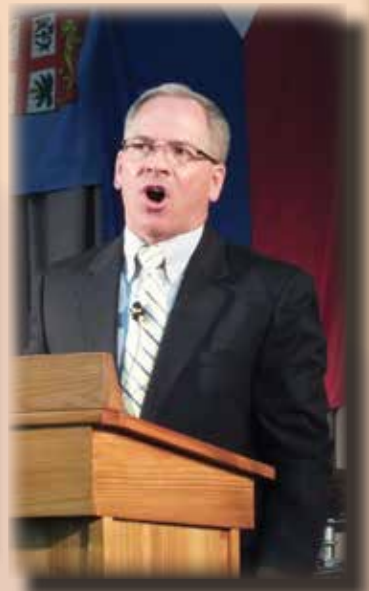

We continue the tradition of Monday night Courthouse plaza outreaches under the direction of Josh Wright and continue to see new people saved through that.

We were blessed to have Evangelist Kris Hart for a time of ministry. He ministered to the teens in a Youth Extreme and then ministered to the church in a week-long revival meeting. The kids prayed with 32 souls on outreach and Kris ministered timely messages and timely words to the saints.

Our Guerrilla teams continue to spend their own time and money to take the Gospel to cities around Arizona. We sent a team to Surprise, AZ and it was quite a unique group. Eighth graders like Trevor Wohlwend joined with senior citizens like Noel Tossing (no offense meant, Noel!) and they prayed with 26 people to be saved. The kids prayed with more people than even seasoned outreach veteran Gary Basham did!

We just finished our annual Native American Day. We were blessed by the ministry of Pastor Artie Aragon in both services and by the Chinle Choir in the evening. I think even the fry bread was blessed by the Chinle ladies who made it for us. God is moving among the tribal people in North America and the Aboriginal peoples of Australia.

Afterword is the great redemptive word that Pastor Mitchell ministered to us. It speaks of God's great grace and mercy. It is why the Prescott church is still on the front lines of Kingdom enlargement in 2012.

We kicked off our summer with a revival with Evangelist Kris Hart in May. His messages to the Gallup church were anointed and encouraged the saints.

Our "Party in the Park" outreaches started on Memorial Day and have continued every other Monday throughout the summer. One-on-one evangelism, new converts sharing their testimonies about the life changing power of Jesus Christ, live music, and free hot-dogs and sodas, made these outreaches very fruitful. We've seen many people making decisions for Jesus at the end of each night.

On Saturdays, we have our iRock music scene. We've recently moved to a new location, downtown Gallup. The City has several activities on some Saturday nights, mainly the "Arts Crawl" event. Many people come out and walk through the main street and looking at art work and displays. Most of them hear the live music coming from the iRock and, curiously, come in. Many respond to the invitation for salvation.

We've also taken the iRock ministry on the road in July to our baby church in Page, Arizona. Pastor Steve Annichiarico reserved the main park in Page to set up a "Party in the Park" music scene. Earlier in the day we went door-to-door throughout the city inviting people to the live concert, free award-winning frybread, soda, and to the revival scheduled that week with Pastor Serafico Saavadra. But right in the midst of the main event, the Saturday morning "Ceremonial" downtown parade, with thousands of people in attendance, Pastor Patrick Johnson preached a powerful message to youths who came out from several surrounding churches to participate in the "Extreme Impact" outreach. Immediately following the alter call the youths and the church were sent out into the crowd to preach the gospel, witness, and invite people to the iRock for a concert with Pastor Johnson.

The music scene was so packed that many of the churches and their youth had to stand outside on the sidewalks so guests could be seated. At the end of the short concert about 30 invited guests answered the call for salvation. Glory to God!

After the morning concert, the impact teams went door-to-door, evangelizing, witnessing, and inviting people to a second concert at the park with Pastor Johnson. The whole day was amazingly fruitful and by the end of

the night a total of 92 people were saved!

A year passed by and I started to experiment with drugs and alcohol. I start-

ed going out with guys but that didn't get me anywhere. I still had that emptiness in my heart. At the age of 13 I was sexually abused and sexually assaulted by one of my sister's friends. After that I hated myself even more. I felt used and worthless. I started avoiding everyone around me, my friends and family. I hated everybody that I knew.

I started getting rebellious against my mom. I would curse at her and it got to the point where I ended up getting in fist fights with her. At age 14 I got tired of being angry with the world. I wanted to have joy in my life and happiness but I didn't know how to get that. I started to be nice to my brother, sisters and my mother but the more I tried the more it backfired on me. I didn't know what else to do.

I remember waking up one Wednesday morning to get ready for school and I had this joy that lasted the whole day. When I got home I called my uncle and asked if he could pick me up for church. That Wednesday night service I ended up repenting from my sins and I accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior.

A couple months passed and I noticed a change in my life. I stopped doing drugs, alcohol, pills, cursing, boys and partying. I started obeying my mother. I started going to school and I was making an effort to get my life straight. For the first time in my life I felt true joy and peace in my heart.

I have been saved almost for a year now and it has been the greatest time of my life. God has truly done a miracle in my life. I don't know what my future holds but what I do

know is that in the good times and bad times, God will always make a way for me to get through anything. So I encourage you to accept Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. He Is the Light, He is the Way and with him you will find true joy and happiness. He will never leave you or abandon you. He will always be right by your side. Accepting Christ into your heart is one of the smartest decisions you will ever make in your life.

2012 has been a wonderful year for us! We started February with Pastor Harold Booysen from Namibia for revival. He brought the fire of the Holy Ghost with him and gave us a powerful meeting.

While he was here, Pastor Booysen helped us in organizing our first drama team and rap group. He taught them a skit, made a devil mask, and away they went.

We held one of the services outside in front of our building with almost 400 in attendance. The rap group and drama team performed before the preaching and in the end we had over 100 responding to the altar call and more than 200 saved throughout the revival.

In April Pastor Dennis Akumu came from Kenya to help us. Again, we took one of the services outside and drew very large crowds with nearly 75 responding for salvation! Pastor Akumu ministered richly and it was a blessing to have him.

In May our lease expired and as the owner had other plans for the building, we were forced to move.

We initially found a location a short distance away in a school auditorium. That lasted a few months but after a complaint by one of the faculty members that a church was meeting in their school, we were on the hunt again.

Within one week we found a large meeting hall in the school next door. God has given us favor with the director and he is very pleased to have us. We were able to obtain a four-year contract at a fraction of the cost we were originally paying, allowing our church to be self-supporting for the first time.
