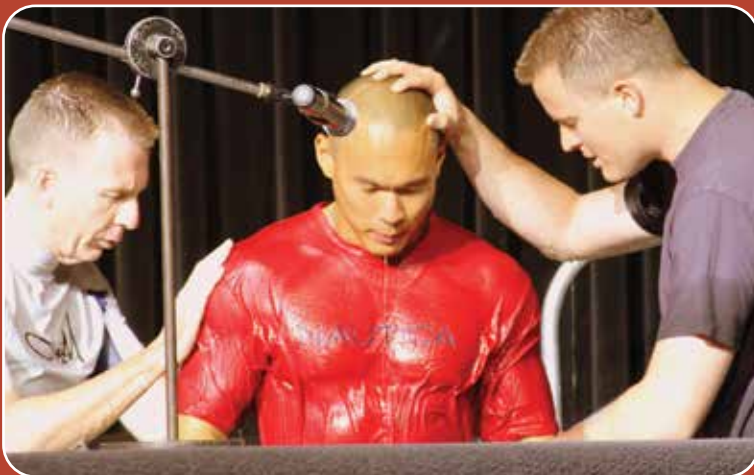

Australia, Mexico, Guam on Pastor Mitchell's itinerary

In January, Pastor Mitchell, along with Pastor Mark Aulson ministered in Mexicali, Mexico in an area-wide men's rally for Pastor Juan Cortez. The rally, organized by Pastor Jose Torres, had a record attendance.

Also in January, Pastor Mitchell travelled to Mexico City for an outstanding crusade ministry for Salvadore Castaneda. These crusades always see hundreds of people saved and many visible miracles of healing. This year was no different as the area churches support them with their churches and pastors. Pastor Jose Torres interpreted. A Pastors Seminar on Saturday morning saw more than 40 pastors present for ministry.

Pastor Mitchell ministered at Pioneer Rallies in Las Vegas, Nevada; Albuquerque, New Mexico; Redlands, California and San Jose, California as these areas and churches

provide a forum for area leadership expression and furnish valuable ministry to people who are often unable to attend a Bible conference.

Pastor Mitchell travelled to Guam, Marianas Islands in early February. After ministering on Thursday night where some 800 people attended, 60 people responded to the call for salvation. Many people were healed, including two who came out of wheelchairs. The next morning Pastor Mitchell lost his voice and Darryl Elliot, assisting pastor from Beechboro, West Australia, who had come to do the followup revival, stepped in to minister. Pastor Mitchell said Pastor Elliot did an outstanding job and was able to continue the crusade with great results as Pastor Mitchell returned home.

Perth, West Australia was the next stop for Pastor Mitchell to

minister in the Australia Leadership Seminars and the Perth area-wide conference. Pastor Mitchell said the conference, under the leadership of Australian overseer Tom Payne, was probably the best conference there in many years.

Pastor Mitchell ministered in Tucson, Arizona for Pastor Harold Warner in a very well attended Area Wide Men's Discipleship Class and a Sunday evening service.

The final stop for Pastor Mitchell this spring was the El Paso, Texas Bible Conference with Pastors Mark Aulson and Greg Mitchell. From there, he travelled to San Antonio, Texas to minister for Pastor Richard Rubi in a Husband and Wife Question and Answer Saturday night. He also ministered in Sunday services and finished off with a Monday night Area Wide Men's Discipleship Class.

She was left to raise her younger brother. This girl grew up alone with no affection from her father who was in prison nor her mother who didn't care much for them. She decided to raise her brother as best as she could. She ended up in a bad relationship,

where her boyfriend also used drugs, and ended up having a baby to raise again by herself. When she met us, she immediately gave her life to Christ, and now she testifies how God filled that emptiness and loneliness in her life. I just thank God for the privilege of being able to minister this wonderful gospel to people in need like this girl.

He showed that despite our physical ability, without Christ, we are all weak. The demonstration, combined with his testimony of how Jesus changed his life resulted in a dozen souls coming to the

in the church. One of the highlights has been The Edge Café.

In our weekly concerts we are seeing revival. Every week people are getting saved at the altar and many times it is five or more conversions along with a real thrust of young people in the church that are powerfully supporting that ministry and rising up to take the reins and start music groups and facilitate weekly dramas. Many times there will be a street meeting that will follow the concert with great reports coming back.

In October we put on Hells Asylum. This was a four-night haunted house. Prior to this year we have been relegated to plays for about four years due to the fact that the city was shutting down our haunted houses. We decided to legalize everything which was no small endeavor. The end result is a legal haunted house for years to come and this past event saw more than 1,700 visitors come through with over 500 decisions and tremendous momentum in the church. We had an overwhelming response from the church and especially from the youth of the church in organizing and being involved each night.

In our pre-meeting that we would have before starting each night the crowd of laborers grew and grew. It is still the talk of the church with everyone still saying they can't wait for the next one. We kicked off 2011 with a tremendous revival with Evangelist Jerry Fussell. This was a timely revival due to the amount of new converts that we have in church. We saw souls saved every night, many filled with the Holy Ghost and healed in their bodies.

We are currently on a fast track towards our 2011 international Bible conference. There is already a buzz in the congregation as we prepare for what we believe will be a powerful time of ministry and church planting.

On the one hand it has been a very trying year on many fronts as a congregation but yet in the midst of it all God has been glorified in saving souls and raising up ministry and disciples. We are very stirred for all that God is doing with great anticipation of what we foresee as a future harvest in our city as well as the cities and nations of the earth.

Greetings from Tempe, Arizona! We are excited to report what God has been doing.

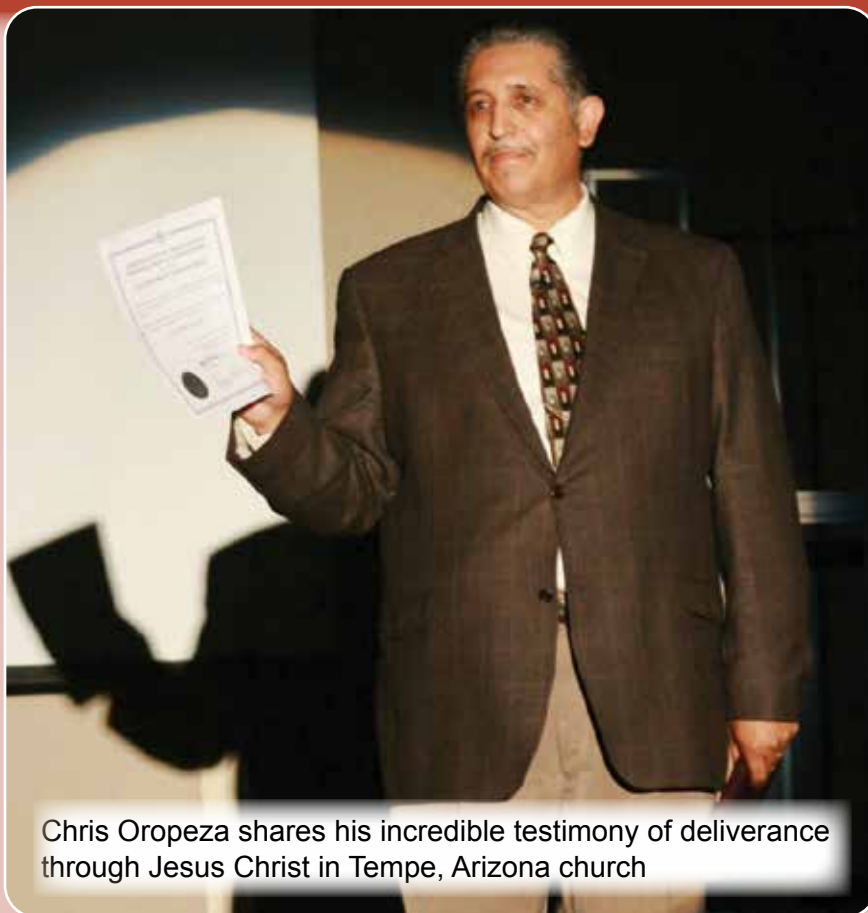

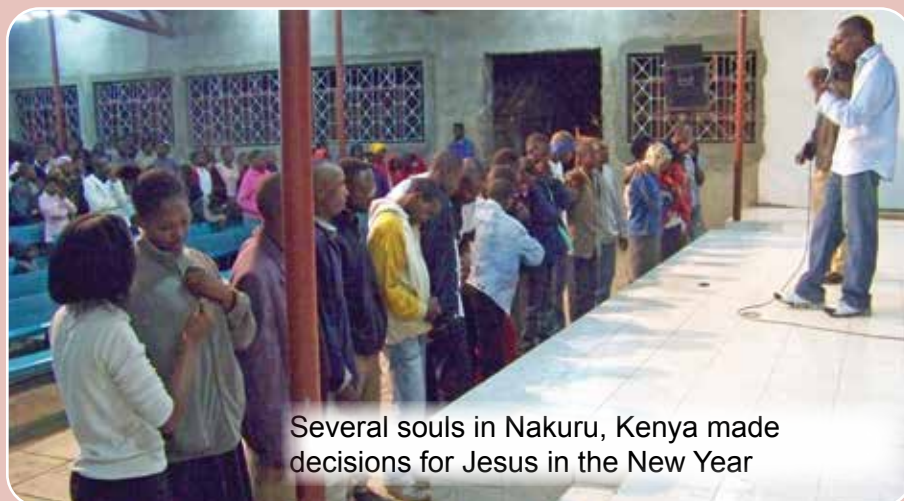
We have been hitting the streets with outreaches, door to door, street preaching and concerts and God had been faithful and lives are being touched and added to the church.

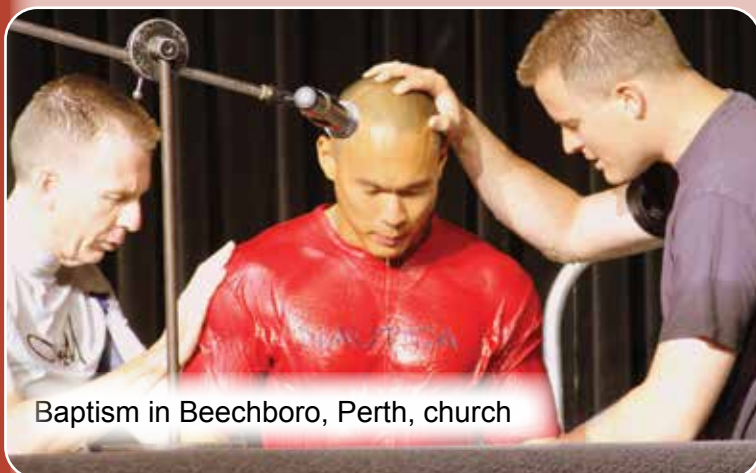
Greetings from the city of Perth, Western Australia.

Pastor Sergei Golubev

Hello friends and colaborers. I just wanted to share some news with you and give God the glory for what He is doing in Russia.

Three and a half years ago I started getting concerned about the situation with drugs here. It has become a very big problem. Recently the chairman of the Russian Drug Control Committee has revealed in his Duma (Russian Senate) report that more than 100,000 young people under 30 die yearly in Russia because of drug-related health issues and overdoses. According to the report 500,000 people were sent to prisons in 5 years because of drug-related crimes. And 30 to 50 percent of all crimes in Russia are drug-related!

I felt that God put a burden on my heart and I started praying and moving in the direction of helping the drug addicts. What has transpired is simply beyond my wildest dreams. Although if I knew then how much it would cost us I am not sure I'd ever move in that direction. But like I said the results are truly glorious.

It first started with one drug addict getting saved. At that point I had no clue of what these people were. I even thought they didn't exist in Vologda, maybe some in bigger cities.

Since we had our building already we decided to turn part of it into a place where they could stay and get sobered up. Basically we started our own version of a rehab center. At first it was like letting a wolf into a sheepfold. They stole our equipment, they slept with our "sisters," they left to never come back after we invested into them time, labor and money.

Numerous times we thought we should stop torturing ourselves and let these drug addicts go to Hell, so tough it was at times. But we kept moving ahead.

I cannot relate due to space and time how God was giving us strength to go on, how we came to discard some ideas

and implement others. First year and a half was fruitless, the last two years are simply glorious.

To make the long story short we have had more than 70 young men and a few young women added to the church in two years. They are saved and washed clean by the Blood of the Lamb!

On top of it we have approximately 100 of them in our baby churches. All of them either went through the rehab or got saved and added to our churches as a result of testimonies of deliverance. Some of them came to our rehab center, got saved here and went back to their cities to serve God. Especially the church in Saint Petersburg, a little over two years old, consists of 99 percent former drug addicts.

We have been moving lately to help our churches implement this version of a rehab center by sending couples of single men - former druggies - into those cities to help pastors get started.

We have been seeing tremendous favor with the government and favor with the people. We have been given free spots for advertisement on the radio and TV, free billboards, free advertisement spots in public buses.

Last week there was a live talk show on one of the local radio stations where two of our disciples preached Jesus Christ for a whole hour and let people know that there is an answer and a hope for their sons and daughters.

A TV station has filmed a documentary about us. We are in the negotiations right now about free use of one of the government-owned buildings. And all of this in a country that is anti-American, anti-West and anti-Protestant.

Former drug addicts make awesome disciples. Initially it is the smartest and the most talented who end up using

drugs. Four of our recent pioneer pastors are the result of this rehab center. Eleven out of 18 Bible study leaders are former drug addicts.

I attached to this letter a story of a girl that has gotten saved. At this time she is married to our rehab center leader. And stories like these one are numerous in our church. We give God all the glory for what he is doing!

I heard Pastor Mitchell say: "Find out what God is doing in your city and join Him." We believe we accidentally tripped over a gold mine. We believe we found that Pearl Jesus was talking about. And we are willing to sell all to get that Pearl. What a satisfaction it is to see that the Gospel works!

Instead of trying to get the religious folks straightened out or the snobs converted - there is a feel of satisfaction that you are actually doing something worthy for the Kingdom.

Testimony: Yana

My name is Yana, and I am 30 years old.

I grew up as a normal child. I went to school and as every girl would I dreamed of love. However, I grew up in a wrong neighbourhood. Soon my friends introduced me to alcohol and I started smoking weed. At the age of 15, I first tried Opium and trashed the next 13 years because Heroin came into my life.

Money was not enough and I started stealing. I was in jail twice, once on probation, but that didn't teach me anything. My mom died when I was serving my first time.

My father tried to help me in the beginning, but lost all hope when I got out of jail and started all over. He cursed me, rejected me and told my young

sister that he never had a daughter. After that he moved away to another city and I didn't see or hear from him for five years.

When I was in jail for the second time, I heard that my younger sister became a prostitute. I wrote her letters trying to convince her to stop, but it was to no avail. Moreover when I got out of prison and needed a dose one time, I met a man that was looking for a prostitute and I sold my own younger sister. I didn't care because I needed drugs.

During one of many overdoses I

and he sees me in a white gown marrying and having a future. I thought, "This guy is totally crazy." I never dreamed of love.

Then I came to church and got saved....

Recently I called my father for the first time and told him I was getting married, and he did not believe me. We never talked for five years. But sure enough, on Jan. 24, 2010, Pastor married me and Evgeni as he had promised.

We had such a beautiful wedding. Many people were crying, listen-

ing to my testimony and that of my husband, who also was a horrible gang member and a drug addict in the past. My sister got saved that day.

When my father saw wedding pictures he called me weeping with

had I fell on the stairs unconscious in our wooden shack where I lived. We had rats and for hours I lay with my face in the rat poison while neighbours carefully stepped over me, hoping I was dead. I do not blame them - I robbed every apartment in that house at least three times - how could I hope for any compassion? One of the old ladies had mercy on me and saved my life.

I was so filled with shame and guilt that I tried to commit suicide several times, but God had another plan.

One time I was downtown and heard a man shout that he was a Heroin addict for 10 years and was free. I frowned in disbelief but then Pastor Golubev came to me and started talking about God's love and forgiveness and hope for my life. I did not care. I had HIV for 10 years and wanted to die. And then Pastor said that God is a God of the impossible

joy. He forgave me and I forgave him. Our relationship is restored - God gave me my father back

God also gave me a wonderful loving husband. I love him too and just know that we will have a wonderful marriage blessed by God.

We thank God for good leadership because the benefits it brings are immense!

The root of some of the good things that we are currently experiencing in our church is directly linked to the prayers, strategy, wisdom and covering provided by Pastor Brown and the

staff here, who have shown their commitment to the raising up of disciples and couples for the harvest field.

One of the strategies implemented has been a regular discipleship meeting on Tuesday mornings with the aim of equipping Bible study leaders and creating an arena for young men to desire leadership.

In addition, we began an Adult Sunday school which has been very instructive and has brought a fresh dimension to our church, as issues of finances, marriage, doctrine and raising children are been looked at "for the equipping of the saints for the work of the ministry" Eph 4:12.

We changed our evangelism strategy on Saturdays; we now meet at 10:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. As a result, we have seen an increase in the saints who come out to evangelise, more people are being reached with the gospel and we are seeing people saved regularly.

We've had a fruitful time since our last report, particularly during the month of December. Our Christmas and New Year's event saw many people saved through our Children's Church Christmas play "The Prince and the Pauper," our New Years Eve service and other services held in that period.

We kick started January by hosting our first ever poetry jam. This was something we had never done before and it was tremendous! This was a night filled with poets who demonstrated lyrical mastery and provided a Christ-centred message. This poetry night highlighted that God is expanding the ministry within his Church and gave an opportunity for new ministers to rise up. Our next one is in February and our desire is that God will build on that and we'll see more people visit and leave gloriously saved.

We are looking forward to all that God has planned for us in 2011 and believe that this first time poetry jam has emphasized that God desires to do new things in the Walthamstow congregation.

We desperately need your prayers so pray without ceasing and I am sure you will hear glorious reports of what God has done in the UK.

**Kathmandu, Nepal

The church here in Kathmandu is doing well since we first opened in May.

We began in our hotel room and within a few weeks had 10 people regularly attending. In June, five of those went to Biratighar, the second largest city in Kathmandu, and are still living for God and waiting for one of our own to come and pioneer a church there. We are in touch weekly and helping them with materials.

We've been reaching people from various castes and walks of life and the Nepalis are very open. We're av-

eraging 14 solid with visitors almost every service. As in other places, if they all came at the same time we'd be packed out. Our actual membership is 25-27. We have a band now, and the potential for another band. We have music classes with six students learning guitar, piano and drums. The language barrier is there but with my Nepali and BB's English we're able to minister effectively. We have prayer Monday through Friday from 7-8 a.m. and Bible Study on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8-8:45 a.m. That averages 10-11. On our first outreach we had 11 people help us pass out flyers.

There have been a number of notable healings, from scoliosis to high blood pressure. Several families have also applied Christian principles to their finances and seen remarkable increases. This has caused their extended family to take notice. One of our

original converts had driven a cab for 20 years but sold his car and is opening a meat shop.

We're working with three other couples who are currently not saved but who are very interested in what Christianity is all about. The country has no evident Christian influence and 99 percent of the people know nothing about Jesus Christ except what they've heard from a TV, hostile government, or possibly a relative.

These are an industrious people with very few beggars, and the tourist is their main source of income. Foreigners are treated with deference and the country is remarkably safe. While the political situation is tense, the common people go about their business and for the time being we have no opposition to our work.

Prescott Testimony: Steve and Kathy Garfield

Kathy Garfield: In June 1969 my mother, sister, brother and I moved to Prescott, Arizona to get away from the smog of San Bernardino, California. Little did Mom know that this change was all a part of God's plan for us. I began a life, at the tender age of 14, of drinking and hanging out with the druggies, thinking I was being totally accepted and finding my niche in life.

Every Friday and Saturday night was spent looking for a way to get high, often going to dances at the local VFW hall or the Armory, sometimes just hanging out at the plaza or in the woods. Many nights I came home and would fall asleep weeping as this huge emptiness was in my life. I tried different ways to fill it even to the point of losing my virtue at age 15 yet still feeling so very lonely.

In October 1970, my sister and I were on our way to the drive-in movies after finding a guy to buy us two six-packs of beer to take with us. She was speeding down the street and we were pulled over and arrested for underage drinking.

bought our beer was wanted for murder and I had picked his face out of a mug book, so surprised his picture was in there. He was picked up, arrested and hung himself in jail before he could go to trial. A second guy was arrested and went to prison for the murder. My life was a bummer.

Two weeks later, mother went to a Foursquare Church (now The Potter's House Christian Center) and gave her heart to Jesus. Mom invited me to a music concert at the local Boy's Club to hear a rock band. That night my boyfriend and I both got saved. The love of Jesus totally gripped my heart and I realized that my sin of total rejection of Jesus and His blood sacrifice was sending me to an eternity without God. I don't ever remember hearing the gospel preached in such a clear way. I responded to God's love, hungry for

forgiveness. He changed my life and has been with me through life's trials and blessings for more than 40 years now.

I met my husband Steve at church in 1974, a week after a bunch of us girls had joined together in prayer for God to supply us husbands. What a joy! We married a few months later in a Jesus People Wedding wanting God to be the center of our lives, the head of our home. We celebrated 37 years of marriage in April 2011. God has been good to us.

In February 2010 our son was diagnosed with a mixoid lipo sarcoma (cancer) in one calf. Two months later I was diagnosed with Breast Cancer. It has been a wild ride of doctors, tests and surgeries but through it all God has been there and carried us through. It was a great trial but I discovered His word and promises are all oh, so very true! The body of Christ came together and prayed for me and our son, some even fasted. What a wonderful thing! The Pastors and congregation provided meals, finances and their love and concern. I cannot express the gratitude Steve and I, and our family, feel for everyone's prayers and kindnesses. I am now cancer free as is our son, with all the praise and glory to our Father above and thankfulness to His people.

Steve Garfield: I've been a part of the Potter's House Church in

Prescott, Arizona since December, 1973. I'd like to tell you a little about my life and how I came to be where I am today.

I had just turned 18 when I left my home town in Pennsylvania and headed to a new adventure

as a student at Prescott College. I hoped to leave behind the hurt of a broken home and the habits that made me feel dirty inside and the old life that seemed headed nowhere fast.

When I graduated from high school I spent my last summer in Pennsylvania at my father's girlfriend's house before heading west. I hoped that a change of scenery would help me get a handle on my life. But I found that I was the same no matter where I lived. I hated school and wanted to leave but my family urged me to stick it out, so I stayed. It was at Prescott college that some things began to happen that I never planned to happen.

I met a girl at school who was from back east and we became buds. She was the one who first told me about a Christian coffee house in Prescott that she had been to earlier. It sounded cool so one night we went to check it out. I had never been in a real church before where people lifted their hands and spoke in tongues and talked to God like they knew Him. I was stunned and oddly felt drawn to what was happening.

I didn't know any better and so I told everyone that I was saved. But I knew I wasn't. We went a few more times that fall with other kids from school. But the last time I went was the night when everything in my life changed forever. It was a typical music scene, with live music and personal testimonies and preaching

at the end. After many appeals from the preacher I lifted my hand, went forward, and prayed to ask Jesus to come into my life and save me. And He did! I was born again and baptized in the Holy Spirit on Dec. 8, 1973. Suddenly my life had purpose and meaning and direction.

After winter break I came back to Prescott and dropped out of college. I moved into a home filled with single guys, all new converts. I started attending the Foursquare church in Prescott. What a joyous exciting time that was. I met new friends, got involved in a band playing country gospel music, and met my wife Kathy Ballard all in a short time. Imagine a young ex-hippie from a broken home getting married to a stranger he had only known a couple of weeks. I was 18, Kathy had just turned 19, and we were married by Pastor Mitchell in a Sunday night service during a revival meeting in April, 1974.

Pastor Mitchell invited us to be Door (Prescott's then music/drama ministry) directors in 1977 and later that year we began our adventure in pursuing pastoral ministry. We pastored in Chandler, Arizona and La Junta, Colorado before making an ill advised move to Pennsylvania. But we later pastored in Lancaster, Pennsylvania before returning to Arizona. After several more fits and starts, the final one being in Bellingham, Washington, we finally decided that it was time to come home. So with Pastor Mitchell's blessing we came home to stay in Prescott in 1994.

Recent years have seen many ups and downs for us, failures and victories, and always redemption and forgiveness and restoration. We are so blessed to continue to be a part of the Potter's House in Prescott under pastor Mitchell. Even through these recent bouts of infirmity for Kathy and unemployment for me we have been helped and sustained over and over again by God and His wonderful people. By the grace of God we stand, still married, still saved, and still hanging on to the promises of God.
