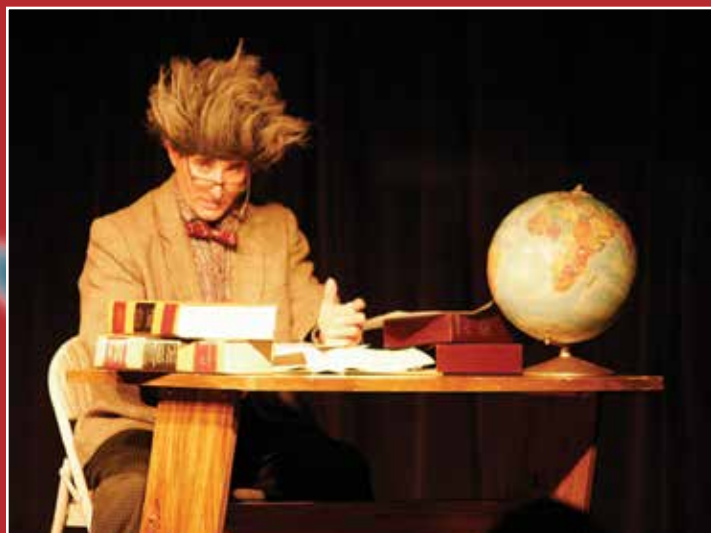

Where does the time go? The Prescott church is so busy and God is moving so much that from time to time we have to stop and look back at what has been happening here with the Prescott church.

We highlighted our fall season by hosting Rod Gibson for a week of revival and ministry in October. He came in early to minister to young Fellowship kids in a Youth Extreme on the Saturday. We had kids from all over Arizona here with about 300 in attendance in the morning. After Brother Gibson preached to them we saw 20 get baptized in the Holy Spirit. Then the Spirit-charged youth went out to evangelize in the local area. That night they all converged on One80 for music and preaching again. All told they prayed with 41 new converts to be saved. Then we headed into a week of revival and saw great ministry to the local saints and visitors who responded to the gospel every night.

We have been blessed to have Steve and Jeanie Bowman with us as evangelists for the past few years. But we sent them out recently to Federal Way Washington to replace Adam and Jennifer Porter who are moving on to other pastoral opportunities. We will miss the Bowmans in Prescott but are grateful they were with us as long as they were.

Our Home Fellowship groups start up once the summer outreach season ends. These are wonderful times

of small group ministry to both encourage the saints and to give disciples opportunity to be involved in real ministry. We hold these meetings in homes throughout the

tri city area all winter long.

Our Halloween outreach at One80 was a gargantuan effort involving over 40 people in the production. Louie Paulino puts together a great team of actors and technicians who spend many hours to put on a hard hitting performance. We see more than 500 people come through the Haunted House. Visitors of every kind, from church people to the crazy Halloween party crowd, stand in the cold waiting their turn. Over the three night run we had cards on 133 who raised their hands and said a sinners prayer at the end of a performance.

As I write this our pastor and a large group of fellow saints are on a tour of the land of Israel. It is a great blessing and a valuable benefit for our pastor to go there and for some from the Prescott church also to participate. We look forward to hearing the insights our pastor gains on these trips.

It seems odd to be writing a Trumpet report with no mention of a conference coming up or just ended. But we'll be plenty busy between now and January Conference.

Everything from our annual Thanksgiving in-gathering service for the poor to our continued efforts at One80 in outreach and evangelism keeps us busy.

The Prescott church has addicted itself to the ministering to the saints and to reaching out to lost souls every where we can.

Pastor Wayman Mitchell completed an extensive itinerary this past Fall.

Pastors Greg and Wayman Mitchell conducted Men's Rallies daily with both men and women nightly in the Walthamstow Town Hall in London, England. The auditorium and balcony was filled each night. Greg and Pastor Mitchell packed three days and nights into what has become a highlight for the United Kingdom churches.

In a powerful tent miracle crusade for Pastor Martin Klok in Amersfort, Holland about 1,100 people filled the tent, and many instant miracle healings took place. Score of first time decisions for Jesus were recorded. At the close Pastor Mitchell ministered in the Zwolle church and two days in the International Bible Conference in the Zwolle Convention Center.

A Navajo Nation Rally in September at Chinle, Arizona brought a full house at Pastor Artie Aragon's new enlarged auditorium with a glorious testimony of what God is doing in the Navajo Nation.

A miracle crusade in Norfolk, Virginia for Pastor Carlos Morales, crusades in Glendale, Arizona for Pastor Gary Marsh, crusades in Las Vegas, Nevada,

Redlands, California, as well as Las Vegas, New Mexico Harvester's Homecoming, a miracle crusade in Almeria, Spain and National Conference in Chilliwack, Canada filled out the September calendar.

Bible conferences in San Antonio, Texas for Richard Rubi, as well as a Bible conference in South London for Peter Ajala and a Men's Rally in San Diego, California on the return trip rounded out the October agenda.

In November the San Luis, Mexico Conference, with a stopover in the Jacksonville, North Carolina Area Wide Bible Conference preceded another trip to Walthamstow International Bible Conference in England.

Pastor Mitchell then hosted 155 people from South Africa, England, Holland, Australia, Canada, Mexico, Spain, Fiji Islands, and the United States in a wonderful Bible Lands Tour which was blessed with perfect weather.

Pastor's Sermon Making Workshops put a cap on a busy Fall for Pastor Mitchell, not to mention there were several Men's Discipleships and one night engagements speaking and preaching, and pastoring in the Prescott church.

‘Four tales of Christmas:’ 4 people,

December in Prescott brings the annual Courthouse Lighting ceremony and with it thousands of people in need of the Gospel. On Saturday, December 4 the One80 presented a play directed by Louie Paulino titled, “4 Tales of Christmas Long Ago.”

The tales of the Shepherd (Matt Sanderlin), Mary (Jennifer Ciaccio), the Wiseman (Louie Paulino) and the General (Bruce Cutter) were told in their own words to a packed house with many visitors. Between each monologue an acapella quartet with Brian DeBlois, Daniel McCarty, Katie Scherer and Briana Mazon delighted the audience with traditional carols.

The Shepherd (a cowboy who took a job tending sheep) told of the wonderful night on the plains when the darkness was broken open by a great light as the Angel came to him and his two companions to tell them of the Savior’s birth in Bethlehem. They were overwhelmed by the host of heaven singing and glorifying God and immediately went to town to find the Child. He told of finding the baby amongst the animals and feeling his guilt at coming to Him dirty and smelling of sheep. However, when Jesus looked at him, he felt cleansed and a grace to forgive his misdeeds came to him.

Mary’s tale of being a young Jewish girl betrothed to Joseph and having an Angel come and tell her that she would become pregnant before the marriage was touching as she recounted her feelings when “the popsicle stick turned blue” and she had to try to explain to her mother, Joseph and her father. She told of the trip to Bethlehem for the census and giving birth in a stable. Her recounting of both His life and then of a mother’s grief from

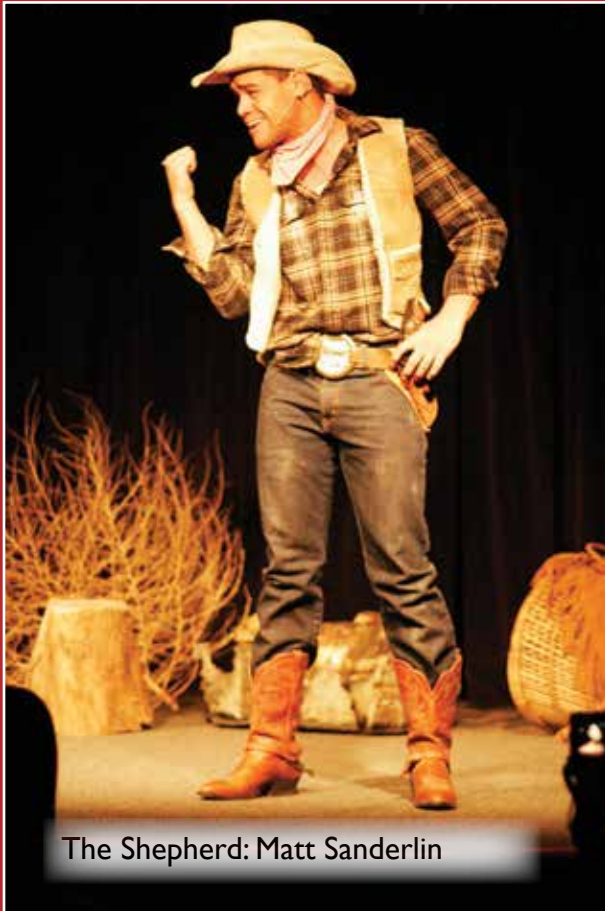
His death on the cross touched the hearts of all those in attendance.

The Wiseman took time from studying the scriptures to tell of the star that appeared. He knew that this could only be the star of a great king and he and his two friends hit Nieman-Marcus for gifts and follow the star to find the King. His tale takes them to Jerusalem and Herod’s palace where they are directed to Bethlehem to search for the place a king would be born: five star hotels, golf resorts, Starbucks and finally, they arrive at the stable of a humble inn. There they present their gifts and return home away from Herod as the angel directs them. His devotion to showing people that this child was the Christ through the prophecies of scripture has filled his life since then.

The General’s tale of being a Roman soldier and following orders even when your conscience goes against it was poignant. His assignment as a young recruit to go to Bethlehem and slaughter children because of Herod’s fear and then decades later, as a commanding officer, to be given the task of scourging and crucifying the very man they had tried to kill as a child. He told of his company guarding the tomb because Herod and the priests feared Him even after He was dead, a light shining down, and the stone being rolled away, and the Man rising from the tomb. He was paid to lie about the events but he believed in his heart this was the Son of God.

Tim Miller gave an anointed altar call and 12 people responded. We are privileged to have the venue and opportunity to spread the good news during the Christmas season. We thank God for His continuing grace at One80 in saving souls.

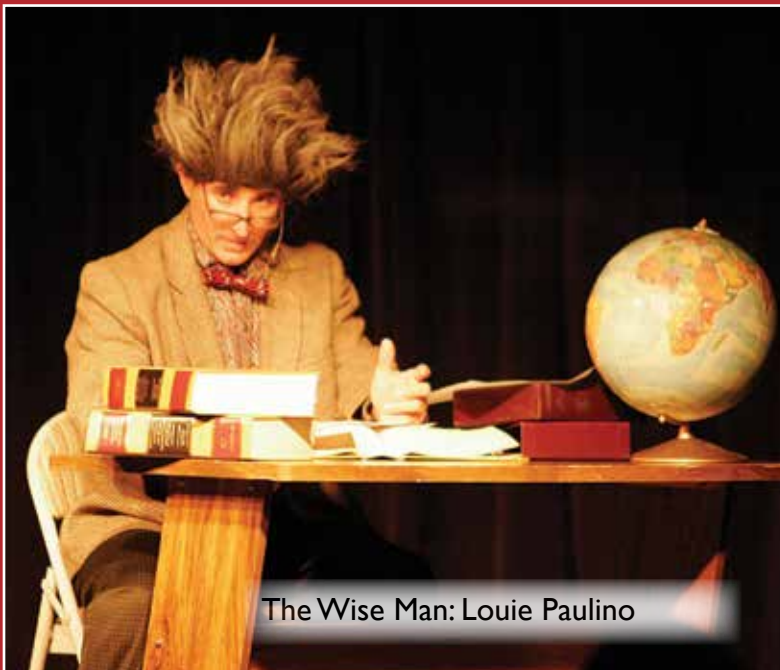

Our annual Memorial Day parade was a smashing success this year. Hello and greetings from the Great Northwest. My wife Rane and I pastor the church in Lakewood, Washington. We've been here for two and a half years now, and we've seen the church grow at a rapid rate.

Right after our June conference in 2010 we returned to Lakewood and walked right into a baptism. We baptized 18 people in a local swimming pool.

Our mother church in Tucson sent us an Invasion team in July. We put together the Judgement Play for three performances. Pastor Chayo Perez did a followup revival, and we saw 127 saved.

We have been picking up momentum in our outreaches. We average about 25 saints showing up for the outreaches, and they are seek and save missions. At the same time we are still sending Guerilla teams to other area churches that need our help, even as far as Yakima, which is three and a half hours away.

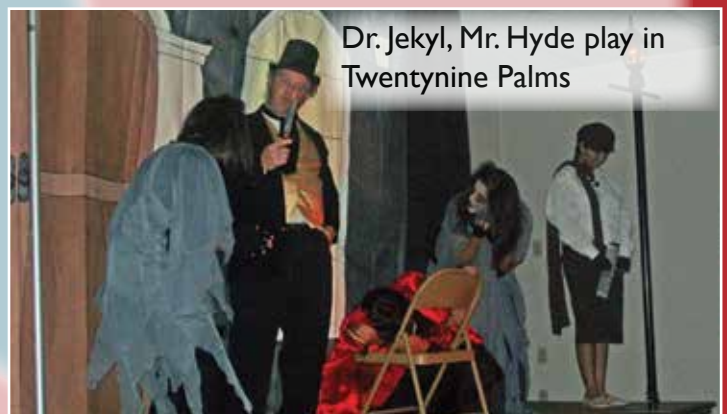

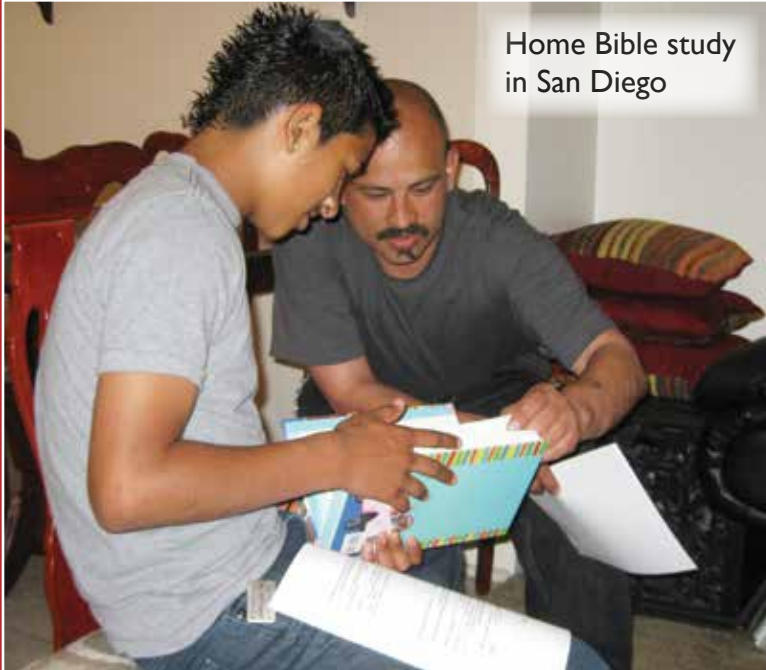

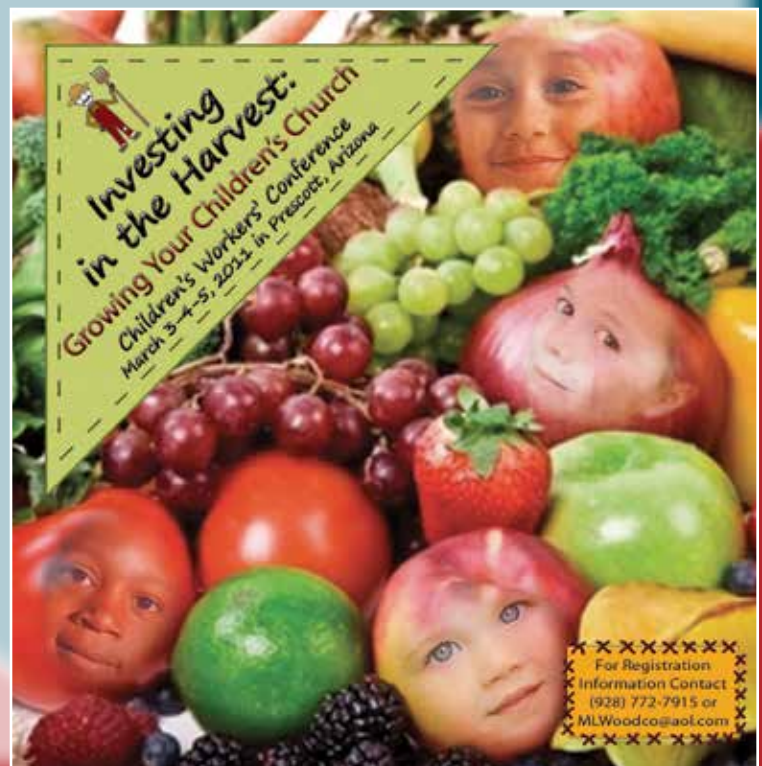
Couples are restoring their marriages and youths are getting back to Jesus, showing them that it doesn't matter how hard they have been treated, it's not God's fault.

As we continue to witness and get souls for the Kingdom of God, keep on praying for us as we need you. We always pray for our Fellowship around the world. God bless you.

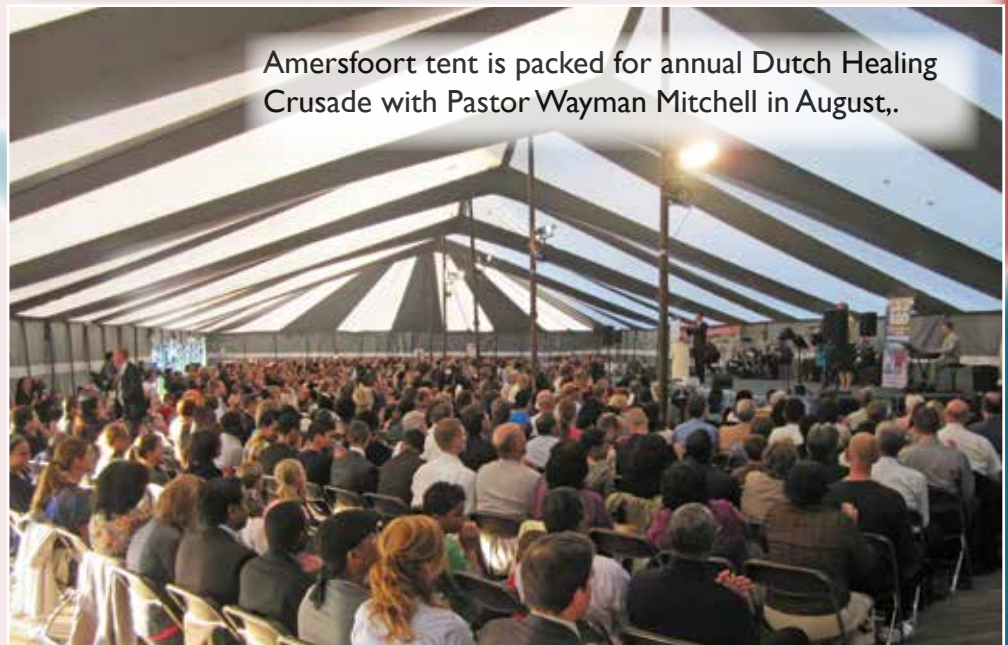

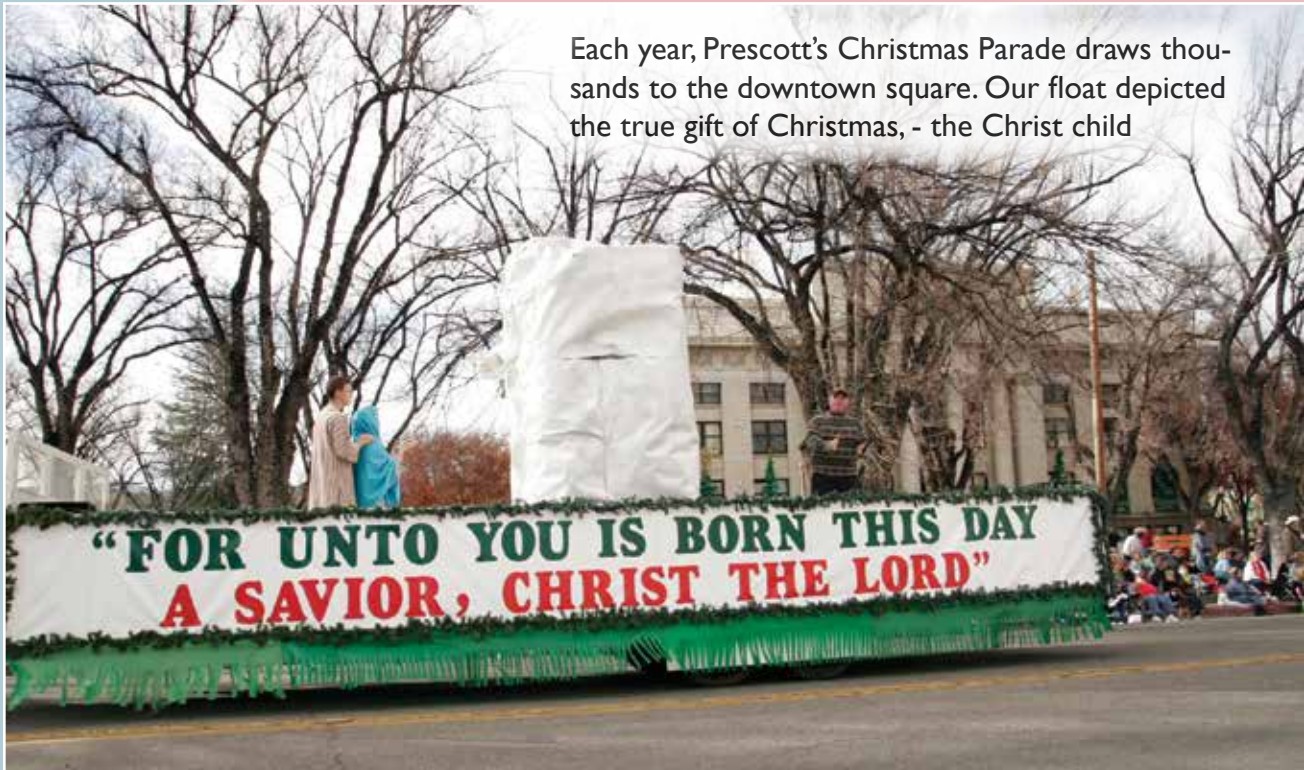

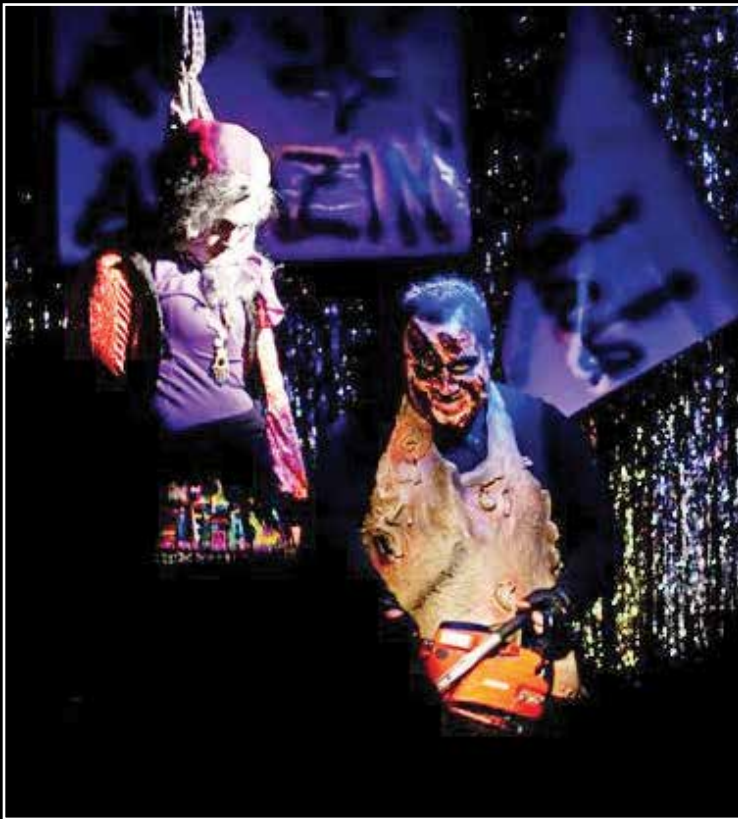


HAUNTED HOUSE: A GRAPHIC
