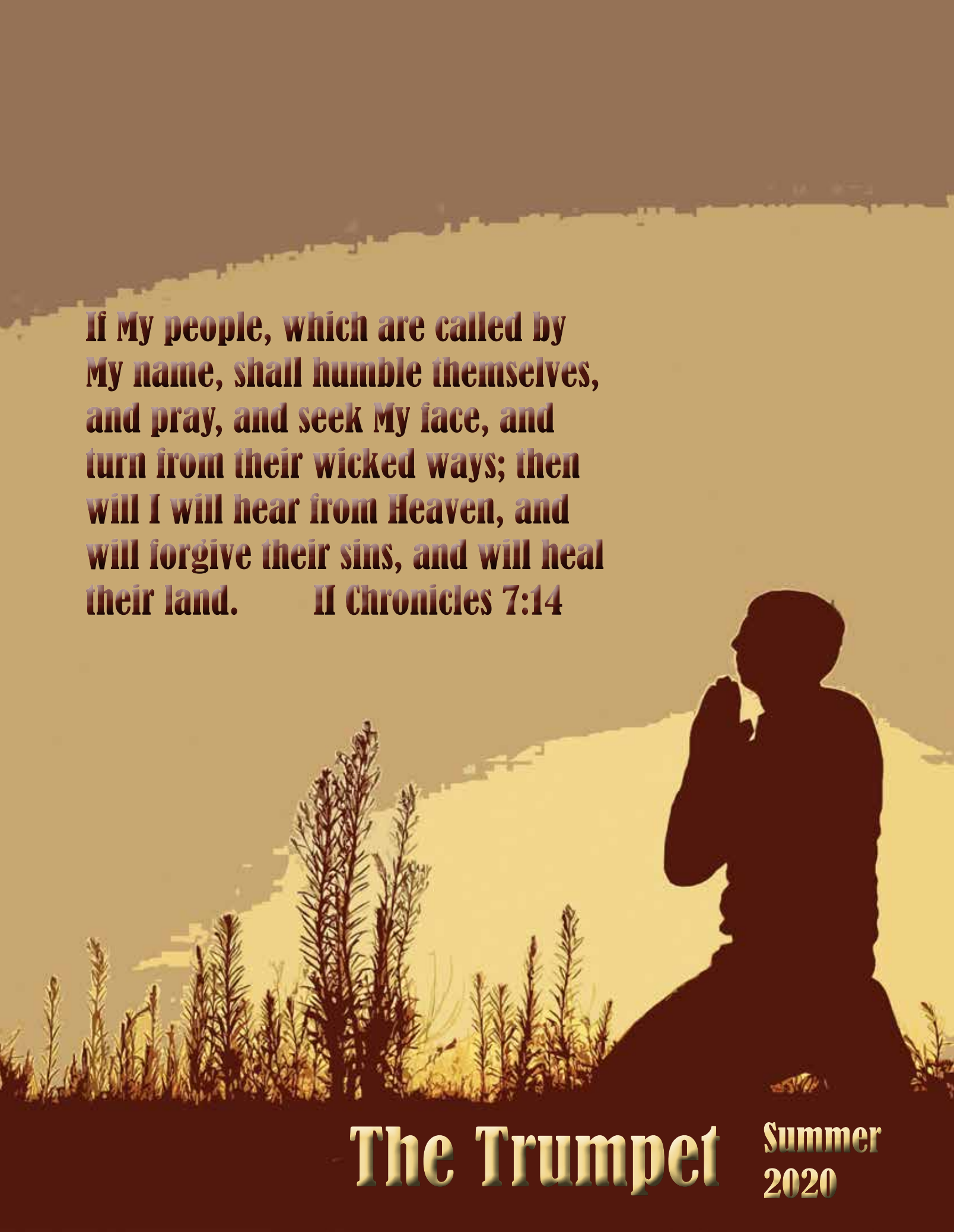

Greetings from the Prescott church!

These past six months have truly been like no other. The Covid-19 virus has turned this world upside down, but in turn has opened the hearts of many people to God. In the midst, we're going through a time of sadness as our founding Pastor Wayman Mitchell is experiencing failing health.

In 1970 Pastor and the late Sister Nelda along with their family came to Prescott in the midst of the Jesus People revival. Pastor Mitchell welcomed the young hippies who came in and got saved, and the rest is history. Over the past 50 years, FIFTY!, we are astonished at what God has done through our precious pastor and those who have been saved and served God in the past five decades. More than 2,600 churches worldwide are filled with people changed and delivered by Jesus Christ. Nothing has energized Pastor Mitchell more than seeing people saved, healed and changed by Jesus, and he has traveled tirelessly worldwide to preach that Gospel.

Pastor Greg Mitchell told us during a recent church service that Pastor Mitchell has been in failing health for some months and is nearing the end of his incredible ministry.

Please be in prayer for Pastor Mitchell, and the Mitchell family during this time. Please be particularly in prayer for Pastor Greg for wisdom and judgement as he makes decisions for our Fellowship during this time.

Pastor Greg has been our regular pastor for several years now, allow-



ing Pastor Mitchell to pour himself out worldwide preaching in crusades and discipleship ministry. Our Fellowship is in good hands.

Like most churches across the world, our normal church services, concert scenes, outreaches and Bible studies were forced to be put on hold. This opened up the door to some new creative ways to reach the lost through evangelism.

"Quarantine Concerts" was our online alternative to the usual One80 music scene we put on every Saturday. People tuned in weekly to watch the concerts, and it was a great way to share the Gospel.

Although our weekly door-to-door evangelism was not able to function like it normally would, our outreach director Zach Snyder and other disciples in the church would go to Walmart and other places where they were allowed, and one-on-one witness. Others from the church held weekly street preaching at a busy intersection in Prescott, and through one-on-one witnessing they were able to lead sinners to Christ.

During the quarantine Pastor Jesse Morales preached two series of sermons during the week on topics such as depression, anxiety, and fear,

and one on marriage. These turned out to be very fruitful and encouraging sermons for both the congregation and brand new converts.

It was encouraging to hear and see families and visitors continue to meet during the quarantine. Members of our congregation opened up their houses to friends and family as they were able to come and par-

ticipate in Livestreamed services. Others were able to send links to those who were unable to join in person. Through all of the outreach and added Livestream events, we have seen a total of 62 decisions made for Christ, with many coming into church once the doors were reopened.

Out of those decisions made, 10 were backsliders who surrendered their lives back to Christ.

Though many during this time are afraid and unsure, and hesitant to be approached and witnessed to, there are others who are desperately searching for answers during this time of shaking. We are so excited as the quarantine is starting to lift and doors are beginning to open once again.

Our first concert scene will be held this week, and we will be able to have outreaches in the park. We are excited about the new opportunities we have as people search for hope. Our prayer as a congregation and as a Fellowship is that revival would break forth as never before.

Though times are hard, God has us in His hands, and we are looking forward to seeing come to pass all that He has promised.

Please continue to pray for us as we pray for you.

Greetings all from Austin, Texas! We write this report giving all praise and glory to our awesome, wonderful creator, and Savior Jesus Christ!

I was told at 21 years of age I would have a high likelihood that I would never get pregnant. But praises to God, He had the final say so. Three months after our wedding, on Mother's Day, we found out I was pregnant!

Pregnancy was going pretty good. I had to deal with all day sickness, and carpal tunnel. But knowing there was a precious little soul growing in me made every trip to the bathroom, every numb and painful hand movement worth it! He was a prayer that I had prayed for and I was excited to be able to be this child's mama.

On October 1, 2019 I was 23 weeks pregnant. I felt a sudden gush of fluid. I thought it was a normal pregnancy thing. The following day I had noticed I had continued to pass small amounts of fluid and I had some mild cramping. I made an appointment to be checked. I was told I was leaking amniotic fluid and I was in the early stages of labor. I was rushed to labor and delivery.

Once admitted I was given a steroid shot to strengthen my baby's lungs, brain, and intestines. We prepared for the worst, if labor couldn't be stopped we were having a baby that night. The doctors did not have high hopes of him surviving. Our Pastor paid us a visit that night and prayed over the baby, and myself. I had been so scared and worried. But the peace of God entered that room and I was ready to face whatever was going to happen.

Praise God, after two days labor was stopped! Baby still had plenty of fluid to move around in. It was then

we were told that I was moving into the hospital until the baby came, we were trying to keep him in 'til 27 weeks. I was on bed rest.

Fast forward to one week later. On October 7, I once again noticed mild cramping. But was told it was just my body making room for the baby as he was still growing normally. The doctor told me that I would know if it was something else because I would find myself breathing through it.

Later that night around 2:15 a.m., I awoke and noticed I was cramping more. It was coming in waves at about 10 minutes apart and then it was five minutes. I called a nurse and by the time the baby was found on the monitor the contractions were two minutes apart. I was in full labor. Everything happened so quickly, I was rushed away for an emergency c-section.

Jeremiah L. Ramsey was born on October 8, 2019, at 4:46 a.m. He was 24 weeks gestation. He weighed two lbs. exactly and was 13 inches long. When he was delivered he let out the smallest little whimper as they quickly wrapped him and intubated him. Hearing that whimper gave me hope that he was going to make it.

The following days, weeks, and eventually months were very trying. We were blessed to attend a healing service with Pastor Paul Stephens. After service that night Pastor Stephens prayed for God's divine inter-

vention and healing for Jeremiah.

Jeremiah was intubated and on a ventilator for the first month. We prayed he'd be taken off. And when he was taken off he had some struggle. We almost lost him one evening after he had been trying to breath on his own for 12 hours.

After 105 days in the NICU Jeremiah got to come home with us on January 21, 2020. He was released on oxygen for retinopathy (a thickening of the blood vessels) in both eyes. If the thickening could not be reversed it would lead to blindness.

We prayed and asked our church to pray with us for a miracle for Jeremiah's eyes. Along with the retinopathy, he was diagnosed with pulmonary disease. And was expected to get off oxygen at some point when he was older.

There was improvement. We were told in a month we could try no more oxygen, but God had other plans. A week after seeing his pulmonologist. Jeremiah pulled his nasal cannula off. We just so happened to be out of supplies. But he was breathing 100 percent on his own, and has been since with no issues!

Shortly after we brought Jeremiah home we noticed a mass on his back. The pediatrician was concerned it could be a tumor of some sort after having had patients with similar masses. We prayed for him and again it ended up thankfully not being any-

thing to be concerned about.

The list could go on and on of all the things that were expected to be “wrong” with our son. But every single thing that we prayed for and asked healing for, God answered that prayer.

Today, Jeremiah is almost eight months old. Though “technically” he is almost five months old. He has overcome every expectation of a preemie baby the doctors could have! He is growing and developing marvelously.

We thank God for giving the doctors, and nurses the knowledge and guidance to help Jeremiah go in the right direction. And we thank God for our Pastor and our church for praying for us, and with us!

God is wonderful and so faithful. We thank him for entrusting us with being Jeremiah’s mother and father. God truly is glorious and is worthy of ALL the praise and glory!

Prior to our city-wide Covid-19 guidelines in mid-March (that began shutting things down quickly), our church had a tremendous revival with Pastor Rick Martinez, as we saw many visitors come to salvation. This was no doubt a timely revival, as the very next week we were on “shelter-in-place.”

At this point we needed to be creative in presenting the gospel through the “New Normal.”

Riding this wave of revival, our church folks were able to have bible studies via Zoom, as we were studying Pastor Greg Mitchell’s “Defending the Rapture.” This was a timely study as it caused a great stir and had many family members (who typically don’t attend services) “zooming in!”

In addition, our live-stream sermons were also interpreted in Span-

ish and American Sign Language.

The meme “my pastor became a TV evangelist overnight,” seemed to come true, but hopefully not for long. Since nobody was receiving flyers, we also had outreaches (wearing masks and conducting social distancing), promoting (with banners) stay in your car “Prayer Lines.”

We have also had to be creative in follow-up. We got giant stick on notes and placed scriptures and a bag of doughnuts and muffins on many doors (especially for Mother’s Day).

Many were encouraged and thankful during “shelter in place,” with this as we practiced our “essential services,” with a kind gesture of hope.



We have had several members in our congregation get sick with the Coronavirus, but through a miracle of God they have all recovered and been healed in Jesus Name!

It was a Sunday morning in March, and the parking lot of the Blythe Potter’s House sat empty.

Instead of greeting worshipers, we had to contact them via text or phone calls to explain to anyone who might not have heard that services are now online only, at least until the threat of Covid-19 has passed.

Inside, the church was closed. The sanctuary no longer resounded with congregants singing or children racing to Sunday school. For a church whose stated mission is “Changing lives, Making disciples, Reaching the world,” waiting took on a whole new meaning.

Our church buckled down and tried something new. We went online only. It was frustrating and intimidating but we wanted to show our community that “with church doors shutting across America, it is time for us to show that the church has never been about the building.”

Despite our church doors shutting, the faithful saints of the Blythe congregation rose up, galvanized, and continued to facilitate the work of God.

Our baby churches got the necessary financial support they needed. We were still able to get our missionaries out of the country and resettled in their new home. And we were able to make necessary improvements on our own building during the shut-down.

Blythe and the baby churches out of Blythe were able to go online to try to reach our communities. We had reports of people giving their lives to Jesus and they have already attended services now that we can meet in person.

The Brawley church was able to baptize several new converts once their church doors opened. The Calipatria church pastor has had people stop by his work and say that they found him online and have been

watching their services and will start attending once their doors open.

The Zacapu church pastor has been overseeing the remodel of their church building and has had many open doors with the locals there. Their grand opening is scheduled for the middle of June when their restrictions lift and he has had several people tell him that they will be attending.

Before the shutdown, Blythe was experiencing a season of fruitfulness and we had several new converts. Our greatest fear was that we would lose them now that the church doors closed. We didn't! God saved them and God kept them. Many not only watched and participated in all the online services but tithed faithfully and kept in contact.

Our world is reeling from one of the most horrific pandemics of our lifetimes and civil unrest, but we have seen God move on our behalf and help us to overcome these unprecedented hurdles. "Our God is greater, our God is stronger, Into the darkness you shine, out of the ashes we rise."

We are so grateful to Pastor Greg Mitchell and his leadership and courage during this time. No pastors have ever pastored during a pandemic before and Pastor Greg imparted wisdom to us and many who desperately needed direction during this time. We are so grateful for Pastor Mitchell and the Prescott congregation, whose prayers and support are always felt.

Hi, my name is Carmen Vega, I have been going to church since 2013, and my husband José has been attending since March 2016.

We had infertility issues throughout our marriage; about 14 years. The doctors gave me a five percent chance of getting pregnant with IVF, so we thought we would give it a try.

During the treatments it had turned out that I had gotten pregnant on my own. Unfortunately, I miscarried and I felt that God was telling me that He had power and control over my life even though I was backslidden at the time. We did three cycles of IVF and nothing worked. The doctors were very confident in each treatment, but in the back of my mind I knew that it wasn't working because it was not God's plan for us.

After the third cycle we decided to stop the treatments. I didn't think I wanted to adopt and I was ready to accept that we weren't going to have children. At this point I knew I needed to go back to church, so I started attending the Potter's House. After I got saved, I started thinking differently and I decided to look into adoption. We started the process through an agency for about a year and a half. We got a few calls for some babies but they all fell through.

At the beginning of 2017, Eva Quintana (my friend from church), knowing about our desire for adoption, called me and told me that her ex-sister in law was having a baby and she didn't want to keep it. I told Eva to give her my number and she never called. I prayed and gave the situation to God, and we didn't talk about it again until the baby was born.

Two days after the baby was born the mother left her, and Eva went to the hospital to love and pray for the baby because she had no one to care for her. She was a preemie born at 3.5 lbs and needed a breathing and feeding tube. Every time Eva would visit and pray for her, she would get better and better.

On June 30th, Eva called me and told me the mom had decided to sign papers to give us the baby. I was out of town at the time, and because I wasn't there to pick her up, the baby was going to be released to CPS.

Before leaving with CPS, God caused her to lose two ounces and the hospital decided to keep her a while longer, which gave us time to change our flight to an earlier return date. When we came back, there were complications with the paperwork, but by a miracle it was worked out quickly.

CPS was understandably hesitant to let her go so easily, but by the grace of God my lawyer knew the CPS lawyer. They made a deal that CPS would come tour our home, and they would close the case. By one o'clock on the 4th of July we got to take Ava home. On September 5, 2017 we had finalized her adoption and gave her our last name. I was content with our

new baby and continued serving God.

We found out at the beginning of 2019 that Ava's birth mom was pregnant again, but was thinking about keeping the new baby. We started praying for her to get better and raise the baby, but if she couldn't we were willing to take that one too. Her pregnancy went on and she did well for the whole pregnancy. A week before she was due she called me and asked me to raise the baby with Ava, because she didn't feel she was able.

A beautiful baby girl was born on June 25, and I was able to be there for the birth and cut the umbilical cord. Her final adoption date was on December 10, 2019.

Now Ava is almost three and Adriana is 10 months, and we are so happy and blessed to have these two beautiful girls as a part of our family.

two additional weddings planned in the next few months which will be a total of four weddings in our first year here in El Paso.

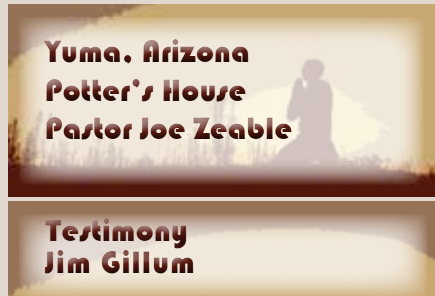
Couples are getting saved, locking in, getting married, and catching the vision.

As a young boy, Jim Gillum was taken to a Christian Church every Sunday by his parents. Born in 1924, it was customary to go as a family to Sunday Service.

When Jim turned 17, he decided to join The United States Navy to fight in World War II. He did "things that sailors do" and "got into things that one gets into when you're in the Navy" according to Jim.

But while Jim was away, God was never too far away from him. He would often find himself reading the Bible and other Christian literature that was handed out

and through that, found himself back to God on a military base in 1962.

He eventually married and when he got out of the Navy, Jim and his wife decided to move to Yuma, AZ. They started attending the nearest church to them which happened to be a Foursquare church pastored by Greg Johnson in 1974. The Gillums became a foundational couple and an invaluable asset to both the Johnsons and the church. They began to involve themselves in the church by following up on new converts, helped in outreaches around the city, became the one of the first Bible study leaders for the church, and Jim also became a council member.

One day Jim approached his pastor with an idea to record the sermons being preached so that members could enjoy them for later times. The green

light was given and, on that day, 42 years ago, the "tape ministry" in The Potter's House Yuma was born.

Since its inception, the "Tape Ministry" has been through several changes over the years. It has gone from recording cassettes, to recording on CDs, DVDs and now on flash drives, but through it all, the one thing that has stayed the same is Jim Gillum.

Today, Jim is 96 years old but still holds down the "Tape Ministry" just



as he did when it first started. A long time has passed, but Jim has been faithful to his ministry, showing all who see him what faithfulness looks like.

"People often overlook this ministry because it's in the background and not as heralded as other ministries, but for those who have received and listened to a tape, CD or flash drive with a message of hope just when they need it, they would say it is the testament of impact to one man's faithfulness," Jim says.

Jim has outlived two wives, and keeps a card in his pocket showing every pastor who has pastored in Yuma...when they came and when they left.

At 96 years old, he is still the first person to church in the evenings, and still driving on his own. God Bless Jim Gillum!

Greetings from Koramangala Church, Bangalore, India.

We are excited to share what God is doing in this part of the world. Right after the India Bible Conference in 2019 we moved into a new phase of growth.

We have launched our 4th baby work into Electronic City, Bangalore. We were running a Bible study group for more than three years in which several people got saved, water baptised and filled with the Holy Spirit. Every week an average of 20 people used to attend this Bible study group. We sent out Srinivas and Revathi to build the church in that part of the city.

We had our first Jesus People wedding at our church. The groom is from Nepal. He comes from a very broken and fatherless family, raised in the streets of Nepal. At a very young age He gave his life to Jesus but later was horribly backslidden. As he got a sponsorship to study in India, he moved to Bangalore and started coming to church. He gave his life to Jesus and is rising up as a disciple and

has a call to preach. The bride is also from Nepal, coming from a poor Hindu family. At the age of seven she was taken for adoption by our Fellowship pastor Purushotham and Sister Neelima in Nepal. She

got saved and wanted to pursue the will of God in her life, She wanted to marry a man who has a call to preach.

We had a powerful revival with Evangelist Steve Stephan from Australia and during these four services we saw 13 first time visitors, 42 salvations and rededications. Several people prayed for healings and we witnessed 10 instant supernatural healings from back injury, skin allergy, throat pain, nostril pain, longtime hand pain from an accident, ankle pain and many other supernatural healings.

Twenty-five people got timely words of knowledge and wisdom, giving them encouragement, direc-

My name is Clarisse B. Edilo, married and with a beautiful baby girl. I would like to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ through my testimony.

When I was a child, I was diagnosed with a congenital heart disease. Growing up with a heart problem is very difficult. I grew up differently from other

children because I couldn't do what normal kids can do like playing, running and walking a distance because I experienced shortness of breath.

Though having this problem, I lived my life as a normal person, I studied, earned my degree and worked as a teacher. During my college life, I made many bad decisions. I got into a carnal relationship for almost eight years. God remained faithful because that man became my husband and is now serving God.

For two years of marriage, we desired to have a baby even though we knew my condition. Last December 2018 we found out that I was pregnant. Unfortunately, I had a miscarriage. It was very depressing and frustrating, but we held on to the promises of God and became faithful in attending services, ministry and in giving.

The biggest miracle happened in my life when I got pregnant for the second time. This time, we thought that it would be easy, but we were wrong.

When we consulted our doctor, she said that it is not advisable for me to be pregnant. I heard lots of negative things from doctors telling me that I may not survive through my entire pregnancy or my baby might not be completely formed, just like what happened to my first baby.

The doctor said that we should decide if we take a risk or we terminate the baby as early as possible for my safety. We chose to take a risk and we prayed that if this is God's will, then the baby will develop and nothing will happen to both of us, but if not, we'll just prepare our hearts to accept everything. God is so faithful. My doctors were amazed on how God sustained me, that my condition did not worsen.

I've experienced lots of assaults from the enemy. I've experienced fear of dying or what could be the effect of my sickness on my baby. There were lots of "what ifs" on my mind. I glorify God because He always comforts me with His words and I find peace and rest in prayer.

I thank the Lord for His provision in our daily needs and especially for the whole time of my pregnancy to delivery. It was during the time of ECQ (Enhanced Community Quarantine) when I was on my seventh month of pregnancy. I am very much grateful to the Lord Almighty that my husband's company was able to give salary to their employees even when they were staying home with their families.

Because of all the doctor's clinics being closed, I was not able to have my twice a week check-ups. Indeed, He is really a great and mighty God and our protector during these times of quarantine.

I survived the ninth month without follow-up check-ups. I was brought to the delivery room for NST (non-stress test) and not for delivery or labor itself. But the doctors found out that I was already contracting and my cervix was at 4cm. I can't have a normal delivery and should not feel any pain because I may have a heart failure or heart attack. My OB, cardiologist, anesthesiologist and pediatrician arrived in no time for an immediate delivery. I prayed... for I wasn't expecting this.

My baby and I were in a life and death situation. I surrendered everything to God and asked Him to save us both. God's answer was to "Be Still." I was holding those words until the time I was brought to the operating room. Everything happened just so fast. I heard my baby cry but was not able to see or touch her.

When I gained consciousness, I remembered something happened, though it was not clear and a bit weird. I remembered tears kept falling from my eyes and in my mind I was praising and worshipping God. Maybe I was just hallucinating, but one thing I am very much sure that God didn't leave us nor forsake us during those times. Many times, my heart and pulse rate dropped. The doctors were amazed because it could be a life-threatening situation. They even said that our prayers were so strong and it was a miracle we survived.

All glory to God that he gave me strength in my weakness. I stayed in the ICU only for a day instead of three days and three and half days in

a regular room instead of more than a week.

In those unpleasant situations, God taught me to be still, trust His heart and He is greater in any circumstance. He is always in control and all we have to do is trust Him.

I also thank God for all my brothers and sisters in Christ who prayed and encouraged me. I am grateful and more than thankful that I have experienced the miracles, healing, blessing and love of God. To God be the glory!

Hello from Goa, India! Two weeks before we were put on a nationwide lockdown, we were sent an impact team from our sister church in Hyderabad, India. Pastor Jeevan Babu sent a total of 25 people to help us outreach our city and invite people to our weekend revival.

On the first day they arrived, we outreached and street preached at a busy office district where hundreds of people were leaving their offices for the day. We set up on the corner with a band playing music and singing songs, people holding signs, while others canvassed the area passing out flyers.

Many heard the Gospel, but on the corner two men came forward to pray when the altar call was given. Many people in our church had never experienced anything like that, to be

preaching in the open so boldly and seeing people respond.

While packing up from the street meeting, I received an invitation to bring the band to a nearby Hindu village. I accepted the offer. To our surprise the village had chairs out, made tea for us all, and gave out cookies. It was prepped and ready as we would for a concert scene. Only one problem, it was set up in the village Hindu temple.

The band started playing and singing with no amplification and the village people were enjoying it, so much so that they plugged in speakers and mics so the band could sing louder about Jesus. The speakers were purposed for Hindu prayers and gatherings. Disciples testified and preached, and ten-plus people came to the altar that we established at a Hindu temple with idols in the back drop.

Afterwards, we prayed for the sick and led the rest of the village to Jesus in one-on-one prayers. The door is still open for us to continue in the village once the lockdown ends.

We have been doing online services since we're unable to meet in our building. We had timely online special services with Pastor Austin, from Ogden, that really ministered to us. We are meeting with some of the men every morning for discipleship classes lead on Zoom by Pastor Raj, which have been very fruitful.

Giving has increased during this time. We were also given access to preach to stranded migrant workers in a government hostel. A few peo-

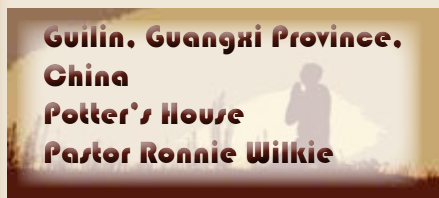
We are blessed to have a faithful core of saints both young and old that are willing to

With the recent Covid-19 outbreak, like everywhere else we have had to find different alternatives to normal church services which forced us to go online to Livestream services. During this period, we continue to see many people pray even on the Livestream feed. We were able to reach a greater range of people that saw backsliders from Rarotonga, Tonga and Australia pray on the phone with our pastor during the altar call.



‘Ni hao’ We arrived in China on the 4th of September 2019 and hit the ground running with accommodation secured and acceptance into a local University to study Chinese all within the first eight days.

We quickly began to connect with local Chinese people and were amazed how each person we met was strategic in these early months of settling into a new culture, nation and lifestyle.

We were having church in our apartment by early January with two Chinese converts. Then the virus hit and by late January we were in lockdown for more than two months, where we were not able to meet physically with any of our contacts. However we kept in touch via wechat.

In early April the lockdown began to ease and we did several Easter outreaches with more than 20 Chinese visitors turning up to each event. We have so far five converts and have been meeting regularly with mid-week Bible studies. We're covering basic truths as there is limited knowledge or understanding of Christianity. We have a Sunday service followed by an afternoon outreach, for example an online concert or showing of a film.

My wife and I feel very honoured

and blessed to have been given this opportunity to pioneer in this wonderful nation. Chicken feet, a little intestine, tripe, fish eyes and duck heart - you cannot live life much better than this! Please hold us up in prayer.

Greetings from the Happy Isles. It's a great joy and wonderful privilege to labor for the Kingdom of God in one of the notorious suburbs of Honiara known for illegal market outlet for drugs (betllenut, home-made alcohol-kwaso and marijuana).

Potters House Church White River, Honiara is on the edge of this street and presents us with opportunities to street preach on week days and weekends. We give praise and glory to God for all He is doing through the church and for His grace and faithfulness as there are testimonies to that effect. We are glad to report all that God is doing in this suburb for the last six months.

We have our second revival for the year 2019/2020 with Pastor Kalisto Tarimiala from the Potters House Church in Mele, Port Vila, Vanuatu in December with soul refreshing and

in our congregation. We would also like to his pastor, Rodney Lambert, for encouragement and support.

A pre-revival outreach involving street preaching at the local market and one-on-one witnessing was conducted with help of an impact team from the mother church in Honiara saw 16 decisions.

Throughout the six revival services we saw attendance averaging 34 with 44 visitors coming through of which 12 responding to the love of God, and word of knowledge given to a youth that has been coming to church.

Apart from preaching revival services, Pastor Kalisto enjoyed evangelism as we took to the streets and into neighborhoods of White River and Rove suburbs witnessing under the scorching morning sun.

We also took Pastor Kalisto to the National Referral Hospital to pray for the sick with five patients being prayed for healing. In all there were 26 people prayed for healing throughout the revival services with some instant healings.

We held a testimony night on January 1, 2020, as part of our Wednesday night service. A number of saints testified of God's leading in their lives, family and community.

In particular the area where our church is situated was known for parties that causes disturbances. On this night we were able to hold church service and share testimonies without disturbances. God is moving in the hearts of the people of this community as we establish His dominion. We want to thank the worldwide fellowship churches for continuous prayers.

In March 2020 the congregation in White River was blessed to have my pastor, Adrian Martinez as guest preacher for the morning service, a rare privilege indeed. We are looking forward to such visits in the future.

Over the past six months December 2019 to May 2020 we continued with what we are called to do, preaching the Gospel three times a week, conducting weekdays evening street preaching, engaged in weekly Saturday mornings/afternoons one-

on-one, movie outreaches with 184 decisions.

Follow-up visits to homes and through phone were continually employed to keep in contact with new converts. Saints in the church attended combined fortnightly Homecare Bible Study with saints from the mother church.

In March we added and started holding adult Sunday School to our weekly schedule. The Monthly Women's Meeting is ongoing and continuing to attract those not attending church as well.

Our monthly visit to the city's referral hospital to pray for the sick came to a halt in April following restrictions and social distancing measures due to COVID-19 threats. Prior to that we have seen patients and caregiver getting saved with 57 healings, with some instant healings as they are being delivered from pain. Thank God we serve a God that still heals.

The Solomon Islands is one of 10 pacific islands countries that is COVID-19 free to date with no reported confirmed case. As government takes measures to lock down the country from COVID-19 reaching the shores of the Hapi Isles, our service attendance being affected as saints make their way to their home villages in the islands since March 2020.

Despite this downturn, we continued to be on fire for Jesus, proclaiming the Gospel of the crucified and risen Lord during this time of uncertainty on a fortnightly basis with

street preaching to market vendors, keen onlookers and bystanders, challenging and ushering citizens into God's Kingdom.

We have visitors coming through every service. Due to travel restrictions our pastor has to cancel a mission trip to Vanuatu to preach a crusade in two pioneer churches on Efate Island scheduled for April. An overseas scheduled revival for the same month was also cancelled. We are believing God that travel restrictions will be lifted so evangelists and pastor can once again put White River on your preaching calendars.

We experienced a near shock on the morning of Friday, April 3, 2020 due to impact of a category one tropical cyclone, Harold, that passed through the country. With swelling waves and strong winds, the coastal settlement where the building we used to hold services was battered in the early dark hours of Friday morning. A number of families in the settlement lost their homes.

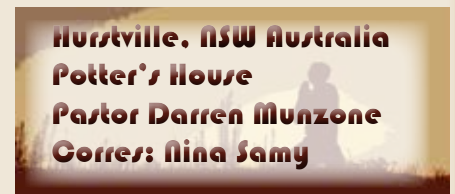
One saint in the church recalled what happened as a miracle. "I was on site by the building observing the incoming waves if it could destroy the room we are using for storage of equipment – I was there with my daughter, by the building; each time a wave came in, we would run from it and when it receded we ran to look if the wall was destroyed and see if equipment was washed out; no damage – I was also praying silently," the witness said. Other than that, the water inundated the floor of the building

with no damages. Our equipment got wet but is all operational. Thank God for this miracle.

On another note as we reported in the winter Trumpet issue, four people responded to the call to be prayed for finances/jobs during Evangelist Felan revival in November 2019. God is truly faithful as one of those that responded was a young disciple from the Honiara mother church working for a telecommunication company. This last April he was promoted from being onsite or public promotion/sales person to taking up a job in the office. In his own words "Am I qualified for this job?" Praise God as God qualifies him for the position even with no formal training.

We would like to thank my Pastor Adrian Martinez and his wife Sister Emily and also the saints from the Honiara Mother Church for their tremendous support to us at White River. Supporting with impact teams through in and out of season, street preaching proclaiming the Gospel of the crucified and risen Lord.

We are excited about what God has been doing in this region and suburb of White River the past months. Please continue to partner with us in prayer as we seek lasting fruits.

we could say as we reflected back is "look what the Lord has done."

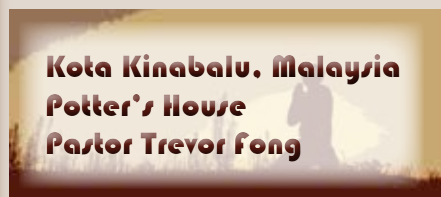

We recently completed an outstanding online revival with Evangelist Steve Stephan, from the Footscray Church in Melbourne, Australia.

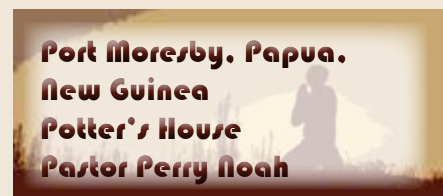

My wife Michelle, our three daughters and I got here in May 2019. We have begun to see God do an accelerated work.

Within a year's time we were able to get our building off of support. Two men made decisions to join ministry and we began to see the attendance cross over into the 30s.

I felt God speak to me about moving into a new area and wasn't sure about how we would get the finances for it. Most commercial leases require annual or bi-annual payments. I put the need before the church and we received a miracle offering (during Covid-19!) to cover six months of the rent - \$8,700 U.S. dollars.

Despite the virus and the challenges that came with it - we have seen God strengthen our church. Our overall offerings increased by 50 percent

in this period and we saw our church really rise up. Our English corner outreach is managed by our disciples. We now have a song service leader. God is still on the move!

We are seeing good things in China despite the opposition. Continue to pray for us!
