches. Saints support by attending and witnessing and praying and we have been blessed with many decisions for Jesus all summer long.

Mixed into this is our annual God and Country presentation, Celebrate America, which is the biggest thing happening downtown that you never read or hear about in the local media. But it touches thousands of people who still honor America and the liberty we still have to preach the gospel both here and abroad.

Many of you have attended our summer conferences held in the big gospel tents. This is such a huge event for us that when it is all over and the tents have been put away it feels like summer is over. But it isn't and we chug along doing all we can

think of to bring the gospel to our sin weary city.

Our Music scene, One80, continues to be a major source of new converts and discipleship training. It is, according to our pastor, a place where our young people can be involved in real ministry and see real souls saved.

We have our usual program of live music and live drama mixed in with guest groups who bring styles of music rarely heard in Prescott. But it still works and many visitors have come to see and hear and have been ministered to. We continue to hear good reports from Tim Miller of what God is doing to save souls in our concert outreach.

Our vision for evangelism goes far beyond the city limits of Prescott or Prescott Valley. We regularly send impact teams to labor around Arizona to witness and to support the efforts of our Fellowship churches. We continue to support our pastor's crusades in San Luis, RC, Sonora and in Oceanside California. In fact, anywhere within travel time for our vans we will send willing workers to make an impact for the gospel.

Every September we hold two special days of celebration. The first is Embry Riddle Appreciation day where we invite students and staff from Embry Riddle in Prescott to our services as an outreach to that campus. Woody Carter and Eric Kramer occupy our pastor's pulpit to preach to us. Current and former Riddle students give a testimony for Christ.

We often see people who once were a part of our church come back to celebrate with us and it's good to renew these old friendships.

The other day is our annual Native American Heritage Celebration. For many years now Pastor Artie Aragon and the Chinle saints have come to

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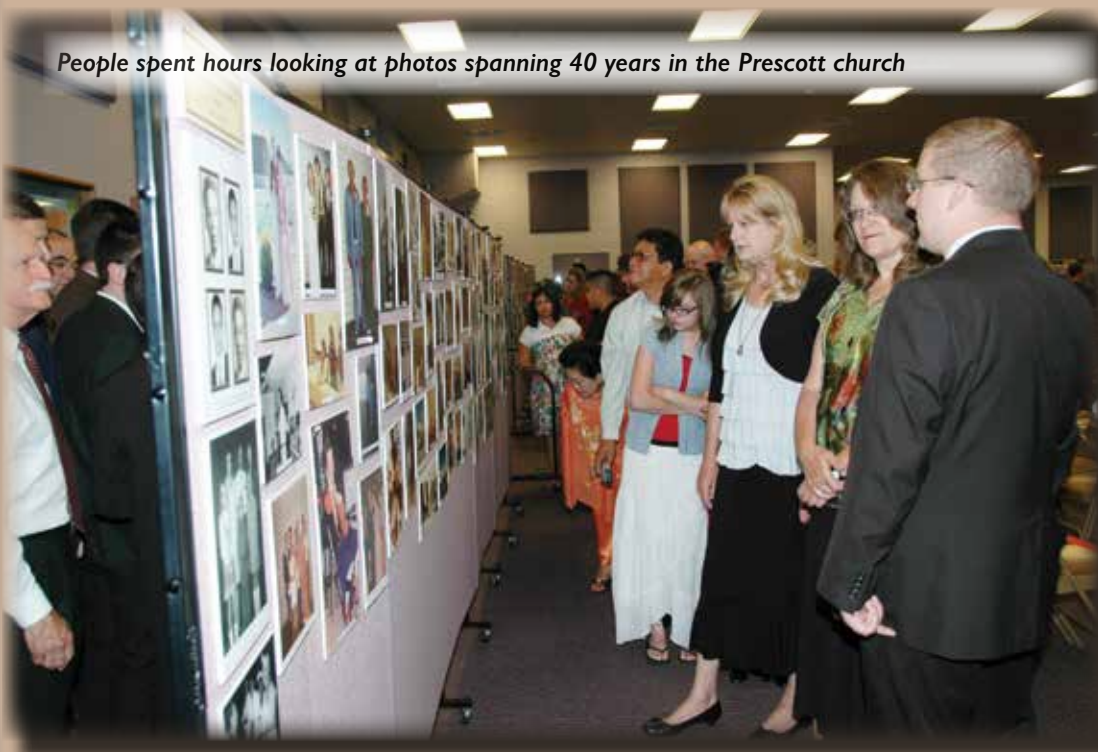

Our hands are firmly on the plough and faces set as flint here in Footscray, Australia.

We have had some outstanding local outreaches throughout our winter months.

Most recently our youth "Cutting Edge" - inspired by one of our young men, laid out a challenge to local Hip Hop and Break dancers to battle at a local gym.

They procured

sponsorship from local business, and hired a professional DJ, called in three professional dancers as judges and gave it the best they had.

The outreach resulted in more than 150 visitors and 40 dancers with their crews turning out to the event. The gospel was declared unashamedly throughout the event with testimony, our rap group "The Messengaz" and the altar call preached before the finals and prize giving. They saw 11 people in total giving their lives to Jesus.

"All in ball" a revised version of streetball has been very fruitful at

outdoor courts with five young men saved recently. "Indoor cricket" is fruitful with some men hiring a local court and door knocking the area on a Saturday afternoon inviting people to join in a free game. During intervals they share their testimonies with the visitors and preach an altar call. At the end, we had four teens saved.

A young couple who host one of our home Bible studies showed Pastor Roman Gutierrez' testimony "Twice Dead." They dropped invites in letter boxes, and knocked on doors. They had four of their neighbours visit. They didn't respond to the altar call but one family said they would come to the next Bible study. This inspired another couple who were helping that they want to do this at their home.

Fortnightly we have our "Music Station" concert scene and have consistently seen visitors come and one to two salvations on average.

The annual area-wide "preachers pulpit" saw 46 disciples preach 10-minute sermonettes over two sessions. Topics varied from "Life's more than just chicken" to "The chronic grumbler" to "Fruitfulness." Suffice to say our preaching hatchery is well stocked and the Lord tarrying we look forward to releasing as many as possible to preach.

The church had all hands on deck in preparation for our conference "Turning Point" in September with Pastors Tom Payne and Richard Rubi. Numbers of our overseas workers and national workers attended.

Our three overseas workers launched in the last 12 months are sending good reports. Brian and Debbie Sullivan in Maputo, Mozambique are sending reports of steady growth. Fritz and Claudia Helg, pioneering our fourth work in Bangalore, have quickly seen a core of people come together.

It is inspiring to know we are perfectly placed in the center of God's will to be used effectively for His purposes in these last days.

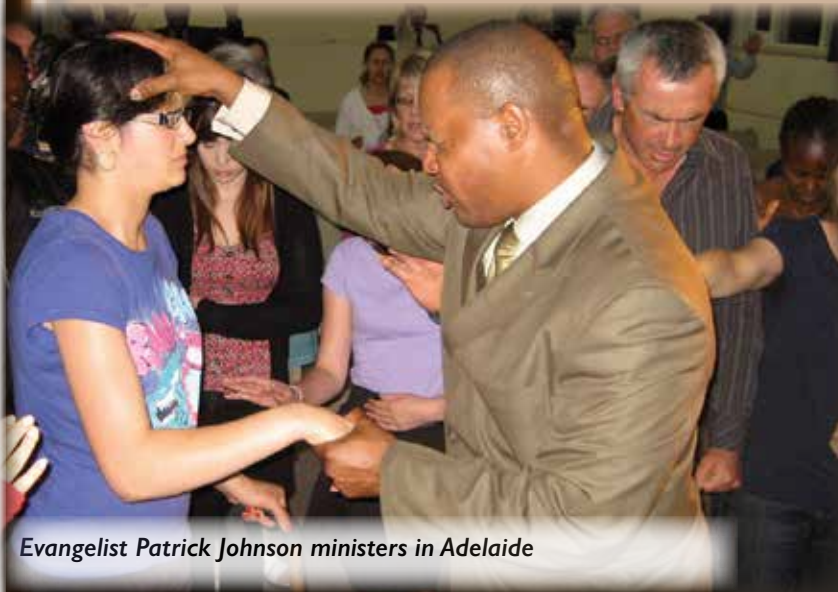
We have just come out of a powerful revival with Pastor Artie Aragon. God truly did visit us during this week.

'Funny Farm' - a journey into what

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ppens when people reject Truth

The rejection of Truth is the beginning of insanity, and this was the focus of a live drama and music special presentation of "The Funny Farm -- one80 Extreme Live Theater," in our downtown Prescott music and drama scene on Saturday, August 21. The evening featured special drama with regular drama team members, experienced comedians from the Prescott congregation as well as fresh new faces. The band Love Runs Red and guest musicians provided music.

Live dramas were interspersed with a running video series in which Lucas Cilano interviewed everyday people in downtown Prescott, asking the basic question of, "What is Truth?" People demonstrated that they have no idea what truth really is, and even less of an idea about where to find it. The evening delved into that theme with a number of incredible live dramas.

Mike Cilano played an unhappy and suicidal husband preparing to leap from a ledge. He is joined by his best friend and brother-in-law (Bruce Cutter), his chain-smoking and shrill wife in her fourth trimester (Jennifer Ciaccio), his overbearing mama (Lori Culver), and her religiously confused "Rabbi" (Joel Morrison). They conclude that life is so terrible that they all have to jump together, when a young man (Lucas Cilano)

comes along and points out the ludicrous waste of suicide and how it will do nothing to solve their problems. This was followed by a testimony by Carol Cilano on how she survived the "funny farm" that was her family to become a sane and happy wife through the power of conversion through Jesus Christ.

Drama in modern dance depicted how a young Christian (Jeremy Mazon) has everything: a family, loving people around him, a strong pastor, and the precious love of Jesus. He chooses to leave that haven for the temptations that the world has to offer, and finds himself trapped in his sin. He falls to his knees in a cry to Jesus to save him.

Many new cast members drawn not just from the drama team but from the regular members of the congregation made debut appearances to help dramatize how easy it is to fall from the grace of God into the traps of the world and sin.

A group therapy session led by Dr. Helen Carnate (Lori Culver) included the crazed man who thinks he's a tractor (Joel Morrison), the happy swaying idiot (Mike Cilano), the thumb-sucking woman reduced to a child by the trauma of having an abortion (Jennifer Ciaccio), a seemingly normal lady (Suzanne Sanchez), and a former doctor who's now a real nutcase (Mike Derois). This crazy bunch is not helped at all by the therapy

leader, but instead real hope is offered by Suzanne, telling them about the incredible difference that only Jesus Christ can bring to a person's life. The drama was immediately followed by Suzanne's real life testimony of redemption and change.

A final rock drama featured a fresh adaptation of the original song by the 1980s Prescott band Apocalypse. Lucas Cilano is an average guy who is witnessed to by his co-worker (Brandon Pepich), but Lucas blows him off and goes home.

Lucas awakens to find his home seemingly filled with a party, but the people are all creepy ghouls surrounded by smoke and mystery. He steps into the bathroom to try and get a grip on himself and is faced by the image in the mirror of the sin within himself. Running back out to the "party," the ghouls start to descend on him and drag him down to Hell when he remembers the words of his friend's witness and cries out to JESUS!

The demons flee, he falls to the floor, and in the morning his friend comes in to find him greatly changed by the experience and ready to accept Jesus as his Lord and Savior.

The extreme on80 blend of live music and themed drama is an exceptional way to reach souls, and six people asked for the grace of God's forgiveness and were saved after the presentation.
