Transformations

(Editor's Note: Following is the beginning of a series of testimonies of young Prescott disciples who are now pastoring, and what happened in their lives to prepare them for the successful ministries they have today.)

My Name is Anthony Ciaccio. I grew up in the Prescott Potters House church. I met my wife, was married there, and we began raising our children in the church. I loved Jesus, wanted to be saved, and was heavily involved in ministry. But there was an issue that kept coming up in my life again and again: carnality.

I was not backslidden, but I was a carnal Christian. I loved God, but I was allowing things into my heart that were keeping me from fully surrendering to His will. Entertainment, movies, video games, and streaming services had begun to dominate my life.

In April 2021, Pastor Jesse Morales asked me a few simple questions and reminded me that we still had ministry standards. Then he told me I had a choice to make: either I could stop watching movies and using streaming services in my home, or I could step out of ministry. He told me to let him know by Wednesday night.

I knew that if I chose carnality over ministry, it would eventually destroy my relationship with Christ.

That night, on the ride home, I made the decision for our family that we were going to get rid of all entertainment. I informed my wife that this was the direction we were going to take. Within the next ten minutes, she went through all five stages of grief - denial, anger, bargaining, depression, and finally acceptance. Thank God she was a new person by the time we got home, honestly it was a major adjustment for our family.

That Wednesday, I told Pastor Jesse I wanted to remain in ministry. I committed to removing the stream-

ing services, movie platforms, and movies from our home. Then I went a step further and made a personal decision to get rid of my video games and block YouTube and other video platforms on my phone. I did not want carnality to continue having a place in my life. That decision be-

came the beginning of a real change. Three months later, God opened the door for a new job. I had worked at the same company for more than 15 years, but this new job placed me just minutes from the church. I literally drove past the church on my way to work every morning.

In September of 2021, I made the decision to go to prayer at the church every morning. I would go at 6 am, then leave for work before the regular prayer time began, so much of that season was just me and God.

In that quiet place, God began to change me. He gave me a hunger for His Word and a love for prayer that I had never had before. For years, I had neglected prayer and reading my Bible. But in that season of solitude and seeking God, He began to develop those disciplines in me. Unexpectedly, God also gave me a love for people.

In January of 2022, during the Prescott Conference, God stirred my heart for ministry. By the end of the week, my spirit felt broken before God. The Saturday after conference, I told Pastor Greg, "Pastor, I want to do something for God with my life."

To my detriment, I had said similar things many times before. Coincidentally every six months God stirred me at conference, but the seed

never truly took root in my life, if I was lucky the feeling would only last a few weeks.

About a month later, God revealed another issue in my heart: my love for money. Following a Sunday morning service where Pastor Greg preached about how the enemy places stumbling blocks in our path, I spoke honestly with him about my love for money and real estate.

That is when Pastor Greg told me, "Anthony, you need to ask God to help you love people and the things of God the way you love money and real estate."

The next day, on Monday, I was presented with an opportunity to purchase an investment property. I was literally one email away from finalizing the deal. When God gave me the revelation this was a stumbling block, the choice was His will or this property. I made the decision to not purchase the property.

That choice uprooted something in my heart. God began to break my love for money and replace it with a greater love for people, ministry, and His will for our lives.

The following July, I was asked to go on staff in Prescott. Since then, God has continued to help us

When we arrived to pioneer in Boston, I fully expected to walk in the promise of Mark 16:17-18: *"These signs shall follow them that believe... they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover."*

For years, I had seen God heal people everywhere I ministered. I had watched tumors dissolve in Pres-

cott and Mexico. I had seen shoulder injuries, back pain, and chronic conditions healed across the West Coast, in the United Kingdom, and even in Romania. I had personally experienced healing in my own body as both a child and a young man. I had no doubt about God's power to heal.

So when we arrived in Boston, I assumed healing ministry would naturally become one of the ways God built His church.

Instead, something unexpected happened. For six months, despite repeated efforts to pray for the sick, the results I had grown accustomed to simply were not there. While we saw a few dramatic miracles in neighboring cities like Somerville and Chelsea, inside Boston itself,

there seemed to be nothing. Even more discouraging, many people openly scoffed at or dismissed offers for prayer. It troubled me deeply.

Hebrews 13:8 echoed constantly in my spirit: *"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever."*

God had not changed. His promises had not changed. So why did it feel like we were hitting a wall? The results felt abysmal - and they were unacceptable.

During that season, I called Pastor Greg for counsel. He reminded me that the enemy desperately wanted to discourage us from praying for the sick and challenged me to continue contending for the full promise of God.

So I made a decision: I would not surrender Mark 16. I reread Healing Power. I stirred my faith again. Then we scheduled an open-air healing crusade

at the largest park in East Boston, right in the amphitheater at Bremen Street Community Park. We prayed. We fasted. We outreached.

Churches from Lynn, Malden, and Cape Cod came alongside us to help labor for a breakthrough. I had Pastor Roberto Rojo Sr. from Mazatlán, Mexico, preach a healing message in Spanish, and I translated.

Together, we took dominion. And God answered! Throughout this endeavor, 12 people responded for salvation, and three people were healed publicly in the park. The following week, two of those reached through the crusade came into our church services.

For me, this was more than a suc-

cessful outreach - it was a breakthrough in the spirit. The enemy may resist. Cities may seem hardened. People may scoff. But Jesus Christ is still the same.

Boston is not beyond the reach of God, and we believe this breakthrough is only the beginning of what God wants to do in our city!

After becoming totally blind in my left eye, and partially blind in my right eye, I had cataract surgery on my left eye on September 23rd, 2025.

Soon after, I had surgery on my right eye 30 days later. I understood very well that cataract surgery

might not restore fully, or even provide any partial vision on my blind eye. But I had faith. One particular service, my pastor was praying for healing, as well as full restoration of vision.

After he prayed with me, my right eye healed and my vision in that eye was fully restored within two weeks! But my left eye didn't do well. It did not heal for seven months. I suffered with partial vision and sometimes no vision in that eye. It was one virus after another virus, one infection after another infection.

I had visited several eye specialists and they were able to treat the different viruses and infections, but they couldn't explain the non-healing because none of the medications worked. After seven months

of my left eye severely burning, or becoming swollen, it was to a point where I couldn't keep it open, or even open it at all.

That was long enough for me to begin to lose faith. But I didn't lose faith, because thanks to God I had my pastor and my church brothers and sisters who kept praying for my healing. This refueled or recharged my faith - that's as best as I can describe it.

During church service on Sunday, April 26th, my pastor asked if anyone would like to pray for healing. I raised my hand knowing that it was the Lord's will that I would be healed that Sunday. Immediately during the prayer, I didn't feel the pain in my left eye! Part of me

wanted to cry but I was too happy.

I praise the Lord for my miracle healing and how grateful I am to all those who kept my faith strong. I am truly blessed!

Greetings from Albuquerque, New Mexico!

We thank God for all that He has been doing in our church over the past few months.

Our church has several young people who are now entering middle school and high school. Out of our pastor's burden to reach this next generation, a youth group was formed called YL - Young Lions. The goal of this group is to reach our youth beyond a traditional Bible study setting. When the call was made for young people who wanted to be involved, many responded with excitement.

We officially launched the group with a "NXT-GEN" Youth Rally, where our guest speaker was Lacy Brunson. It was a powerful event. During outreach leading up to the rally, several people were saved, and many young people from the surrounding area attended the service.

Shortly after the school year began, one of our Young Lions shared a burden he had for his school and expressed a desire to start a Bible study there. After meeting with school administrators and facing some initial resistance, God moved, and the Bible study was approved!

At the very first meeting, over 35 teens attended, and more than 30 gave their lives to Christ. Since then, the YL-Valley Bible study has continued to grow, with 40 to 60 teens attending each Wednesday, and many young people being born again.

Several of these students have come to services in our church, and we are praying that God will help them move beyond the decision stage and into true conversion.

Our Young Lions have also begun street preaching on Sunday nights at a

Hi my name is Christine Ruiz. Fifteen years ago, I started going to church.

I prayed and tried to live for God but I was never fully surrendered. I would still slip into doing meth and then come back to church trying to be clean. One day I completely backslid. I was away from church and away from God. The choices I made led me to my husband



leaving me and taking the kids. I became a full-blown alcoholic. I would drink to black out. I fell deeper into meth. I did not care about life or what my actions did to anyone. I would go to detox and different programs but I would never do the things I needed to do to get clean. I didn't even want to be in the programs.

In 2018 I did my best to get clean, I stopped drinking and was trying to repair my family. My husband and I got back together. But then in 2023 my husband started doing drugs and so to allow him to do drugs he allowed me to drink. For two years straight we were drinking and doing drugs together. In October 2024 we started coming to church every once in a while, to different events and services but again, never fully surren-

doing to him. I did not want my husband to turn into the man I was seeing him become. So I said I would change and that we needed to get into church.

We started going to every service, but STILL were not FULLY surrendered. We were still smoking weed but had stopped everything else. Pastor asked if we wanted to go to conference and we agreed. The closer and closer conference came I knew this was going to be a complete life change for us. I was so hopeful that God was going to do something. I needed God to help me with my additions and with smoking weed. I needed him to take the desires away. On my way to conference I felt the resistance. I wanted to go but there was a battle. I stopped on the way and had to

dered.

My husband went to conference in July 2025 but I was still fighting and resisting. When he came back, he was on fire for God and ready to make decisions for our family but I pulled him back. I was resisting. So then my husband stopped going to church with me. We got back on drugs and it got so bad that my husband was hearing voices. The voices were telling him to hurt me. I did not like seeing what the drugs were

buy some weed. We went by the river and smoked it. When I walked away from the river, I KNEW that was the last time. It was a resolve in my heart that I would never do that again.

The minute I got to the church for conference I felt fear and anxiety. I immediately went to my pastor for prayer and God completely touched me. That whole week was a time of surrender for me. I felt God moving in my life during worship, during altar calls. Everything

I feared that I would have to do to get clean he took from me. I was worried about the deep sweats and the withdrawals but I didn't go through anything.

The preaching helped me so much to realize I just have to trust and obey God. It was five days of ALL God. Me and my husband grew closer and we came back fully changed. I still had to come home to the same environment but the smell didn't attract me like it used to. My desires were different.

I have been choosing to live for God. I am more involved with church, doing all I can to help, reading my Bible, listening to Pastor Mitchell and sermons, praying and getting hold of God every day. I just want to thank God for meeting me at conference and dealing with me there.

I want to thank the Prescott church for sponsoring us to conference. I want to thank my Pastor and Shelly for presenting it to us, praying for us and not giving up on us. I want to give a special thanks to Pastor Ron and Patty because without them we would never have been in church to begin with. Thank you Jesus, my Lord and Savior!

At the end of February 2026, we had a massive prayer answered for our church. We were able to rent a new building that meets the current needs of our church.

We had been searching and praying for a building, when a gentleman in our church recommended I call his realtor

friend in town to ask about possible buildings to rent. So I met with him, and came to find out he got saved in the late 70s during a Foursquare-sponsored concert in Bullhead, AZ. I explained I was looking for a building that would hold about 100 people. He immediately walked me to the other side of his building to see a 6,200 sq. ft. space. After the walkthrough, he called the owner of the building to see if he would rent it to a church. On the phone he spoke highly of our Fellowship and of our church, and without hesitation the owner said yes. We signed a very favorable three-year lease on the last day of February, and started working on the build on the first of March.

During construction, we continued pushing for revival in our original building. I was able to host my first wedding with a new convert couple that wanted to make things right, and we had 87 in service!

A lot of local coworkers came and heard the Gospel, and seeds were planted. In anticipation of setting up our new building, I challenged the church that we needed to raise \$20,000 US dollars; within three weeks \$17,500 was brought into the church. One dynamic testimony is a lady in the church felt God was dealing with her about giving all of her vacation money that she had saved up. She told her husband what God was telling her and he said, "We need to obey God." So she gave, and in three weeks she received two checks in the mail worth three times the amount she had given! This was only one of several giving testimonies that developed during this season. God is so good!

Also in March, while working on the building, we were able to send eight people to the Children's Workers Conference in Prescott. Now we are having Children's Church each week in our new building. The entire month of March we prepared the building. We had men rise up and help us work, enabling us to do almost all the work on our own.

I would like to take a moment to thank Pastor Jonathen Lobato and the Bullhead church for coming and helping us set the church up so we could surprise the folks in the church with the final setup. Also, I would like to thank Pastor Brady from Lake Havasu

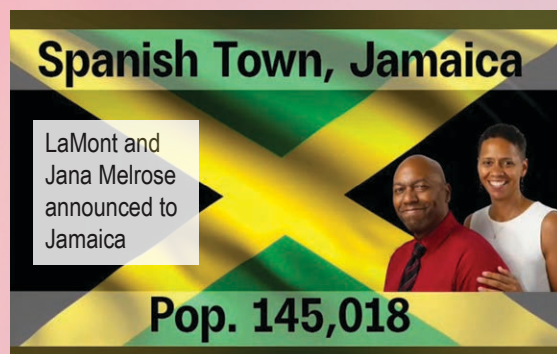

for a new building and how God spoke a simple word to him, “Turnkey.” We had seasons of praying and fasting and we were believing God for this promise. As the months went by and every effort to find a building seemed to be stymied, we continued to invest in souls not only in our own city, but with outreaches to neighboring churches as well as our first mission trip to Guyana, South America, where we saw five folks from our church go and labor for God there.

We began to face constant pressure from our current landlord to sign a new five-year lease, and we held firm to the fact that God said we were to move and that we would get a “turnkey” building. The pressure grew after that because it was the middle of October in 2025 where our landlord called Pastor and said the owner wants us out by the end of 2025 as he rented the building out to someone else (a smoke shop of all places). Now it was getting serious as we had no leads on a building at this time. Again, we fasted and prayed as a church and believed that God would be faithful to His promise as He always is!

The week of Thanksgiving, Pastor Ortiz was getting off work, and these are his words; “The Holy Ghost nudged me and told me to call a man I had called two other times in the past nine months with zero success. I didn’t know what I would be calling him for this time, but I obeyed and made the call. He recognized me from previous calls and asked me a simple question (with a little bit of an annoyed tone), what do you need? I told him we were in a 3,000 sq. ft. building and we wanted at least a 5,000 sq. ft. building. He said he didn’t have anything as previously stated but that he knows someone that might.

“The next week we would see that space, and it was just a shell of a space and would need a lot of work. Besides the work needed, the rent for that area is very high, but as I talked to the man he told me to write down what we were asking for and he would present it to the owner. Now I had the pen and paper in my hand and right away I remembered that phrase ‘turnkey.’ I asked them for a complete build out with an altar/platform and offices included as well as the rent to be lowered by \$1,800 per month of their asking price. Not only did they approve everything we asked for with zero negotiations, they paid for all the work and they also said, “Oh by the way, the rent price is all inclusive, so you don’t need to pay water, electric, landscaping or taxes.”

God gave us exactly what He promised, a turnkey building. We had our first service on April 5th, Resurrection Sunday and I don’t believe the timing could have been better than that!

Our first service we saw five first time visitors with three saved and in our first four weeks of being open, we’ve seen 18 visitors, eight saved and a few notable healings.

As if that wasn’t enough, we stepped out in faith at our Jacksonville, NC conference this past March, and launched our first baby church, David and Hannah Duckett, into Durham, North Carolina.

We are so thankful to God for His faithfulness. What He says He will

do, he does! He gets all the glory, and we are excited to see all God is going to do in the months and years to come as we take Raleigh and Durham NC for Jesus! God Bless this Fellowship!

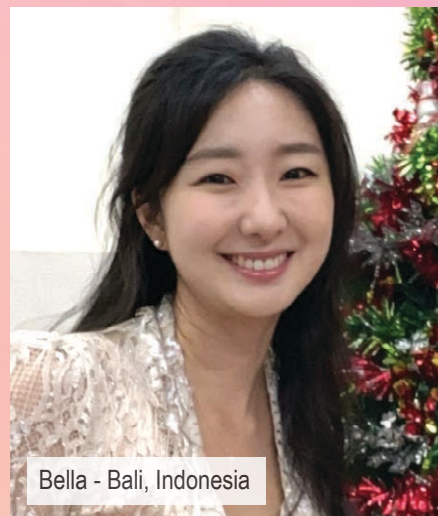
Recently we have seen more people from both Hindu and Muslim backgrounds coming to church and get saved and just yesterday two ex-muslims were baptized.

Hello. My name is Bella. I would like to share a little of my story.

When I was a child, my parents divorced, and I had to live apart from them, moving from one relative's house to another. Growing up in such an unstable environment left a deep wound in my heart. Without realizing it, I began to believe that my life had no value. The wounds from my childhood continued to affect me even after I became an adult. For nearly ten years, I struggled with deep depression.

I tried many different ways to escape from it. I read psychology books, received counselling, and searched through many self-help books. I visited a psychiatrist and took medication. I also explored various spiritual practices such as tarot readings and Reiki healing. At one point, I became deeply interested in Buddhism and meditation.

Among all these things, the only thing that helped even a little was psychiatric medication. After taking it for more than a year, the most severe depression became somewhat manageable, although the medication came with many side effects. Even so,

my basic emotional state remained depressed, and it never became a true solution.

I finally moved from South Korea to Bali, Indonesia for work. In March 2025, I first came to the Potter's House in Bali. At that time, I simply wondered, "If I start going to church and believe in God, maybe my life will become better." But after attending only a few times, I stopped coming. It felt bothersome to go every week, and I even thought it might be a waste of time.

Instead, I tried to find peace through meditation at home. About five months passed like this. Then something very difficult happened at work, and I fell into deep despair again. The pain in my heart was so overwhelming that I could barely eat for three days. During that difficult time, a member of this church contacted me. Normally I would have ignored the message. But at that moment, deep inside my heart, I truly wanted to live. So I decided to come back to church. Desperate to live, I began reading the Bible and praying.

After just a few days, something amazing happened. The heavy feeling that had been crushing my heart began to disappear. The pain that once felt unbearable slowly faded away. As I spent time with the members of the church and shared fellowship with them, church life gradually became joyful to me. I started dedicating more of my time to worship, evangelism, and attending morning prayer.

Through these moments, I came to encounter God more deeply. Little by little, my heart began to heal. Today, I am no longer living in depression. The chronic depression that tormented me for so many years has finally been lifted, and now my heart is filled with joy.

For almost 10 years, I searched everywhere for a way to escape my darkness. I looked for answers in many different places. But in the end, I found the light that dispelled the darkness! The answer I had been searching for was found in a genuine relationship with Jesus Christ!

In 2010, I broke up with my live-in partner. I took my two kids and brought them to my family relatives in a town province. I went back to the city and took a job. Because of the breakup,

I tasted cigarettes, liquors, bars, prostitutes, even gays. Then a year later, I met a woman and got married by 2014. We were living together with my first two kids and another two kids with my wife.

One day, I went to the market and heard the Victory Chapel preaching. I was touched by their testimonies and preaching. I visited and felt God's love and forgiveness on me. I brought my whole family with me to attend services. My wife and I were water baptized on January 1, 2026. Now, we commit to morning prayer and church activities. I am also a Bible study leader and is involved in evangelisms.
