God sets the season; we seize the moment. Ezekiel 34:26 (NLT): *I will bless my people and their homes around my holy hill. And in the proper season, I will send the showers they need. There will be showers of blessing.*

“When the season is ripe, we don’t hesitate - we harvest. The beautiful spring and summer months in Prescott provide excellent conditions for outreach and evangelism. While our church labors year-round, these warmer months bring a unique window of opportunity. We seize this season with boldness, using every sunny day and warm evening to bring the Gospel to our community through park outreaches, outdoor events, neighborhood healing crusades, and our longstanding Monday night movie under the stars on Prescott’s downtown plaza. As the people are out enjoying the sunshine, we are out planting seeds of salvation.

Our season began in March with a powerful week of revival featuring Pastor Jesse Cluck from Guam. His supernatural gift ministry left a profound impact and blessed our church.

We hosted an area-wide youth rally the weekend leading up to the revival. Teens from across Arizona and neighboring states joined forces to help evangelize, street preach, and invite the community to the revival meetings. Pastor Cluck delivered a stirring challenge Saturday morning, and that evening, One80° was packed with hundreds in attendance. By the end of the day, 49 souls had prayed to receive salvation.

We’re grateful to see the legacy of Pastor Glen Cluck living on through his son and flourishing throughout the Marianas Islands, China, and the Philippines.

Outreach events geared toward families are always a huge success in the Prescott community. Easter brought one of our most successful



family events yet. Our indoor Easter egg hunt featured live music, food trucks, games, face painting, and puppet shows. Over 500 people came out for this event, with hundreds of visitors in attendance. Two altar calls were given, and 70 people responded to the message of salvation. This was a very rewarding time, and the dedicated labor from many saints in the Prescott congregation paid off.

For 35 years, the Potter’s House church in San Luis Rio Colorado, Mexico, has held an annual miracle healing crusade. Each year, the Prescott congregation supports this event by sending impact teams to promote and support this fruitful effort. This spring, we took five vans to San Luis, where Pastor Jesse Morales preached three outdoor services. These were marked by numerous salvations and miraculous healings, demonstrating God’s power to save and heal.

Disciple-driven outreaches remain a hallmark of our summer season. In May, Tony Begay organized and preached our first outdoor healing service of the year. Four people were healed during this event that took place in a local park. These efforts are the fruit of intentional discipleship from our pastor and the result of in faith during a season of blessing.

Our One80° concert events continue to connect the Gospel with diverse audiences. As Pastor Greg often reminds us, evangelism is about finding a crowd - or forming one. Two themed events in early May proved this true: An evening of Reggae Vibes featured a teen-formed reggae band that drew 30 visitors

and saw six saved. The next weekend, we followed up Punk Rock Night, blending music and history in a themed experience covering punk’s evolution from the ‘70s to today. Guests were invited to dress up and rock out. Many of them showed up in full punk fashion - mohawks, spikes, long hair, and wild colors. Twenty visitors attended, five gave their lives to Jesus.

Prescott is home to the Northern Arizona Wranglers arena football team. Associate Pastor Jesse Morales has become the team’s spiritual coach, regularly ministering to the athletes in the locker room and on the field. This relationship has opened the door for many players to attend church and find salvation. Wherever God leads - whether in stadiums or on street corners - we cast our nets with expectation.

We’re thrilled to introduce a new feature in this edition of the Trumpet - the Prescott Youth Column, written by 15-year-old Kylie DeKens! This section gives voice to the passion and impact of the next generation. Be sure to see what is taking place in the lives and evangelistic efforts from the perspective of our Fellowships’ next generation. In the past year alone, three youth music groups - California Stop, Beyond Barz, and Soul Vibes - have emerged, made up entirely of teenage talent. These groups are ministering in One80°, local outreaches, out-of-town impact teams, and even across the border into Mexico. Our youth have a voice, and it is being heard.

How can a young person stay on the path of purity? "By living according to your word" (Psalms 119:9). The youth of Prescott, Arizona, have been setting out to do just this! The challenges help with learning how to work together and think in new ways. The fun is then tied into the word of God, giving revelations that can't always be revealed through a sermon.


This strengthening in our faith then brings a calling to give others the same salvation that we have all experienced.



The increasing number of youth in ministries is one of the products. For instance, the band California Stop - consisting of Trevor Wright, Liberty Burton, Niyah Morales, Ian Pearl, and Nolan Brunner—brings in a flood of new converts with every performance. Heartfelt lyrics address largely understood struggles and offer God as the solution.

In an interview, I had the opportunity to ask about this ministry that has touched so many, and found that it isn't just the crowd being impacted. As these talented musicians have created songs and diligently practiced, their faith has drastically grown. According to the band, seeing the radical conversions and getting to experience new opportunities has helped in their understanding of God's goodness.

When discussing these realizations, Liberty Burton stated, "We still saw fruitfulness. We still saw, you know, healings...It's showing that God really is with us." It is important to under-



stand that our ministries aren't just for others. Ministries are key to the perseverance of our own faith, especially for the youth.

Thanks to everyone's support and help, the next generation is able to work on our convictions and aid in the increase of converts. I encourage you to look at your youth and guide them into great men and women of God.

# Life Transformed: Cathy Day

I was born into a family with my dad, mom and one brother. We were Catholic (when it suited us). My mom would take us to church occasionally, and my dad stayed home. Both my parents were very hard workers and were gone most of the time.

It was a safe time back then, or so you would think. But the summer when I was seven years old, I was molested by an older neighbor a few houses down, and it went on for months. I told my mom, but she told me not to talk that way. I think that's when my self-esteem disappeared. I believed that it was my fault.

When I was 10, my mom told my dad she wanted a divorce after having an affair. It broke my dad for a long time. I was also told that my brother was adopted. I tried even harder to be the good girl so all these bad things would stop. At 12 my brother raped me and that solidified the feelings of being bad and worthless.

I went to live with my mom at first, then I moved back with my dad. This was the beginning of learning to play one parent against the other.

My dad then married a barmaid, and my mom married the person she had an affair with. He beat and abused my mom almost weekly. I heard my mom's screams, heard her being slammed against walls, and saw her with a gun pointed at her. She divorced and remarried this same man five times. It was an example I was not going to follow.

My dad then married a new lady. She brought three kids with her, and she brought church into our lives. At 13 I heard the simple Gospel of Jesus for the first time. I wanted that, I did not want to live the way I had been.

I asked Jesus into my heart and to forgive me of all my sins and to heal all the hurt. And He did - it was amazing. I really did have a new lease on life. I was preaching the hope of Jesus. I became friends with the pastor's daughter Debbie and was loving serving God and feeling a stability I had never known.

At 16, I started hanging out with some of the "cool" kids. I went to a

football game and got plastered, mixing wine, vodka, beer and tequila. Needless to say, the next day I felt like I was dying. When my parents asked me why I did this all I could say was "I just want to have fun." That simple act and the people I was hanging around with changed the whole direction of my life.

I moved in with my mom (again). I knew I could be "free and have fun" and she was too busy to care. Once again, I was in the abusive home but I was older so I could get away when it started. The day after I graduated high school I came home and found the door locked and all my stuff packed in my car. I was on my own, adding to the rejection.

My dad offered to let me come home but I knew I would need to serve God, and I did not want to. I went to my brother's, who by this time was married and had a little boy. I lived with them until I had the money to get my own place and start a grown-up life. I thought I was now in control.

I decided to move to California with a friend who ripped me off as soon as we got there. I fell in love twice and was destroyed twice. I found myself at one time sleeping in my car in an alley until I had to go to work the next day.

At 19 I moved home to my dad's again. One night by surprise, (or by ambush!) my friend Debbie came to my house and asked me to go to church

with her. I told her it was quarter beer night, and I couldn't go. Finally, just to get her off my back, I said yes. I always told myself and others that "I would get saved again when I was ready." Well, that was what the sermon was about that day. Now God was ambushing *me*.

Pastor spoke about being ready for God and His coming back to take us home. No one was guaranteed that on "their time" there would be any opportunities left. I realized if I asked Jesus back into my heart it would have to be for real and forever. After fighting it the entire service I asked Jesus into my heart again and gave up my will for his.

The rejection I had felt all my life was lifted off of me. I felt truly loved. The next day I moved to Colorado Springs with Debbie to live so I could make a clean break. After a year I really wanted to come home to Prescott where it all started. I moved in with dad again! God had forgiven me and taken away my shame and guilt.

I met a guy that became my best friend and who eventually became my husband. I was told I probably would not be able to have kids, but God gave me a girl and a boy who are some of the greatest joys in my life. They are both married and serving God and I now have four grandkids! God has healed my heart, mind and body. It hasn't always been easy but I have been given a wonderful and blessed life that I truly don't deserve. I have a God who hears me, loves me, and accepts me. He has given me a purpose and a reason to live life to the fullest. The devil will always try to bring us down but if we will just hang on to the love of God we can't lose.

I have been married for 40 years this September. Life with Jesus just gets better and better. I would not go back for anything in the world. God has taken my bad memories and traded them for incredible ones.

You can have that and more. Open your heart to the only One who will never leave you, reject you or hurt you.

As our church has been faithful through the years, we have experienced God's supernatural favor and blessing in our congregation.


Recently we have been blessed to be able to purchase our very own church property located on 59th avenue and

**J**esus Christ has risen from the dead! In the last three months, we have seen this resurrection power demonstrated consistently in our city.

March was a continuation of our in-home Bible studies, which have fostered several crucial dynamics for our church. First is the fellowship of the saints with new believers. We have experienced an incredible season of visitors and backsliders alike making decisions for Jesus, and Bible studies have served to cultivate their connection with seasoned men and women of God.

The next morning, Easter Sunday, our Men's Choir stood before an audience of 650 and declared that "Jesus was the center of it all!" both in song and testimony.

**H**ello from Española, New Mexico! Over the past nine months, God has worked powerfully through a series of significant events and revivals.

During the Healing Crusade in August, we witnessed 16 people saved, 22 individuals who were prayed for, and 10 demonstrable healings.

The Revival led by Pastor Paul Stephens in September saw a 17-year-old young man and his 16-year-old girlfriend attend on a Thursday night. Overall, in the past nine months, we've had two new convert weddings, baptized 23 people, and have seen 746 people pray for salvation!



### Testimony: Jordan Eggemeyer



Jordan Eggemeyer, delivered and serving God in Sparta, IL

I was born to two loving parents in the Fellowship who tried to teach me what it meant to love God. From day one, my life wasn't easy.

During delivery, the umbilical cord was around my neck. I was blue and had to be revived in the delivery room. Moments after, I was diagnosed with a rare genetic disorder called Saethre-Chotzen Syndrome. My parents lost track of the total number of times I had surgery. I had a heart condition that made me vulnerable to SIDS.

My parents used to tell me that the devil wanted me dead, but God had a plan for my life. I had words spoken over me by nearly every evangelist who came to the church. "God has great things for your life Jordan," "You'll preach on other continents," "Keep your heart soft before Him."

In 2017-18, I went from going to church to living and serving the world. I thought I was happy living that life. I had a good job making good money doing what I wanted to do, and I was doing things I never did before in my life. I let the world and my job control my life for the next eight years.

Then this year problems that I hadn't dealt with since I got out of high school came back. I was a drunk/alcoholic and depressed and the thoughts of suicide started to plague me. I woke up on March 13th, 2025 after a night of drinking my problems away, not able to find any way of finding joy.

The thoughts of suicide became very persistent that morning. I sat

there on my phone swiping through social media with these thoughts of "you're not good enough; you don't belong in this world; nobody will miss you." I got tired of hearing this and called my mom. I told her that the thoughts of suicide I dealt with after high school were back. She clocked out of work and came over.

I then told her everything that was wrong from work to drinking to thoughts of suicide. She told me that there's nothing this world can give you that can satisfy you. She prayed for me and asked if I wanted to go to church in Carbondale that night. I told her I had nothing better going on and said I would go.

Now I would be lying if I said I planned on going to church and getting saved that night, but I wasn't. I knew if I spent the evening with my parents that I would make it to see the next morning, but God had a

different plan for me that night. We went to church that night and Pastor Scott Lamb preached a message that was the same thing my mother and I talked about just a few hours earlier. During the altar call, the battle I'd been going through all day got very loud, but God was much louder. He told me "You know how to stop this. You've been there before, and I was there for you last time. All you must do is stop running away from me and submit to me." 



**G**reetings from Escarcega, Campeche. We are seeing God moving and doing many miracles in our city.

At the beginning of the year, God did a great miracle in our healing crusade. We scheduled my Pastor Adalberto Castro and a missionary from the States, Pastor Luis Alcalá, but unfortunately the rain stopped our plan. It was not possible to have the crusade in the venue where we had planned. My pastor preached powerful messages in the church that encouraged us. Saturday came, the rain continued in the venue we chose,

and now it seemed even more difficult than the previous days. There were ponds and mud. We really wanted to do the crusade, and we already had 200 chairs, the platform, and the sound equipment. Everything was ready. God had previously opened doors to us, so I started to have a zeal from God. Standing with Pastor Alcalá, I asked him if we should give a try with the risk of rain that had stopped a little bit in that moment. He told me that he would help me no matter what happened. We started crying out to God and miraculously the rain stopped. In a matter of minutes the soil was dry, absorbing the water.

We started the crusade and people started to show up despite the fact that one hour before it had been raining. We saw powerful healings, but God had more.

Escarcega is very flat, no mountains or high lands, and even though we only had a 15" amplified speaker and two passive speakers of 12", almost the entire city heard the message. Areas far away from the city heard clearly the praise and worship and the message of salvation. We saw the fruit of this crusade and our brothers were encouraged to believe and fight for miracles.

A situation that was hurting us was the location of our church. When we arrived at Escarcega, the construction of the Mayan train station was in full swing. It brought a lot workers that occupied what could be used to live and store material. Everything was rented and with prices in the clouds, we only found a building about five blocks from the city center. It was on a hidden street, didn't have a bathroom and no storage space, it was expensive, and we had a tree right on the side that covered part of the facade. We were in this place for a year and three months and we felt that we had to move. We started looking, but we only found very expensive buildings that didn't work for us.

Since we arrived in Escarcega we saw a restaurant that didn't have any customers. It was on the same street but almost on the corner where people could see it clearly and it was a well known restaurant in the past. I asked the owner if we could rent it, explaining that we needed something cheaper and thanks to God he accepted. The building is bigger than the previous one, with a capacity of 100 people. It has a kitchen that we are going to adapt for nursery and two bathrooms, and it is only 25 dollars more than the previous building.

God has added to the church key people - former drug addicts, alcoholics who have been a great testimony of restoration in the city and also foreign people like brother Antonio, who is a veterinarian from the State of Mexico who works for an American company here in Escarcega. He is the vaccination supervisor of all the poultry farms in the area. Families are happy and young people are taking the vision of preaching.

Our finances have also been handled by God. Now the church is paying the local rent completely and we are believing for more.

Please continue praying for us, may God continue to reach more and more lives.


church.

A few notable miracles include a man with a chronic knee


injury who was prayed for on Sunday evening. By Thursday night he said there was absolutely no pain and he had not felt that good in years.

We're happy to report that God is still on the move. In the last several months, we've been seeing retention of fruit from our High School Bible Clubs, Men's Outreaches (MVP), Revival meetings, and our monthly One80's. To start off the year, we baptized 24 brand new converts.

Our weekly Bible Clubs have proven fruitful as we're seeing growth in our Catalysts Youth Group. In these meetings, we see an average of 50-100 students respond to receive Jesus monthly. Re-

cently, the "Men with Vision and Purpose" (MVP) ministry hosted an outdoor Healing Crusade in March, where we saw 92 people saved with five miraculously healed.

In the month of March, we were honored to have Evangelist JW Ballinger from Prescott, AZ do a revival for us. We saw a total of 12 people saved,

five rededication, eight healed, and six of our converts filled with the Holy Spirit.

In April, we invited Evangelist Steve Zapata from Perth, West Australia for a revival. In this meeting, we saw a total of 13 saved, four rededications, and nine healed from notable illnesses and pain.

Both of these revivals were timely and very stirring, gifts of the Spirit were in operation every night, and we're still seeing fruit from these revivals.
