Kicking things off, we brought a group of 60 youths to downtown Prescott. We gathered at the historic Yavapai County Courthouse where the community's Christmas festivities take place.

Surrounded by lights, families, and holiday celebrations, our youth spread Christmas cheer by caroling, con-

necting with people, and boldly street preaching. It was incredible to watch them step out in faith and share the love of Christ with strangers. By the end of the evening, we saw three people make decisions for Christ, making the night not only festive but adding to the kingdom.

In addition to our outreach downtown, we celebrated the Christmas season with a special musical production titled "Puppet Christmas Carol." Over the course of two Saturday evenings, our church family came together to bring this creative and joy-filled performance to life. What made it even more special was the incredible teamwork behind it - with a cast and crew of more than 100 people serving

From puppetry and music to set design and hospitality, every detail was prayerfully prepared to share the message of hope and redemption in a fun and memorable way. Both nights were filled with energy, laughter, and the true spirit of Christmas as friends, families, and guests from the community joined us. Most importantly, we were blessed to see God move in powerful ways, with 20 people making decisions for Christ. It was an exciting time that reminded us how creative ministry can open hearts to the Gospel.

Not only have we seen God moving powerfully in Prescott, but in February we also had the opportunity to partner with our sister church in Glendale, pastored by Jeff Rens, for their very first Youth Rally. It was a blessing for our youth to come alongside their Fellowship and serve together in ministry.

Throughout the day, our team stepped out boldly in faith, engaging in one-on-one conversations, sharing the Gospel through personal evangelism and street preaching to the community. The entire day was centered on reaching people and pointing them to Jesus. It all culminated in an exciting evening concert that brought everyone together for worship and a clear presentation of the message of

salvation.

It was a privilege to watch our young people not just attend an event, but truly labor side-by-side with another church, serving, praying, and loving others with the heart of Christ. By the end of the rally, we saw 20 people give their lives to Jesus! It was a powerful reminder that when we unite in faith and step out in obedience, God faithfully works through His people to change lives.

We are also excited to share that we recently launched a brand-new young adults Bible study designed specifically for ages 18-25, called "Made for More." This monthly gathering was created to give young adults a place to grow deeper in their faith, build meaningful friendships, and be encouraged in their walk with Christ. This is such an important and transitional season of their lives.

From the very first night, God exceeded our expectations. We had 29 young adults attend our kickoff meeting, filling the room with energy, a hunger for God's Word, and a genuine desire for community. It was incredible to see so many young people come together to worship, study Scripture, and have honest conversations about life and faith. We believe this group is just the beginning of something special. Our prayer is that "Made for More" will continue to be a place where young adults discover their purpose, strengthen their foundation in Christ, and step boldly into all that God has called them to be. We are truly excited to see how God will move through this amazing group, in the months ahead, and the lasting impact He will make in their lives.

Mission Possible: Prescott hosts Children's Workers Conference

Prescott launched into March with our annual Children's Church Conference, led by Louie Paulino and this year the mission was clear: "Mission Possible: Training Your Children in the Way They Should Go."

From the very beginning, it felt like we had assembled a room full of dedicated agents - men and women committed to the most important mission of all: reaching and discipling the next generation for the Kingdom of God.

This year's conference was truly outstanding. We were honored to have 38 churches represented, with over 338 people in attendance. Leaders, teachers, volunteers, and children's ministry workers gathered together, united by the same calling - to equip young hearts and minds with the truth of God's Word. Each person came ready to learn, grow, and return home better equipped for the mission field of children's ministry.

The conference officially launched Thursday night, and the atmosphere was immediately charged with faith and expectation. Pastor Diego Galvan delivered a powerful and timely message titled "Taste and See That the Lord Is Good." His words stirred hearts and ignited the Spirit of God in the room. It was a reminder to every "agent" in attendance that before we can help children experience the goodness of God, we must continually experience it ourselves.

Friday morning and afternoon were filled with creativity, learning, and a lot of fun as we experienced sessions on puppets, prop-making, and illusions! Bear Brown, who leads the children's ministry in Ogden UT, under Pastor Rick Martinez, led an outstanding seminar on using illusions as a powerful tool to communicate the Gospel to children. Throughout the session, he demonstrated how simple illusions - sometimes called "tricks" - can immediately capture a child's attention and curiosity. Once the attention is there, the message of the Gospel can be presented in a way that is memorable, visual, and easy for young minds to understand.

Each illusion was not just entertaining; it was carefully connected to a Bib-

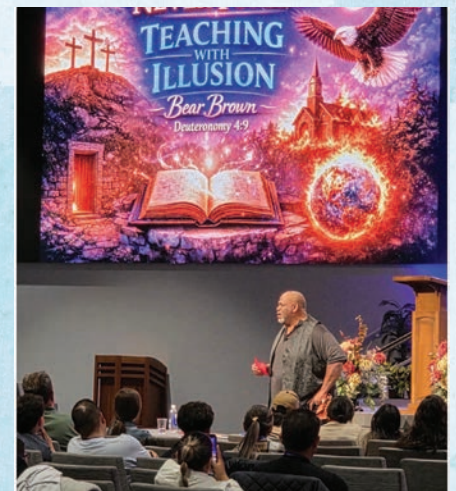
lical truth. It was amazing to see how something simple could illustrate deep spiritual principles and help children grasp important lessons about Jesus Christ, faith, and the Gospel message. What stood out the most, however, was not just the creativity of the illusions but the heart behind the ministry.

As Bear spoke about the children in his church, it was clear that his passion for reaching the next generation runs deep. You could hear it in his stories, see it in his excitement, and feel it in the way he talked about the impact children's ministry can have on a child's life. It was more than just a seminar - it was an inspiring reminder of how important it is to invest in the next generation and to communicate the Gospel in ways that children can truly connect with and remember. What an incredible and encouraging time!

Friday night brought another unforgettable moment as Evangelist Steve Bowman delivered an incredibly encouraging message that spoke directly to the hearts of children's ministry workers. With clarity and conviction, he reminded everyone that every kids church worker matters. Whether teaching a small class, leading worship, teaching a memory verse, or simply loving a child who needs encouragement, every role plays a critical part in God's mission. His message strengthened and affirmed the calling of those who faithfully serve week after week, often behind the scenes.

Conversations in the hallways, moments of prayer together, and times of worship all reinforced the same truth: this mission is possible when we work together and rely on the power of God. Each attendee left not only encouraged but also newly equipped - ready to return to their churches as faithful agents on assignment to train up children in the way they should go.

As the conference came to a close, one thing was certain: the mission con-



tinues. The seeds planted during these few days will continue to grow in classrooms, children's services, and churches across many communities.

The next generation is worth every effort, every prayer, and every moment invested. With a team of passionate leaders like those who gathered this year, the message is clear: Mission Possible is far from over.

Life Transformed: Dave Ciaccio

I was born in Amityville hospital on Long Island, NY, on January 15, 1958.

Long Island in the late 50s and 60s was a unique place to grow up. My dad was a WW2 and Korean war veteran, like most of the men in our neighborhood. Nearly every block was filled with men who had seen



war, sacrifice, and hardship. They worked hard, loved their families, and carried a quiet strength shaped by what they had lived through.

To me and my three brothers, life was simple and full of adventure. We were fun-loving, carefree, reckless kids. When the weather warmed up, the whole neighborhood poured outside. Dozens of kids gathered every day playing football, stickball, tag or riding bikes 'til the sun went down. We didn't have cell phones, computers or video games, and TV was a boring three channels; but we had freedom. Eventually we came to be known as baby boomers - kids raised in the long shadow of war, but with hope for something better.

One ordinary day, while playing football in front of our house one of the local kids tackled me. It was a routine hit - nothing out of the ordinary. But when I stood up, something was very wrong. The pain was intense, sharp, and unlike anything I ever felt. What followed was every parent's nightmare.

Doctors discovered what they described as an inoperable, life-threatening tumor consuming my spine. Very little hope was given that I would survive. Suddenly, childhood games were replaced with hospital rooms, long corridors, and whispered conversations between adults who thought I couldn't hear. I spent nearly a year in the hospital in New York City, undergoing surgeries and cobalt radiation treatments. The future was uncertain at best. To everyone's surprise, I survived.

Even as a child, I knew my life was spared for a reason, even if I didn't yet understand what that reason was.

In 1968 I was strong enough to travel, and our family moved west to Arizona. We settled in Page, a small town surrounded by desert, red rock, and wide-open skies, a dramatic change from Long Island. I started over, made new friends, and found a place in the school band as a drummer. Music quickly became my world. One band led to another, and garage bands turned into local gigs. The louder the music, the freer I felt.

But as time went on, music and the company I kept led to other things - drugs, alcohol, a lifestyle built on excess and rebellion. On the outside it looked like fun, but inside I carried a constant awareness that I was wasting something precious. I felt deep down my life was created for something better.

In the early 1970's, suddenly Jesus came to Page. He was everywhere. People talked about Him constantly. He showed up at parties, in school conversations, and on the radio. I couldn't avoid Him. I had to maneuver around Him just to buy a little weed. He wreaked havoc on my love life, and even the bikers I played music with had to bring up Jesus.

One evening in 1973 I went to a concert in Page just to take in a live show. Sure enough it turned out to be a Jesus band. I blew it off, but something about their message stuck with me.

In 1974 we moved again, this time to Prescott. I picked up where I left off: mu-

sic, booze, pot and Jesus. The tug of war continued. I resisted, argued, and ran, but Jesus never stopped pursuing me. One year later He won the fight.

I reached the end of myself, and asked for forgiveness. I was done with the life I lived - the shame, the weight, guilt, emptiness and loneliness. The Lord spoke to my heart, "it's time to be honest."

I truly was born again. I was forgiven, made clean in the eyes of God. The miracle that spared my life as a small boy now made sense. Old habits began to fall away. For the first time in years I had friends who really cared about me. The air tasted sweeter, the sky seemed bluer, the stars shone brighter, I was no longer held tight in the grip of alcohol and drugs. I was making good choices for the first time in a while.

After about a year and a half of faithfully attending church and ministering in bands, I met Beth. She turned out to be the one I would spend the rest of my life with. We were young, naive, and impulsive, but mostly, we were madly in love. I was a piece of work, she was an angel. We were two kids who really didn't have a clue. I consider Beth's mom and dad, Greg and Rochelle Malinowski, to be some of the finest people I have ever known. They did their best to slow us down. Nonetheless, we married on August 7th, 1977. To this day I am grateful for the people in my life whose love and patience helped us through those early years.

Down inside, the Lord helped both of us develop an unbreakable resolve to serve Him and each other. It didn't take long before amazing doors began to open for us.

I've been serving the Lord for 50 years now and I feel like it's only just begun. Doctors told me I'd be sterile due to the radiation treatments I underwent, but God had other plans. I have a wife who loves me, four outstanding children, 12 grands and two great grands. Every one of them is a reminder that God's plans are greater than medical reports, greater than fear, and greater than our past.

God truly has a plan for each and every one of us. He knew my pain, sorrows, regrets, and my doubts. I found forgiveness and a brand new life in Jesus.

Greetings from Boston, Mass! Since our last Trumpet report, God has continued to build - not just gatherings, but people. He has already confirmed His word through salvations, healings, and supernatural favor. What we are witnessing now is something deeper: fruit that is beginning to remain.

One of the most remarkable moments since our last update came in December, when the Rochester, NY church, under Pastor Keith Sullivan, sent the production *Ebenezer: The Hip Hop Musical* to Boston.

Director and playwright Logan VanEpps offered to bring a full production - set pieces, sound and lighting equipment, props, costumes, and key characters. The only things we needed were a cast and a venue, and as a three-month-old pioneer church, we had neither.

But we are part of a powerful and generous Fellowship.

The Cape Cod church, under Pastor Paul Campo and Assistant Pastor Chip Ganier, immediately called and offered to send a full cast to carry the production. Their willingness and excellence answered our first prayer and removed the first obstacle entirely.

The second obstacle - a venue - seemed far more difficult. I identified an ideal theater space at 975 Bennington Street in East Boston, located on a major thoroughfare with a stage and seating for 100 people. The problem was access. The CEO and his associates would not return calls, emails, or inquiries for weeks. Refus-

ing to let the opportunity slip away, I waited on the street one day when I learned the developer would be in town for a meeting. I was able to get one minute of his time, his personal cell number, and a promise that he would speak with his attorney.

For the next six weeks, nothing. Calls, texts, and emails went unanswered. Other venues were either unavailable or far beyond our reach. I brought the matter to God plainly: "We need this venue, and I want it free of charge." I released it to God and stepped out in faith, advertising the event at the Bennington St location.

Nineteen days before the event, we received approval. Two days before the event, we received the keys - free of charge, no strings attached.

Saturday night, the building was packed with 130 people. Over 80 first-time visitors attended, and 25 people responded for salvation. What once seemed impossible became a clear confirmation that God was guiding this work step-by-step.

Another powerful outreach opportunity came during the Chinese Lunar New Year. I wrote a Gospel letter in Chinese and prepared red envelopes with flyers and a Gospel tract as a point of connection. As I entered Chinatown and began handing them out, I was immediately surrounded. People eagerly reached for the envelopes.

The moment struck me deeply:

this is missionary work. These were people who do not speak English and may never have heard the Gospel. Despite the language barrier, I have been able to build connections with many Asians in the community, and God has opened a door to reach them. Boston truly is a city of the nations!

One young man in our church has begun stepping up in a powerful way. After attending the January conference in Prescott, God touched his heart and birthed vision within him. Upon returning to Boston, something shifted. He captured the heart of the work, began attending Saturday outreaches, and he has been inviting students from his school at the New England Conservatory of Music. With nearly 50 colleges and over a quarter-million college students in the Boston area, this is something we have been praying for since our arrival.

In February, the first student-led, on-campus Bible study began!

We are now holding three services a week at our miracle location on Beacon Hill, rent-free. The heart of Boston has become a base of operations for ministry, fellowship, and outreach, and we are praying for expansion into a larger permanent building.

We are deeply grateful for the prayers, support, and vision of our Fellowship. Because we are part of a sending Fellowship, we are watching God build His church in one of the most strategic cities in America!

Testimony Frida Taino

My name is Frida Taino, I'm about to be 21 years old.

Since I was 10 years old, I've dealt with social anxiety, manic depression, psychosis, and multiple eating disorders. I've always felt ugly, overweight, very afraid, tormented, unlovable, and like an outcast from everyone, growing up with my mental health issues and feeling rejected by people I love.

My late middle school and high school years were filled with extremely painful feelings and difficult experiences of being bullied, being admitted into the mental hospital four times, becoming addicted to cutting myself, doing drugs, smoking cigarettes, fighting and verbally assaulting my mother for years,

failing all of my classes multiple times, starving my-self, and being in multiple sexually and emotionally abusive relationships with many men.

At 17 years old, I tried to kill myself after many other failed attempts, and was taken to the hospital where they pumped out all of my antidepressants from my stomach, and to my final mental health hospitalization. For four years after my attempt, I battled with the guilt and shame of being a survivor of suicide. Eventually, I went back to old, comfortable ways of coping with this guilt.

In 2024, I was truly at the end of myself, and couldn't stand living one more moment. I almost ended my life again in a dark moment of isolation with a pair of scissors, but instead, I hesitantly called out to God.

I had no idea who I was calling out to at all and expected nobody to answer me. I just said with my whole, aching heart, "Please help me, something, someone."

Immediately, after this first prayer of my life, the weight of my anxiety lifted completely for a moment. A moment of clarity, and of true hope miraculously appeared. I remember feeling warm and loved while I laid on my floor, covered in my shame and clutching this pair of scissors.

From this first encounter, Jesus' name popped in my head the more I called out to God. Saying His name, though I didn't understand it, made me feel safe in the midst of my ongoing mental health battles. Jesus actively searched for me, in many similar more dark moments, through people I didn't know. The more I held on to Him and to the love He was freely giving me, the

more I learned about Him, the more I began to love Him back, and the more pain He so easily took away from me in my mind and body. I have felt His warm presence take away my anxiety and guilt, time and time again, over this year of getting to know Him.

I did nothing special to receive this love and mercy, I even made more mistakes when I started to follow Him, and my track record is horrible. This grace made no sense to me, but every day He is healing and restoring every shameful part of me, out of pure love and compassion.

I can now walk freely with the confidence He has given me. I can talk and live every day without the old shame or guilt from everything that has happened. I no longer have debilitating panic attacks, or want to cut myself, and I've been completely sober from all of my drug use for one year.

I now have a bright future and a hope in my soul, life, and I'm currently starting a career in the medical field. My mother and I no longer fight; I treasure her alongside the rest of my family and friends who saw me and took care of me at my worst. I'll never understand how people stayed, but God gave me so much hope through their love for me.

I never felt like I belonged here in this life, but I don't have to go anywhere anymore to know I am always at HOME with Jesus! He truly loves you as His own, while knowing every single thing you've ever done and WILL do.

Jesus has counted every single tear you have shed. Once you search for Him and accept His love for you, He will never let you go. He left the 99 to find me, in the darkest places I created myself.

Greetings from South Central El Paso, where Jesus is still changing lives. Below is a testimony of one of our converts.

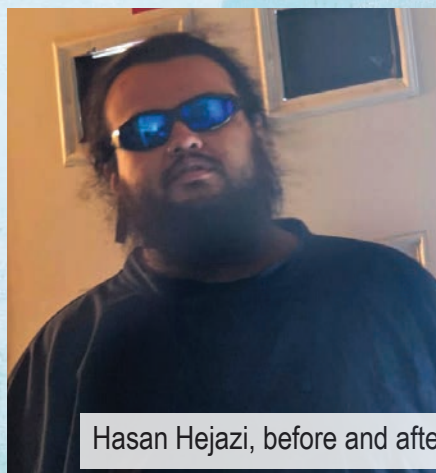

We look forward to reading your reports. We’re definitely encouraged to see what God is doing worldwide. Please continue to pray for us as we pray for you. God bless.

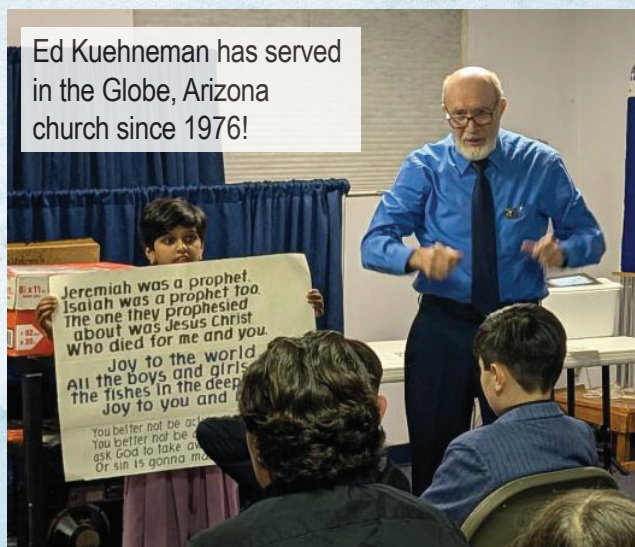

I grew up in church - kind of. My parents planted the seed, but I never really cared about it.

I met my husband when I was 15 and

we got married young - I was 18 and he was 19. We moved in together and my addiction for weed started. It gave me anxiety, depression and I was just recovering from doing self-harm. I gave my husband the responsibility of making me happy, which later I found out only God can give us true happiness.

I became so obsessed with weed, it became my idol. It became my everything. It even became my "melatonin" to be able to sleep or rest. Many times my body would send me warnings to stop doing it, but I never listened and never really cared.

One day my body reacted. I would vomit constantly to the point that there was nothing left to throw up. I ended up with gastritis because of how much weed I would consume in a day. Many times I chose to buy weed over food. I lost so much weight, people would question what I was on. Even though I became very ill, I just didn't care enough. This went on for a couple years.

By the time this was happening to me, my husband and I were trying to conceive, but I was never able to, no matter what I did or tried to do I knew deep down God was telling me to give this addiction to Him. Every month I would end up in the hospital sick. Doctors advised me to stop smoking so much for my health, but again I was very stubborn.

One day on Christmas I was so sick I couldn't handle it anymore. I prayed to God while I was crunched up in bed tossing and turning from pain. I asked Him to heal me, to make it stop, that I had enough, that I wanted to be healthy and He heard me. I prayed and read the Bible and would worship Him by myself. He opened my womb and I was able to conceive my first son. It was a wonderful time!

After a year and a half I collapsed again and picked up the weed again. It became so hard to talk to God. I was so ashamed of myself.

While I was struggling again with addiction, I also started to have heart problems, another warning my body was giving me. At this time in my life, I worked at a restaurant, and I met a wonderful woman who would talk to me about God constantly, and invite me to church. As I was battling being a mom

I have found in Jesus the shepherd I was always looking for, and in Christianity, the practical, loving, and cleansing relationship with God that my soul craved. I hope, in time, you can see the fruits of this decision in my life - perhaps more patience, more kindness, more peace—and know that it comes from the grace of my Lord, Jesus Christ.

Greetings from North Birmingham, United Kingdom!

I'd like to share this testimony to encourage all churches, and especially pastors looking for a building breakthrough.

The Erdington church is based in North Birmingham, UK. We were established in 1997 and in early 2000s the pastor at the time, Paul Boddy had an opportunity to purchase an old council run building at a heavily discounted price. Our young church sacrificed and pledged and that building was our home for over 20 years.

In the years leading up to 2024 God had blessed us with a growing congregation, pioneers and lots of children. But the flip side was that we were crammed for space. We tried without success for other buildings so carried on making the best of it.

In March 2024 Martin Klok preached a revival for us and gave me a word saying "God has seen your desire for a building. He's not looking at your bank account, he's looking at your faith." I took that word to heart and after the revival and inspired by prayer, I drove around the area looking for buildings. I wrote letters to the head offices asking to buy or lease their building from them. Surprisingly a few got back to me.

One owner said, "Your letter came at an opportune time." They wanted to sell the business and offered the building to us with an £80,000 discount. We sold our current building, secured a mortgage and took a pledge but without that discount it would have been unaffordable.

Fast forward 10 months, the building was ours. We rolled up our sleeves and got to work. The building has 25 parking spaces, a 400 seat capacity, two floors and ministry rooms. At our grand



opening we saw over 100 visitors, people saved and 25 new people on our first official church service.

We just celebrated our one year anniversary in the building and what a year it has been. The church has grown in every possible way. I'm so glad I listened to that word and so thankful for an amazing faith-filled congregation. I have also learn to trust God in new ways and I now know more than ever that He is faithful.

If God can do it for us, He can do it for all of us. Trust God's provision, favour and timing. God bless.

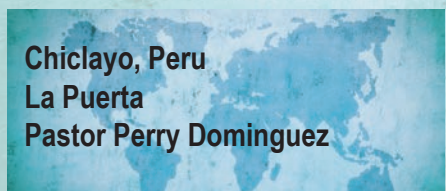
In December we had the privilege to take three couples and a single man to the Guatemala conference, God really moved and imparted the vision of the fellowship and what we are a part of into the lives of the people.

Greetings from Odessa, Ukraine. Here is the testimony of our sister Zoe. She and her husband got saved in the early years of our church and have been a faithful couple for more than 20 years.

**Testimony
Zoe**

Greetings, brothers and sisters! My name is Zoe Yefimova. I am 44 years old, and I live in Odessa, Ukraine. I want to share with you a miracle that the Lord has done.

Some time ago, I was given a terrible diagnosis: cervical carcinoma, stage 4 cancer. The tumor had already grown into my bladder and affected my lymph nodes. The doctors told my husband directly that there was no hope and that we needed to prepare for the worst-case scenario.

It was too late for surgery, so I was

prescribed nine rounds of intensive chemotherapy, followed by radiation therapy.

But we decided not to give up and to ask the Lord for healing. The churches of our Fellowship prayed for me. I constantly felt God's presence and comfort. My husband fasted, prayed, and constantly encouraged me.

Sisters from other churches also prayed and fasted. Natasha Tarasova sent me Bible verses almost every day for encouragement. I repeated God's promises out loud and read books on healing. Pastor Dennis gave me a book on healing by Pastor Greg Mitchell. Pastor Sergey Golubev also passed on words of inspiration, saying, "Do not be afraid, the Lord will give you healing!" The church is a great support.

After every three rounds of chemotherapy, I underwent a medical scan. After just the first three rounds, the scan showed that my bladder, which had previously been bleeding and deformed, had completely recovered! And the tumor began to shrink and break down. My oncologist did not expect such tremendous progress and said that there might be a chance for surgery in the fu-

ture, although it was still a long way off.

But after another three rounds of chemotherapy, a new scan showed that the tumor was completely gone, and the bladder was absolutely clear. The doctor was in shock. The surgeon immediately took me in for surgery. When the pathology results came back after the surgery, they amazed everyone - no cancer cells were found, and the lymph nodes were fully restored!

According to medical protocols, radiation therapy was required, and I was referred to another hospital. I arrived there with my test results. The doctor looked at them and said amazing words: "I have nothing to radiate here; the cells are absolutely healthy. What happened to you simply doesn't happen; it goes completely against the protocol."

Six months later, I went through all my follow-up checkups, and they showed that there are no cancer cells!

I want to say a huge thank you to all of you, brothers and sisters, for your prayers and support. Praise God for His mercy! He brought me out of this evil and granted me healing!"
